REPORTS FOR PLANTERS. FAPERS PRESENTED ON VARIOUS IMPORTANT MATTERS. Dr. Maxwell's report to the Planters' Labor & Supply Company

AS TO THE PARDONS. MATTER TAKEN UP BY THE COUNCIL OF STATE. FORTINER AND LITTLE—Wards of John Walker and Others.

The Council of State met at 10 o'clock this afternoon. President Ide in the chair. Those present were Messrs. King, Damon and Cooper, and Messrs. Mayor Seward, John C. King, Kennedy, Bette, Binkley, Murray and W. Smith.

The President announced that the business of the meeting was in relation to the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association. A number of petitions had come in from friends and members of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association.

MEMBERS OF THE ASSOCIATION. The annual dues for each sugar plantation or mill company shall be \$25.00 for individual members, \$5.00 for corporate members.

ARTICLE 2. There shall be an annual meeting of the members of this Association on the 15th day of October in each year, on Honolulu, at such place as the Board of Trustees may determine.

ARTICLE 3. There shall be an annual meeting of the members of this Association on the 15th day of October in each year, on Honolulu, at such place as the Board of Trustees may determine.

ARTICLE 4. At a meeting of the members of this Association, half the number of the members shall be elected to a quorum for the transaction of business. Voting may be done by proxy.

ARTICLE 5. Trustees for the transaction of the business of the Association shall be elected by the members at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE 6. The business of the Association shall be conducted by the Board of Trustees, nine in number, who shall be interested in the sugar industry and who shall be elected by a majority of all the votes cast at the annual meeting of the members, as set forth in Article 5.

ARTICLE 7. The Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and a majority of the Board shall be necessary to carry out the business of the Association.

ARTICLE 8. Officers, President, it shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings of the members of the Board of Trustees, to sign all contracts and other instruments binding the Association, and to generally superintend the business of the Association.

ARTICLE 9. The Auditor shall examine the books and accounts of the Treasurer annually, and if he shall find the same correct, being properly vouched and balanced, he shall sign a certificate of satisfaction which shall be entered on the Secretary's books.

ARTICLE 10. The Secretary shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Trustees, to call the meetings of the members and enter the names of those present, to give notice of the annual meeting and all other meetings of the members and Board of Trustees, and to sign all instruments required by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE 11. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any meeting of the members, as hereinafter provided for, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all the members voting at such meeting, provided that notice in writing of such amendments or alterations shall have been given to the Secretary at least one month before the date of such meeting.
