Thank you for your letter of June 11 and the information reference the Japanese. I already was aware of the transfer of these men back to their unit, however, your information about the specific individual will be useful.

I believe your own case is progressing, although somewhat slowly, towards a solution. At my request Colonel Speece sent to me a copy of his report and also Mr. McCloy has been going into the matter. By the time this reaches you, you should be re-established in some other unit than the 1497th S.C.S.U., where I am sure existence was not too pleasant.
