

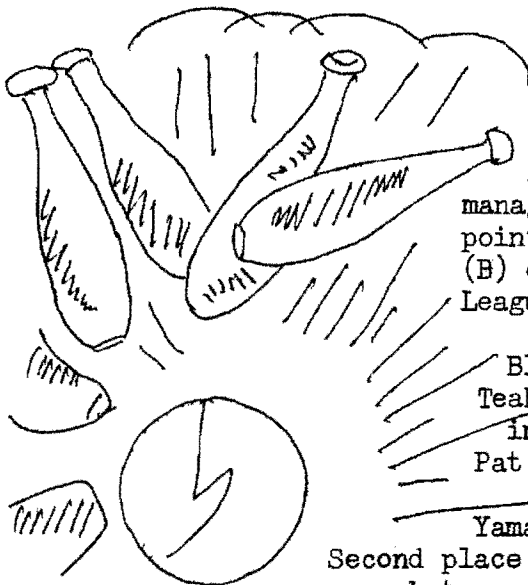
### BOWLING RESULTS



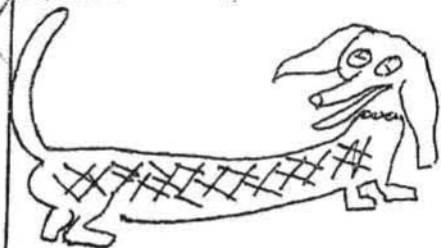

## DOG CHAPTER NEWS

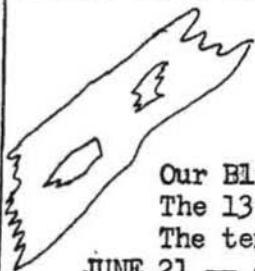

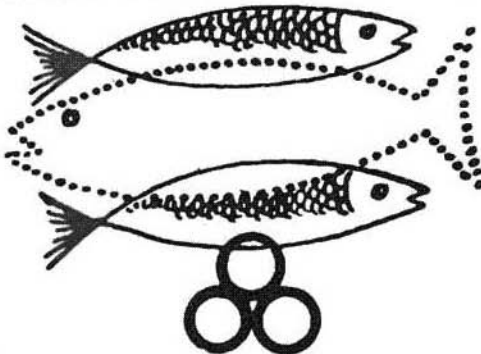

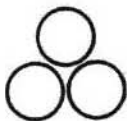
