

4 (Operations (Inter-Island))

(a) Ships and craft: One (1) LCM and two (2) LCVP's in operating condition. LCM has been under repairs 50% of the time. LCVP's used for inter-island field officers and medical officers trips. Received one (1) lead of gasoline and general supplies and one (1) load of kerosene and quonset materials from LCT from Peleliu. Received five (5) tons of food and one hundred drums of fog oil from LSM from Guam. USCC operated one (1) buoy boat to handle their supplies from Peleliu. Native Chiefs request worn out Japanese diesel engines of the native cooperative managed intra-island service boat be replaced with American Gray Marine engine.

(b) (1) Native are being trained in the operation of these craft both as engineers and coxwains.

(2) LCVP's are used for field trips, scheduled once monthly.

(3) Two (2) native operated power boats are in operation between villages in ferry and freight service. It has been necessary at times to requisition the services of these craft for Military Government, purposes due to the undependability of the LCM and LCVP's.

(a) One (1) LCM and two (2) LCVPs in operating condition. LCM still under repairs 50% of the time. One thirty-five foot motor boat was put into operation during December.

(B) (1) Natives are being trained in the operation of these craft as coxwains and engineers.

(2) LCVPs are used for field trips to the villages on Babelthuap. Larger craft are necessary for trips to other islands.

(3) Two (2) native operated boats are in service between all villages of the group.

(a) Two (2) LCVP's have been in operating condition. One (1) thirty-five (35) ft. motor boat has been operating out of Angaur. LSM 466 reported as station ship 8 January 1947.

(b) (1) Natives are employed on a training basis on all small boats.

(2) One (1) Military Government field trip was made to Kayangel for purposes of medical and sanitation inspection. Native transportation was used. Copy of instruction are appended as enclosure (E).

1. On or about 18 Jan 1947, you will take charge of Bismark, Native Hospital Corpsman, for the purpose of conducting a field trip to Kayangel, Palau Islands, by way of native boat transportation.
2. You will proceed to Kayangel, Palau Islands and return in approximately three days to Koror, Palau Islands.
3. The purpose of subject field trip will be to conduct sick call, make sanitary inspections and to administer medical treatment as necessary.
4. Upon completion of subject field trip, you will return to USN Military Government Unit, Koror and report to the Commanding Officer.

(a) One (1) LCM was put back into operation this month, two (2) LCV's and one (1) thirty-five foot (35') motor boat has been operating. The LSM 466 was released for return to Guam 16 February.

(b) (1) Nineteen (19) natives with their goods were repatriated to Sonsorol, Tobi and Pulo Anna via LDM 466.

(2) LSM 466 was engaged in USNMG field trip to Peleliu, Angaur, Sonsorol, Tobi and Pulo Anna, departing Koror 10 February and returning to Peleliu 16 February where the LSM 466 was released for return to Guam. Party was returned to Koror via 35 foot motor boat. Copy of instructions to field party are appended as enclosure (G), and report of field trip to the Commanding Officer is appended as enclosure (H).

An LSM or LST while necessary in this area for making extended field trips and to transport supplies from Guam cannot be used regularly for transport of supplies between Peleliu and Koror because of the difficulty of loading off Peleliu where the ship must lie at an exposed anchorage and load supplies from smaller craft. These smaller craft have been only intermittantly available for this purpose.

(c) One (1) field trip was made to the South Palaus. See enclosure (H).

(a) One (1) LCM, one (1) LCVP, and one (1) thirty-five (35) foot motor boat have been operating this month. The LCI 977 has been making regular trips bringing needed supplies from Peleliu. The LSM 438 reported for duty as our station ship and is at present in Angaur loading material for native building projects.

(b)

(1) About twenty (20) measurement tons of building material were transported from Angaur to Koror. This material had been collected in November of 1946 by the natives and has been awaiting transportation since that time.

(2) One field trip to Northern Babelthaup and Kayangel was made during the month. The USCC buoy boat was utilized for this purpose as it is the only boat in operation that is suitable for the trip to Kayangel. Copy of instructions and report of trip are submitted as enclosure (F).

Subject: Kayangel, Field Trip to.

Reference: (a) Commanding Officer's Orders of 21 March 1947.

1. Pursuant to above orders this Officer left Koror for Kayangel on 22 March 1947. Brief stops were made at Ngerard and Ngiremanglui. It is to be noted that no more than one or two of the many bouys, that were placed in Konsul Passage during the war, are in position.

2. Kayangel was reached by 1600, 22 March. Immediately upon landing the presence of a considerable number of flies was noted. The Kayangel people said these flies were present only during the months of January, February, March and part of April when the breadfruit tree was blossoming. At night there were a few mosquitoes, but not sufficient to be disturbing as yet. It was observed that no screens or covers were placed over the water supply which was mostly rain water in large G. I. cans or drums. Furthermore mosquito larva was seen in these water storages. The danger of this was pointed out to the Rubaks and they promised to do what they could, but did not have too much to work with. It was also noted that mosquito larva were present in a marsh on the island.

3. Most of the benjoes (heads) needed repairs in screening and canvas materials, The Rubaks were instructed to patch them up and to keep the benjo doors closed. Again the question of material was raised.

4. As the island is very flat no point being over ten (10) feet high, the question of hurricanes, 30 years ago, swept water over the entire island and the people were forced to climb trees to save themselves. The need for timely warning and possible evacuation to Babelthaupt or other areas are recommended.

5. The people appear to be well fed but need clothes. Fish abound in neighboring waters as the writer can testify. Taro, sweet potatoes, tapioca, and tobacco are some of the agricultural products. Papaya, bananas, coconuts and limes grow wild in abundance as does a fruit which resembles pineapple, but which the native do not eat. However, they say it is eaten by the Truk natives.

6. Native handicraft in pocketbags, handbags and other items made of pandanus is very good and if a market could be assured them the Kayangel people could make quite a few of these articles.

7. The writer met with the Chief and rubaks in council on 23 March. They stated that they could export:

- (a) Copra about 5-7 tons a month if a market was assured them.
- (b) Limes about 400 - 500 pounds a month.
- (c) Some bananas.
- (d) Possibly some dried fish.
- (e) Possibly some taro.

8. The needs are:

- (a) That the village boat, a bouy boat, be put into service as soon as possible. This is believed to be the highest priority item.

- (b) Chicken wire to protect the young chickens and eggs from the large lizard like reptile present on the island. This lizard was introduced by the Japs to kill off the rats and they are rather efficient at that job.
- (c) Sugar and salt.
- (e) Rice for pregnant women and the sick.
- (f) Coloring for pandanus handicraft.
- (g) A better water supply system next most important necessity after their boat. A concrete tank to catch water from the school house is suggested.
- (h) DDT and/or a visit from the spray plane.
- (i) A Palau policeman be assigned to Kayangel. Kayangel wanted to supply the man to be sent to Koror for training. He would be village policeman, sanitary inspector, census taker and helper to the chief.
- (j) Gasoline for their generator. They have a lighting system but no gasoline. It was pointed out that gasoline was difficult to obtain even on Koror and that it is not to expect to be available to Kayangel in the near future.
- (k) Cloth and clothes.
- (l) A more frequent visit by the Doctor.
- (m) Two (2) quonsetts. One (1) for a men's house, the present men's house appears to be satisfactory and another one for distinguished visitors. Incidentally the school is a quonset hut it is small and in not too good condition.

9. The journey back to Koror was started at 0730, 24 March. Ngerbelong was reached at about 1300 and stops were made at Ngerard and Ngermanglui. Party arrived at Koror 1820.

(a) This unit has in commission as of this date one (1) forty-five (45) foot picket boat, radio equipped, one (1) thirty five (35) foot motor boat, two (2) LCVPs and one (1) forty (40) foot motor launch. One (1) LCM was surveyed after repeated dutile attempts to repair hull leaks. The engines and all equipment were salvaged and the hull towed out to sea and sunk.

The LSM 438 is attached to this command for duty.

(b) The LCI 977 has made frequent trips between Koror and Peleliu with supplies for Koror and the LSM 438 made a trip to Ulithi to tow back an LCT to Peleliu, carried building materials from Anguar to Koror for native rehabilitation and has made a field trip to Sonsorol, Tobi and Pul Ana. For field trips to nearby districts in Babeldaop and LCVP has been used. The Picket Boat was used for the Kayangel Field trip and is expected to be of great value in trips outside the shelter of the reef.
