It is reported in the newspapers of the colonies that the Hawaiian ship sent by that government to procure laborers from the New Hebrides failed in its mission and is reported as an abandoned wreck on one of the Gilbert Islands. They say the natives were growing embittered toward all foreigners because of the outrages and false pretenses used to lure these recruits away from their homes.

May, 1884

The Morning Star has not yet returned as planned from Micronesia. Due back middle of April. She left Ponape Jan. 10 for Truk, but it was learned she was taking Mrs. Rand to Kusaie for medical treatment and back again to Ponape, which will delay the Morning Star two weeks, and make time very short for preparing that ship for her return voyage to Micronesia on the regular sailing date of June 17th.

Sept. 1884

Voyage & Shipwreck of the Morning Star.

Missionary Packet Morning Star left here June 22, 1883 arrived Tajiutea July 10th. Thence to Butaritari for meeting, 12 days. On the way they stopped at Apemama, July 14th, discharging the 5 Gilbertese picked up by Slocum in his Northern Light.

Butaritari to Kusaie in 20 days, stayed a week returned on Aug 20 to Butaritari. Touched at Jaluit on the way, landing 40 mili people who had drifted down to Kusaie in their canoe and had waited an entire year there. Stopped also at Apaiou.

On Oct. 12, left Gilberts for the Marshalls, picked up 60 people for training school of D. (continues)

Pease's Marshall Islands training school located on Kusaie and arrived there Nov. 13 & returned again to Masshall's with 50 proteges of Dr. Pease, also as passengers the Capt. second mate & a passenger from the American schooner Staghound wrecked on Kusaie on August 22, 1883. Visited all the Marshall except Arno and Majero. U.S. Consul at Jaluit. Arrived back at Kusaie Dec. 4, 1883. Went to Ponape on Jan 8, staying till 19th, landing supplies to depleted stocks of American missionaries. Then sailed for Saub arriving Feb. 2, stayed 5 days, back to Ponape on Feb. 13, then sailed for Kusaie Feb. 15 (continued)

to consult Dr. Pease.

On Feb. 22, the vessel was wrecked on the reef at harbor entrance to Kusaie at flood tide. Everyone was saved. It was Capt Garland's first voyage on the Morning Star, and he finally sailed to Japan, thence to San Francisco, back to Honolulu with his account, and the Jennie Walker had been chartered to carry out her restocking work in Micronesia.
