S. 1624: ~~DISCRIMINATORY IMPOSTS ON WINE~~

REPORTED: April 6, 1976, Committee on Commerce, (Sen. Rept. 94-739)

PURPOSE: The bill prohibits any State from imposing higher taxes, license fees or other obstacles to the sale of wines produced in other States or on materials grown in other States and imported for the production of wine. The Committee report cites over a half-dozen different types of discriminatory practices imposed by various States.

COST: None listed by report.

ADMINISTRATION POSITION: No objection.

AMENDMENT #1594: Griffin. Would amend title to read: "A bill to promote the free flow of commerce in wine among the several States and for other purposes."
