A TRAGMENT OF HISTORY.

The Compliments of the Pot to the Kettle.

Below is given the full text of an article in the China Mail of Wednesday, September 29, 1882. It has peculiar historical interest from the fact that the note following is in the handwriting of C. C. Moreno and signed by him on the margin of the paper containing the article:

By way of San Francisco we have news of a serious crisis in Hawaiian political life, threatening revolution and endangering for a time the throne of the king. The cause of all this turbulence is a gentleman, well known in China, Mr. C. C. Moreno, and the affair therefore carries with it peculiar interest to us. Briefly told the Hawaiian Legislature was prorogued on the 14th of August, and immediately thereafter the king dissolved his cabinet and named a new one in which Mr. Moreno held the portfolio of minister of foreign relations. Mr. John M. Kapeua. As soon as this nomination was known much indignation was expressed by the citizens, and an indignation meeting was held, which was largely attended, at which a resolution was passed, characterizing the action of the king in dissolving the cabinet as arbitrary and without cause, remarking that they had the confidence of the legislative council and the country at large, referring to Mr. Moreno as a stranger and foreign adventurer, who had identified himself with interests hostile to the prosperity of the Hawaiian Kingdom, and who had neither the confidence or respect of the community nor of the representatives of foreign powers as minister of foreign affairs, and affirming that "his majesty has thereby acted inconsistently with the principles of the Hawaiian Government as a constitutional monarchy, as established and handed down by the Kamehamehas and their successor Lunalilo, and that his action therein is hostile to the permanence of Hawaiian independence, the perpetuity of the Hawaiian race and the security of life, liberty and property in the Hawaiian Islands." At this meeting some 1,500 persons were in attendance, of whom fully two-thirds were foreigners.
