Under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act entitled "An Act to Regulate the Carrying of Passengers and Freight, and the Letting to Hire of Carriages, Wagons, Carts, Drays and other Vehicles in the District of Honolulu," amended and approved on the 23d day of August, A.
