HAD A SHOT ACROSS BOWS

American Vessel Under British Colors Overhauled by Spaniards.
Captain Lowry of Bark Nellie Brett Has Uneasy Half Hour—The Spanish Vessel Sunk Later by Americans.

The bark *Nellie Brett*, from New York, fears for the safety of which vessel have been lately expressed in local shipping circles, owing to her lengthy voyage, arrived in port on Tuesday, Oct. 18, says the *Auckland Herald*. The voyage of the vessel has been somewhat out of the ordinary run, as besides having to encounter extremely bad weather, the prevalence of war between the United States and Spain had to be taken into consideration, owing to the fact that the *Nellie Brett* was an American-built vessel, and shows her nationality in every line. Before leaving New York for Auckland, the bark was placed under the British flag, and her crew were shipped under British articles. Captain F. B. Lowry was the only American on board, and, as when he left New York, the war between the two nations was in full swing, he was naturally somewhat anxious as to how matters would eventuate, should he be overhauled by a Spanish cruiser.

All went well until June 15, the vessel being then 25 days out, and in latitude 27 55, N., longitude 41 41 W. The vessel was lying becalmed, when the smoke of a steamer was discerned in distance. There were two large English and one French vessel in view, all with their ensigns flying, which was a matter that Captain Lowry did not understand at the time.

The steamer which was bound away to the eastward, suddenly altered her course, and made in the direction of the *Nellie Brett*, and coming up in close proximity, hoisted a signal which Captain Lowry could not make out, although he was watching very closely. No notice being taken of the signal from the steamer by those on board of the *barque*, the former sheered closer, and fired a gun across the *barque's* bow, at the same time running up the Spanish flag. "That," said Captain Lowry, "decided me as to the course I had to pursue, and I at once ordered the ensign to be hoisted. I afterward found out that the signal was, 'show your ensign.'"

A boat was then lowered from the steamer, and went alongside

We await with interest the route by which the Star will crawl out of the confederate cruiser Alabama.

A special feature of the theatrical season will be new song "The Alabama Coons" sung by two of our esteemed contemporaries.

Some of Bankrupt Hooley's friends are beginning to wish they had not allowed him to fail. His disclosures are more interesting than pleasant.

Occupation of Cuba by the American troops now begins in earnest. With the approach of the winter months the positiveness of American action becomes more apparent to the Spanish.

American Military Governor Wood seems to be able to make the Cubans do most anything but work. Yet the Cuban will be loud in his condemnation of the United States if he is crowded to the wall on account of his inactivity.

Secretary Day in a diplomatic reply to France says the Oregon and Iowa are coming to Honolulu. We are sure to get a sight of them anyway, yet no one will believe that the ships will not sooner or later show up in Philippine waters.

We are sorry to say that as an historian Prof. Alexander will have to take a seat in rear of the Advertiser. He was born and brought up in this country and yet didn't see or hear anything of the cruiser Alabama when she was here in 1861. Hurray for the Advertiser.

Now John Wadmaker who is at the head of the opposition to Senator Quay has been arrested for slander. John finds that although Quay may be a bad man two can play at the same political game. An opportunity will now be given to prove some of the wild political assertions.

The Navy Department is said to have abandoned the scheme of raising any more Spanish cruisers. The Merritt Wrecking Company is working on the Colon under a contract that allows them \$829.25 a day. Hobson will have to be satisfied with one big souvenir from the Spanish navy. They are too expensive for Uncle Sam.

AN ADVERTISER SPOOK.

That monument of moral rectitude and historical accuracy, the Advertiser, boldly announces that the Confederate warship Alabama visited Honolulu in 1861. Now this is news. It is wonderful, marvelous. We are really surprised that the Advertiser did not discover this incident before, so that it might have strengthened its argument in favor of Hawaii declaring neutrality when the United States declared war with Spain.

Doubtless when officials at Washington begin to ask questions about the inside history of the neutrality discussion, the Advertiser will announce that a Spanish cruiser was in Honolulu harbor in 1898; that the people here didn't see it but the Advertiser by its close connection with matters immortal saw the ship and knew what dangers it subjected Hawaii and its citizens to. When some Congressman tells the Advertiser that it is not telling the truth, the Advertiser will rise

to its usual high and mighty heights and say: "You poor insignificant ward politician, you can't see straight. Why the Confederate cruiser Alabama was in Honolulu harbor in 1861 and no one saw it—but the Advertiser did. In fact we have a detailed account of the coal taken and other spooky things that the dangerous Confederate captain did. Since the Alabama did these things, why didn't we have good reason to have trembling knees, loss of American patriotism and general fear that led us to ask that the Bennington be promptly ordered to sea and the Hawaiian-American white flag run up over the Executive building."

We are really inclined to admit that the people of the world do not half appreciate the value of the Advertiser as a halfway house to the realms of warship spooks. No one hitherto known to history ever saw the Alabama in Honolulu or Hilo harbors, but the Advertiser now gets on the inside kahuna track and says it was here. This is a scoop. We acknowledge the corn. It is a dead cold scoop from realms in which the BULLETIN has no representative. We can't explain this short Advertiser route previously unknown history, but are disposed to suggest that one of those "Leonids" supposed to be shooting through space in the heavens last night, made direct tracks for the Advertiser office and delivered a special message marked: "Exclusive to the Advertiser. To be used to help you out of the neutrality hole you got into last spring."

SCHOOLS FOR NEW CITIZENS.

"What Cuba needs" is now receiving attention of correspondents at Havana. Some say annexation to the United States, others independence, still others that the "Cubans need a good licking," but a writer for the Chicago Record cites a necessity of the hour that will appeal to all Americans when he says "schools." Cuba needs schools, the American schools, and the same may be said to hold good in all the Spanish territory which the Americans have fallen into.

The correspondent for the Record says: "We need to engage some experienced educator who will come here not for the salary alone, but with the same spirit that American troops came recently to Santiago, take the raw conditions here and evolve a common school system for the future ages. Leave behind the mistakes. Take the best features of all the state systems of the United States and plant them here. Then, when the common schools are in operation, we want some schools like Hampton and Tuskegee—industrial, scholastic, Christian. We also want such schools as the various religious bodies have in the South. Will the United States help us to have them? Where are the moral forces that sent American ships of war to our coasts?"

Appeals of this character cannot fail to receive recognition from the better American sentiment. Missionary work of a very practical nature is right at their doors. If the United States carries out its humanitarian policy to the fullest extent, the schools in the new possession will not be left in the lurch.

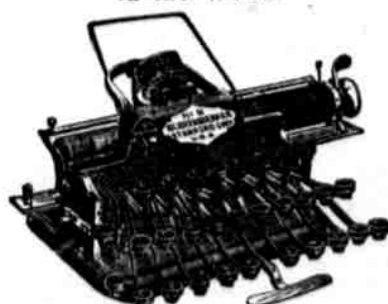

the barque. An officer was in charge of a crew composed of 12 men, and accompanied by an interpreter, one of the engineers, and evidently "a renegade Scotsman," Captain Lowry says, and a sergeant of marines.

On boarding the vessel, the officer in charge, the interpreter, and the sergeant proceeded to the cabin, and demanded the ship's papers, which were handed over at once for inspection. Nothing evidently could be made of the register, or the manifest of the cargo; but when the articles were produced, the interpreter seemed to clearly understand them, and explained to the officer in charge that everything appeared to be satisfactory.

The party from the steamer then proceeded on deck, and the main hatch was taken off to examine the cargo to see that there was no contraband of war on board. The officer finding everything in order, then demanded to see the flag locker, but upon seeing the British Ensign and the "Jack" was quite satisfied that the Nellie Brett was really a "Britisher."

Captain Lowry says that the officer was very gentlemanly in his demeanor, and explained that was only carrying out his duty, which, of course, Captain Lowry fully understood; but at the same time he came to the conclusion that if the sergeant had his way there would have been a very short shrift for the captain of the Nellie Brett.

Before leaving the bark the Spanish officer informed Captain Lowry that he would have to proceed on board of the steamer and report to the commander; and when the boat was hoisted on board he might consider that the vessel would not be further molested.

"It took them a long time to consider, though," said Captain Lowry, "for the boat was along side nearly half-an-hour before she was hoisted up and I was mighty glad to see her screws working, and the steam-r take a course in another direction than the one in which I was going."

The Spanish steamer was the Alphonso XIII., one of the Cuban mailboats, and was the steamer which got safely into one of the Cuban ports during the war, with a quantity of arms, ammunition, and treasure. She was afterward sunk by one of the American warships.
