MPLC gives tentative approval for hotel development at Samoan housing area

The Marianas Public Land Corporation did already enter into a "tentative" approval for the establishment of a 450 hotelroom project in the American Samoa Housing site, where the proposed Garapan Park is being asked to be located.

This was learned during a public hearing conducted Wednesday by the house's special committee on the Samoan Housing Public Park Development, chaired by Cong. Stanley Torres.

Present members of the committee include Cong. Jesus Attao, Diego Benavente, Luis Benavente, while the MPLC was represented by its executive director William Concepcion. House Speaker Pedro Guerrero and Floor Leader William Ada were also present.

MPLC Head Bill Concepcion identified the developer as

Nakamoto Enterprises, Ltd. It plans to construct a first class resort hotel worth \$100 million, with the actual operations expected to start in 1994.

According to an outline of the hotel's project, the comprehensive planning will be taken care of by officials of Kagaya Hotel.

It said that Kagaya is one of the "most prestigious" hotels in Japan..."where the Japanese royal family usually stay."

The outline further enumerates the following benefits to the people of the CNMI once the project becomes a reality:

- * The total expected annual revenue such as gross revenue tax, base rental and based on gross receipt will be \$2.5 million.
- * The company will build an elderly center and other park facilities in Garapan at its cost.
- * At least 30 per cent of employees will be locals, who will

be trained to assume various managerial positions.

*The hotel will have Japanese language classes, free of charge to CNMI descents.

*30 percent of the hotel shares of stock will be reserved to be subscribed, for local participa-

* Reduced prices will be extended to local residents of CNMI in the restaurants and other function rooms.

MPLC gave a "tentative ap-

proval to the Company...but Nakamoto Enterprises still has to meet the MPLC Board's conditions, which will be for the benefit of the general public."

CUC refuses to connect cable TV

More than 100 subscribers of Cable T.V. residing in As Perdido, Afetna, As Lito and Lower Navy Hill can now have a sigh of relief as cable services in their areas have now been resumed.

The situation might probably be a temporary one as there still is no definite agreement between the Commonwealth Utilities Corportation and the management of Saipan Cable T.V. with regard to the issue of pole-rental rate.

Although the management of Saipan Cable T.V. headed by its Acting General Manager James Deleon Guerrero met yesterday with CUC officials to settle a long-standing dispute, only a temporary solution to the problem materialized.

The dispute, which resulted in the disruption of cable services in the four areas, left a lot of cable subscribers complaining.

Guerrero said that an amicable settlement has been reached between the two companies. CUC officials headed by the company's Deputy Director Tim Villagomez has given Cable T.V. a one-shot approval deal.

The deal stipulates that the Cable management will be given the authority to hook-up to the new CUC poles. The hook-up will be authorized on a case-to-case basis.

Despite what Guerrero daid as an amicable settlement, CUC officials said in a press release that the Cable T.V. management would still not want to agree to the new rates being required by the CUC.

CUC officials state in the press release that as long as Cable T.V. will continue its stand not to agree with the requirements of the CUC, new cable connections to new power poles will not be authorized and permitted.

At present, Cable T.V. is paying \$3.50 per pole every year. However, about four months ago, CUC Executive Director Ramon Guerrero began forbidding Cable T.V. to transfer cable lines to the new poles unless the Cable management will agree with the \$7.50 per pole per year that the CUC is

Within a span of two years, the once unpopulated Northern sector of the island will be the home of several hotels, condominiums, shopping malls and villas.


In a years time, if we, as citizens do not voice our concern on development, we might see that the Garapan coastline

am grateful that our Marianas/Washington Representative John N. Babauta highlighted a number of substantive concerns pertaining to our relationship with the U.S. Government, including the role of our Office at the nation's capital. He also sought from our leaders for a clear cut definition of our concept of "self-govern-

Babauta was candid in saying that the current 902 Talks simply boils down to one of "consultation" rather than "negotiations." If such is the true nature of the 902 Talks, then it goes without saying that there's a need to lobby long and hard for the establishment of an office on Capitol Hill strictly mandated to handle all insular affairs. No wonder that for almost ten years now, very little progress has been achieved in settling issues with the U.S. that will lead the NMI to attaining greater self-government. Thus the confirmation that the current exercise is really one of consultation rather than

I sensed Babauta's frustrations and I share and appreciate the difficulty of trying to run an office where the root of frustrations reverts to square one-OUR-SELVES! In other words, we have yet to define and agree on what we mean by self-government. Are we addressing this concept within the purview of the Covenant Agreement? Or are we talking more along the internationally accepted definition of this concept? Would the U.S. agree to accepting our definition of self-government other than what's outlined in the agreement?

I am as frustrated and confused as anybody else. In the first instance, an overwhelming majority wanted the deal constituted in the Covenant Agreement. In subsequent years, we have learned that the deal isn't as good as we thought it to be then. We wanted to refine this relationship only to find out quite quickly that there's nothing up that alley except U.S. intransigence. Where do we go from here? Do we want to be an integral part of the U.S. Government where we partake in presidential elections and are given full representation in the U.S. Congress? Is this a realistic goal for us? Or have we been addressing these concerns just for purposes of glory grabbing

and publicity? If we choose otherwise, what will it be my friends? And are you willing to make a commitment to a political agenda that will require a lot of sacrifices?

my personal view that the Covenant Agreement is designed to perpetuate neo-colonialism out here. It is a very poorly thought out agreement as evidenced by our frustrations and dissatisfaction. And for as long our relationship with the U.S. is premised upon a document that relegates our dignity as a people or as U.S. Citizens, life in these pearly islands can become quite ugly at some point in the future. It need not be allowed to turn out this way. Well, either we become full partners with Uncle Sam or continue to absorb the shocks of second class U.S. Citizens. I am still convinced that we can refine our relationship with the U.S. if for no other reason than to enjoy, on equal footing, all that democracy offers and stands for "...from sea to shining sea."

Whatever the case may be, it is

It is gratifying to know that Father Isaac Ayuyu's case has been disposed of by the courts. Let us pray for him so that through his services and the work of the clergy in the Diocese, we can all strengthen ourselves and the work of this community in the days ahead. Let this matter be a closed chapter in our books and forge ahead with positive outlook for what the future holds in store for us.

Bill calls for no more garment factories on Saipan

Members of the Saipan Legislative Delegation deferred action on a local bill that would prohibit the construction, licensing, or operation of any new garment factories within Saipan, during its session Tuesday.

Senate Local Bill 7-1, was transmitted on February 27 to the delegation for action by Sen. Paul Manglona, chairman on committee rules and procedures, since it has met the required provision of the Commonwealth Constitution.

According to the measure, the delegation finds that abundance of garment factories on Saipan is

"severely and adversely" affecting the public's interest and wel-

"Imposition of government controls is essential to offset the effect of world economic and political conditions which make the Commonwealth in general and Saipan in particular uniquely attractive as a location for textile firms wishing to tap the massive US market."

"Failure to institute such control will result in Saipan being overwhelmed by an industry whose potential for growth far outstrips the islands capacity to support it," according to the resolution.

It further said that it is then

necessary to come out with a local law, since CNMI-wide laws promoting manufacturing and exports "contribute to the mag-

nitude of the problem." It cited that the industry recruits many individual from various countries that contribute to "exclusive population growth" that only results in traffic congestion, development of large quantities of substandard hous and seedy commercial districts, burdened infrastructure and health services, and strained law enforcements and many more.

The deferred resolution

pointed out that factories further place "enormous demands on water, waste disposal, and electrical power services...lanscapes are being despoiled by these ugly factories...etc."

It stressed that the main purpose of the measure is to "prevent a complete breakdown in the quality of life on Saipan while preserving the economic benefits of the existing garment industry, by halting the growth of the industry on Saipan.'

According to the proposed Saipan bill, the Director of Commerce and Labor will no longer be issuing factory business licenses, once this measure is passed into law..."except the business license of a garment factory issued prior to the effectivity of this Act may be renewed in accordance with the

It also requires that the Coastal Resources Management will not anymore be authorized to issue siting, construction or operation of a garment factory upon effectivity of this measure.

While the Marianas Public Land Corporation should not lease any public land by a garment factory..."unless such lease or use existed prior" to the approval of the measure.

The resolution stressed that any license or permit isssued against the contents of the proposed legislation, once approved, will be considered as null and

King sworn in as CNMI Special Justice

Chief Justice of the Federated States of Micronesia Edward C. King was sworn into office as a Special Commonwealth Judge by Gov. Larry I. Deleon Guerrero in a special ceremony held in the Governor's Office.

King becomes the fourth judge to be named as a special justice to the CNMI. Millionaire-businessman Larry Hillblom, former Attorney General Rexford Kosack and Pedro M. Atalig currently serve as special justices to the CNMI Supreme Court.

King first came to the CNMI in 1972 when he became the Deputy Director of the Micronesian Legal Services Corp., a position which he held until 1976 for four years.

After his stint in the MLSC, King assumed the directorship of the Senior Citizens Law Center in Pohnpei where he was nominated by former President Tosiwo Nakayama and confirmed by the FSM Congress.

In 1981, he was confirmed as the first Chief Justice of the FSM Supreme Court.

King pursued his undergraduate studies at the Indiana University. He also pursued his doctorate studies in jurisprudence in the same insti-

He lives with his wife Joan in the FSM's and they have three grown-up children.

As a special judge, King can hear cases both at the CNMI Supreme Court and Superior

U.S. Navy cancels plans to build radar **station on Tinian**

The United States Navy announced last week that it "has decided not to build" the proposed Relocatable Over-the-Horizon Radar (ROTHR) system on Tinian.

In a communication sent from the Public affairs Office of the US Naval Forces Marianas, the reason for "dropping" the proposed project at this time "was made because of high costs of the system, and the diminished threat in the Western Pacific."

"The ROTHR project was designed to detect surface ships and low-flying aircraft up to 1,800 miles from Guam...transmitters of the system would have been sited on Tinian, and receivers on Guam," it said.

Earlier reports from the Department of Navy provided that the then proposed ROTHR system will occupy at least 12,500 to 18,000 acres of land on Tinian to erect the 34-vertical antenna towers, and to also provide a clear-land area for the signals not to be distorted.

The antenna will then monitor aircraft operations from most of the Southeast Asia, including Vietnam, Cambodia and other communist countries.

The system would contain three components: a transmitter that is located on Tinian; a receiver located on Guam, and an operational control center located near the receiver.

There will be three transmitters that would be located on Tinian, within the lands leased by the US government for defense purposes.

Earlier reports provided that the major need for the project stems from the shortcomings of conventional or line-of-sight land or ship based radar sysceremony were King's wife Joan,

tems, which only have detection capability of about 20-nautical miles for low altitude aircraft and 20-nautical miles for highaltitude aircraft.

Reports said that to survey critical areas in southern countries, the system must be sited in the Mariana Islands, and only Tinian seemed to meet this need.

Moreover, the US Navy, in their previous statements, said that the effects of the radar on the CNMI coastal zone are consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the CNMI Coastal Management Program.

Major concerns were even earlier raised that there might be cases of bird-radar antenna collission, considering that there are endangered bird-species on Tinian.

The US Navy then responded that a monitoring program and other activities will be implemented should the project push through to protect the environ-

NMC offers program for local farmers and agricultural stuents

The Land Grant Program of the Northern Marianas College have several programs which Commonwealth farmers and agriculture students can avail of.

At present, the programs in agriculture at the College focus on teaching local farmers the production and farming of high-quality foods. Farmers are also taught how to manage whatever their resources are and to improve their environment.

On the NMC's Saipan campus, a Plant Test Clinic and a Soil Testing Services is available to local farmers. These services provide technical assistance to the farm community and exemplify the team approach to diagnosing crop diseases and soil problems.

Plant Pathologist Victoria Matalgo and an assigned agricultural extension agent takes care of problems dealing with plant diseases while entomologist Dr. Chao Hon Chiu lends his expertise in insects attacks. Dr. Lolita Ragus is available to help best aspect of plant farming along with low-input practices like hand weeding, minimal chemical spraying and minimal use of fertilizers.

Another experimental project being done on Saipan is the development of varieties of tomatoes that are well suited to growth in the Commonwealth. The project scientist aims that by next year, one promising vaniety will be available for farmers for their use.

A transportation case study and a marketing education program is also being conducted by agriculture extension agent Roger Ragus in colloboration with the University of Hawaii, University of Guam, the College of Micronesia and American Samoa Community College.

Local young people are also encouraged to become involved in agriculture in the CNMI. Besides being given the opportunity to take part in a Research Apprenticeship Pro-

in cases pertaining to soil fertility or crop production.

The agricultural extension agents on each island have also established demonstration farm plots where different varieties of crops are grown using various fertilizers and methods of irrigation.

The farm plots, which are readily accessible to the farmers are also used to demonstrate farming technologies appropriate to the soil and other environmental conditions on each island.

A project which is being conducted on Rota is the research project on taro farming. The project is designed to demonstrate "low input sustainable agriculture (LISA) that enables the production of food crops in ways that are at once environmentally safe, socially acceptable and economically

sound.

The project also utilizes plant technology that integrates the

gram, the youth can avail of twoyear Associate of Science degree in Agriculture and a Associate of Applied Science in Agriculture which is being offered at the College.

The degree programs are being developed in cooperation with the University of Hawaii and the University of Guam. This enables the NMC graduate to pursue baccalaureate studies in either of the two universities.

Since April 1987 when the NMC was granted a "land grant status" by the U.S. Congress, many have already been involved with the programs which is funded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

To ensure that the programs are available to all, offices have been opened on Saipan, Tinian and Rota and are staffed by trained, experienced, agricultural extension agents which is backed by a team of research scientists stationed at the As Terlaje campus on Saipan.

Shimizu money requested for homestead projects

The \$5 million infrastructure development contribution handed over by the Shimizu Corp. to the Governor as early as October last year, is being requested by members of the Saipan Legislative Delegation to be used for providing the needed infrastructures for Kagman Homesteaders.

Cong. Gabriel Babauta, introduced Saipan local delegation resolution 7-4, which is requesting the MPLC to use the \$5 million contribution, together with the interest, for the construction of the Kagman Homestead road, extension of power and water distribution systems in the area.

SLD resolution 7-4 received a unanimous vote of yes from the members of the third Senatorial district during its session Tuesday.

According to the resolution, Kagman residents have been suffering for several years now from bad roads, lack of power and water services.

It said that there is a need to

"expedite" the construction of the needed facilities as more and more people are putting up their homes in the area.

"On August 31, 1990, in a joint session, the Legislature passed HJR 7-5 which among other measures, approved a \$5 million up-front money contribution offered by SC for the contruction of Kagman roads, power, water, and sewer distribution."

According to the approved resolution, the MPLC and the CNMI government received the money on October 11, 1990.

It further urges that the MPLC should enter into a contract with adeveloper, which will construct the needed facilities on Kagman.

Babauta expressed that there is no need to hinder development in areas where it is urgently needed.

Earlier reports showed that aside from the \$5 million contribution, SC also included another \$500,000, for various infrastructure cost around the island, as the third shimizu lease amendment was signed by various government officials.

Two days "Know Your Government" meet held

Close to 100 students from Saipan, Tinian and Rota will have the opportunity to meet several of the CNMI's top officials and get a first-hand look on how the local government is run.

With the theme "Know Your Government," the two-day affair kicked-off yesterday at the Hyatt Regency's Gilligan's. Among those who were in attendance were Gov. Larry I. Deleon Guerrero, Lt. Gov. Benjamin Manglona, Commissioner on Education Elizabeth Diaz Rechebei and Department of Interior's George Bentnar who is also in-charge of the Close-Up Foundation in Washington, D.C.

On Thursday, discussions were held between the youth and several officials who represented the three branches of the government.

Washington Representative Juan N. Babauta also briefed the students on the function and organization of his office.

Today, the students are set to Washington, D.C.

tour several government agencies in Capitol Hill and sit through a trial proceeding presided by Judge Alexandro Castro in the Superior Court.

Rechebei said that although the Public School System has been involved with the national foundation since 1985, this is the first time a local program has been fully established.

The program is funded in part by the Close-Up Foundation in Washington D.C. while financial support is extended by the Governor's Office.

The Close-Up Foundation is a non-profit, non-partisan organization. Itorganizes programs that encourages responsible participation among the youth in the democratic process through civic-oriented programs.

PSS Social Studies Coordinator Joe Mafnas said that from among the delegation, 20 students will be chosen to represent the CNMI to the national event which will be held on May in Washington, D.C.





Salary raises extend to police, fire officers

Sixty-one police officers, Fire and Corrections personnel received their promotion and pay increases from Gov. Larry I. Deleon Guerrero in ceremonies held Tuesday at the Fire Department in Susupe.

Acting Chief of Police Tony Reyes said that the promotions have been made possible by a \$420,000 appropriation from the Legislature. The appropriation is part of the 1991 fiscal budget which the governor signed into law in February.

He said that the promoted officers were given a 30% salary increase which is a "fare and reasonable one."

The promotion includes 4 to the rank of Assistant Chief, 1 for Chief of Police and 6 to the rank of Captains. 7 were named as Lieutenants, 12 became Sergeants, 11 to Police Officer III and 20 to Police Officer II.

Reyes said the Department is also working double time to process the papers of police officers whose promotions are still pending.

Also in attendance were other CNMI officials including Personnel Officer Jesus Mafnas, DPS Director Greg Camacho and the families and friends of the officers.

A reception was held following the presentation of promotion papers to the officers.







GTC school opens computer classes

The Gregorio T. Camacho Elementary School in San Roque was recently added to the list of schools providing computer-aided instruction to its students.

Tricia Santos, a Computer Laboratory teacher at the GTC said that the computers will be available for the students in all the grade levels.

Santos said that Kindergarten to sixth grade students will be given at least 3,000 hours of computer instructions. Classes will be held thrice a week and Santos said she plans to begin teaching by the end of the month.

Commissioner on Education Elizabeth Diaz Rechebei said that the money used to purchase the computers which cost the PSS \$696,000 came from the agency's \$700,000 lapsed funds.

Besides the GTC, four elementary schools on the island are providing computer-aided instruction. Rota and Tinian Elementary Schools also have such programs implemented.

Rechebei said that there are plans to expand the program as it has boosted the children's interest for learning. She said that as soon as the funds are available, more computers will be purchased for use in the other schools.

Two Samoan brothers shot

Compton, Calif. (AP) - Autopsies on two brothers shot to death by a city police officer show they were hit 20 times with many of the shots fired from behind, Coroner's report said.

The Feb. 12 shooting of Pouvi Taulaulelei, 31, and his brother Italia, 22, are being investigated by the city Attorney's Office, police Chief Terry Ebert said Sunday.

The country Coroner's findings were reported Sunday by the Long Beach Press Telegram.

The shootings occurred when Officer Al Skiles, a 12-year department veteran, responded to a report of a domestic dispute at the Taulaulelei home.

All of the shots were fired from the officer's gun a Coroner's spokesman said today

Pouvi was shot 12 times. Eight of the shots hit him from behind, the Coroner's report said. Three shots entered his right side and one penetrated his left palm, an autopsy determined.

Italia was shot eight times.

Vicki & the Kids

Five shots came from behind, one hit his left side, and two hit his right side, the report said.

Police have reported the shooting occurred during a struggle between the officer and the two brothers.

A toxicology report showed Pouvi had traces of cocaine and a cocaine byproduct in his blood at the time of death, said Coroner's spokesman Bob Dambacher.


"We're not going to interpret what these (autopsy) reports mean unless happened with the latest thing," Ebert said Saturday.

He was referring to the videotaped beating of a man last week by Los Angeles police officers.

"We know our people are sufficiently trained. We are just reminding them to remember their training,": he said.

Skiles has been assigned to a desk position until the investigations are over, Ebert said. The chief refused further comment.

Skiles also refused to comment.

Tinian school gets 3 years accreditation

According to top Tinian Public School System administrators, Tinian High School has just been awarded a three-year accreditation term from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). WASC, based in California, is the goveming agency for granting accreditation to the CNMI.

Henry Hofschneider, Tinian's PSS liaison, said that the twomember WASC accreditation team of Dr.'s Marilyn George and Betty Pacheco toured the high school on Wednesday, March 6, a press release from the PSS stated.

Tinian High, which only just established an official 12th grade. becomes the third and final CNMI public high school to earn accreditation status. Last July, Marianas High School and Rota High School received three and two year renewed accreditation terms respectively.

Commissioner of Education Elizabeth D. Rechebei, commending the school, said "Accreditation enables Tinian High School to be nationally recognized and to have their credits transferrable to mainland schools. It also fosters excellence in the school and assures they, and the public, have clearly defined and appropriate goals and objectives. And above all, accreditation is not an end in itself but an on-going process towards self-improvement."

However now, students will now be able to complete their high school education on their home island. In the past, students had to endure the hardships of traveling off island to finish

high school. Jack Angello, Tinian High School Principal, said an accreditation team originally came out in 1987. During that trip, they said five area needed to be

addressed before accreditation could be possible. Those areas were adding a 12th grade, getting Science and Physical Education facilities, improve building conditions, and establishing a Vocational Education program, it was noted in the press release.

After becoming principal at the high school this year, Angello and Hofschnieder analyzed the situation at the school. Last school year saw an upgrade in facilities and the hiring of more personnel. That, coupled with meeting the other recommendations by the original WASC visit, made the two administrators confident of moving ahead.

"We thought we were ready at the beginning of the school year," said Angello. "Even though our new high school campus is not yet completed, a physical structure is not the key

On March 6, Pacheco and George toured the school. They visited the computer, typing, science lab, and physical education facilities. They also sat in on classes and talked with the students. Hofschneider and Angello said that talking with the students was enlightening to the visitors.

"The doctors were impressed with the articulation and maturity of the students," said Hofscheider. Angelloadded that the teachers should be complimented for their students academic and leadership achievements. "The team was also impressed by the condition of the school," said Angello. "They remarked that the grounds and facilities were well taken care of by students and staff."

Hofschneider said that the two member team will meet with the WASC commission in April to give their formal report, but that was only a formality. Based on their talks, the school will be accredited through the 1993-94 school year. He said that they would even be receiving the official diploma stamp, to be used at the end of this year, the release


Twelve grade at Tinian High School was officially dedicated on January 16, 1991. Angello said there are 16 seniors who will represent the first Tinian graduating class. Over the years. Tinian has been upgrading its scholastic levels. Hofschneider said that in 1966, the school had up to ninth grade. 10th grade was added in 1982-83, phased out after the year, and reestablished in 1984-85, he added. Hofschneider said 11th grade was implemented in 1985-86.

A new high school is being planned for completion in about two years. Hofschneider said a campus will be built on 7.5 hectares of land in the San Jose area. and later 14 hectares near Marpo are setaside for future expansion. The new facilities, said Hofschneider, are needed for the anticipated growth in enrollment due to the island's prospective economic future.

Angello said that the school's accreditation status was a result of the support of local leaders as well as the local PTA to the school. He also said that the PSS accreditation steering committee should also be commended for their help towards the schools accreditation status.

The committee is composed of PSS staffers Paz Younis, National Diffusion Network Coordinator; Patrick Tellei, Vocational Education Coordinator; Tom Tebuteb, Special Assistant to the Board of Education; Magaret Dela Cruz, Assistant Deputy Commissioner for Administration; Nunu Sanchaz, Family Involvement Coordinator; and Jose Mafnas, Social Studies Coordinator.

Angello said the reason for the success of the accreditation for the school was due to the positive action by school administrators. "The reason for the relatively quick approval was because we were aggressive in our efforts," he said. "Its symbolic of the hard work by the staff and students."

The bill mentioned that the excess sewagw sometimes overflows on the land in residential and elementary school areas as well as in areas frequented by the tourists.

According to the measure, although Sadog Tase Plant has recently being upgraded, it would still be inadequate to process raw sewage once construction begins on those projects that have received CRM permit


It further cited that still, several other proposed physical development on the Southern part of Saipan, the Agingan Sewer Plant needs to be up-

graded. The bill stressed that the US Congress, and the Senate in particular, is reluctant to appropriate funds to upgrade the sewer system on the Saipan.

It then appropriates \$10 million from the interest earned from the Triple A bond for upgrading of the system. The resolution did not give any details regarding the Triple A bond.

The bill pointed out that before funding be spent, the CUC should have a comprehensive plan of the sewer system. Upon approval of the plan by the delegation, the CUC may expend the fund.

It said that funds can not be used other than for the rehabilitation of the sewer systems and that the CDA shall have the responsibility of disbursing the funds.

504th Bombardment Group Memorial Plaque Dedicated

TINIAN - The island of Tinian recently was home to a number of former members of the 504th Bombardment Group who gathered to dedicate a memorial plaque in honor of their comrades who lost their lives on B-29 bombing missions to Japan during World War II. The Group took its place on Tinian as a part of the vast air armada to strike at the heart of Japan.

According to David Q. Maratita, executive assistant to the Tinian Mayor, 26 members of the 504th Bombardment Group Association, led by chairman Art Tomes, officially dedicated the plaque on March 7, 1991, at a site in North Field next to the runways that were formerly used by the B-29s during the war, according to a news release from the Tinian Mayor's Office.

A 4-member color guard from Andersen Air Force Base in

Guam, accompanied by Air Force Chaplain, Lt. Col. Larry Wills, and an 8-member ceremonial U.S. Navy Band in Guam, under the direction of Chief Dupont, were flown in by military helicopter especially for the ceremony.

The release said that, Tinian Mayor James M. Mendiola extended his welcome to the group and said that while the occasion may bring unpleasant memories of the war, he suggested that they return home to the United States with memories of the new Tiniana peaceful island. Far different from the Tinian they remembered 46 years ago.

A dedication address was delivered by Rowe Findley who said: "From here we took off in 1945 to carry aerial combat to a sinister and implacable foe. Many of us set out. Not all of us came back. We are today for those who did not come back, and our

Videotape unveil political corruption

Phoenix (AP)-Police and prosecutors unveiled videotapes showing indicted lawmakers receiving money in an undercover investigation of alleged political corrupt ion.

Seven lawmakers, and seven other, including lobbyists, were named in an indictment Tuesday. The name of a 15th defendant, Gary Bartlett, a former Magistrate, was released Thursday, after he has been served with legal papers.

Those indicted were accused of more than \$100,000 in cash from a police informant posing as a gaming consultant trying to legalize casino gambling in Arizona. Hidden cameras recorded the informant's meetings with lawmakers and lobbyists.

News organizations that had requests under Arizona's public records law were given about an hour each to sample more than 200 reels of videotapes and 18,000 pages of transcripts in the case.

Senate Majority Leader Carolyn Walker was seen in one videotape accepting a stack of money from the informant. Joseph Stedino, who used the name, J. Anthony Vincent. He told her it was \$15,000.

"How do I, uh, launder this much" Mrs. Walkers asked before picking the stack of bills from the desk.


Vincent asked Mrs. Walker whether she would vote for him on the Senate floor, and she replied that she would vote yes "long before it gets to the floor."

Another tapes showed House Judiciary Chairman Don Kenney accepting a stack of bills from Vincent associate, Ronald Tapp. Police say it was a \$55,000 pay-off for "quarterbacking" the effort to legalize gambling.

Vincent is seen tossing a stack of money into Rep. Bobby Raymond's lap after a lengthy meeting between them in Vincent's office.

Vincent tells Raymond it is \$10,000 and Raymond replies, "That's a lot of money, Tony."

The defendants were accused of conspiring to bribe, lauder money and falsify campaign statements. One of the defendants, lobbyist Rich Scheffel, already pleaded guilty and





Lower Base area monitored for brown tree snake

For the next 15 days, CNMI Wildlife officials will be monitoring the area near the new bridge from Beach Road to Lower Base where a brown tree snake was found.

The flattened, slightly mangled snake was found by Commonwealth Utilities Corporation employee Danny Roligot.

DFW wildlife biologist Derek Stinson said that the snake, which probably arrived in some cargo from Guam, could have probably been dead for the past three to four days.

Stinson said that the Puerto Rico and Sadog Tasi areas will be searched intensively every night for the next 15 days.

He said that a number of snake traps have been placed in the area to see if there is a brown tree snake population that needs to be eradicated.

The snake is a native of Solomon Islands, New Guinea and the northern Coast of Australia. Several sightings have also been reported in Kwajalein, Wake, Oahu, Diego Garcia and Pohnpei.

On Saipan, the snake has been reportedly found in a container loaded with fish and a utility post shipped from Guam early last year.

The snake can be considered as dangerous since it can reach the length of 8 feet and weigh 5 lbs. It is aggressive and is relatively strong and holds its prey by wrapping its body around its victim, according to a pamphlet issued by the U.S. Department of Interior Fish and Wildlife Service.

The information stated that although it may not be dangerous for adults, special precautions should be taken to keep them away from infants and children.

Children may suffer from stangulation or constriction. suffocation or constriction, the information stated.

A climber that is at home in trees and shrubs, it forages at night using its keen sense of smell and sensitive night vision to find lizards, birds and mammals.

It frequently invades homes, commercial establishments and other urban habitats in search of food and hiding spots.

It has also caused a severe ecological damage on Guam such as the destruction of native bird populations, farm animals, fruit bats and pets.

The snakes also cause frequent and costly power outages and damage to expensive electrical equipment.


Stinson said that the Fish and Wildlife Division said that as part of an educational program, information is being given out to the public in the form of posters, leaflets and brochures.



Solons describe developments on Cayman Islands and Aruba

The Cayman Islands, a British dependency of 28,000 people and Aruba, a Dutch commonwealth, of 65,000 could serve as models for development for the Commonwealth, according to a Northern Marianas legislative delegation winding up of 15-day economic fact-finding mission to the Car-

Heavily dependent on tourism, both represent perhaps the best in terms of island economic development with very high standards of living, strong government role in tourism development, low crime rates, clean environment, friendly local populaces, and restricted foreign involvement in domestic commerce except in major developments, according to the delegation.

The delegation added that both dependencies also have developed a thriving industry in offshore banking and other forms of international financial ser-

The Cayman Islands, whose principal island of Grand Cayman looks like Saipan without the mountains and hills and has about the same resident population of 18,000, have a strong private sector whose small commerce is controlled by local

The government has a small work force of about 1.500 highly-paid employees-division chiefs at \$55,000, legislators at \$67,000 and department directors at \$88,000. Although there is no legal minimum wage, private sector salaries start at about \$7 an hour.

The legislative delegation, headed by Rep. William C. Ada, House Floor Leader, 'included Rep. John Reyes, House Democratic Minority leader, Rep. John Tenorio and Special Consultant Francisco T. Uludong, Uludong planned and

The mission, which left Saipan February 15, travelled to the Bahamas, Cayman Islands, U.S. Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and Aruba to study economic development, tourism, casino gambling, off-shore banking and financial service, foreign investment and local entrepreneurship programs, water and waste disposal systems, tax and licensing systems, alien employment, airline and cruise ship services.

While in the Bahamas and Puerto Rico, the delegation received offers of assistance for setting up casino operations on Tinian from top government of-

Both the Bahamas and Puerto Rico, top government officials said casinos can be a big and positive part in any economy but warned that the industry could bring with it serious crimes if governments are ill-prepared at the start of casino operations.

In the Bahamas, Prime Minister Lynden Pindling offered to train in the Bahamas key Commonwealth casino officials in casino operations and in Puerto Rico, Tourism Executive Director Carlos Diago offered to send a team immediately to Saipan to conduct a workshop for top government and business leaders on what to do to prepare for the casino industry on Tinian and later to train casino games employees.

In the Bahamas, the delegation members were guests of the Bahamas government at a cabaret show at Merv Griffin's Paradise Island Resort and Casino where the show cast is almost entirely Bahamian.

In Puerto Rico, a top government casino security official gave the delegation a tour of the security system used by the hotels to minimize cheating and other criminal activities on the casino floor.

The warnings about potential criminal involvement in casino operations were made in meetings in Bahamas with Prime Minister Pindling and in Puerto Rico by Jose Trias Monge, former Attorney General and Supreme Court Chief Justice.

Throughout the trip, government officials and top businessmen in the five countries and territories readily shared their development experiences, especially in tourism, with the CNMI delegation, a first high-level official fact-finding mission from Micronesia to the region.

At the same time, the Caribbean leaders wanted to learn all about CNMI's and Micronesia's economic development, especially about Japanese tourism in the region. The Japanese are just starting to invest in the tourist industry in the Caribbean but in a modest degree compared to

Continued from page 20 their investments in Guam and the CNMI.

At each stop, the delegation was greeted and welcome by a government protocol officials. The individual meetings were held with top government and business leaders except in the U.S. Virgin islands where the government officials, including legislators and top educators, were gathered in one workshop to brief the delegation about the Virgin Islands.

Except in Aruba, the delegation met with government heads throughout the trip-Prime Minister Pindling in the Bahamas, Governor Alan Scot in the Cayman Islands, Governor Alexander Farrelly in the U.S. Virgin islands, and Acting Governor Antonio J. Colorado in Puerto Rico.

A meeting with Prime MInister Nelson O. Oduber of Aruba was cancelled after the delegation decided to cut short their stay in Aruba.

In various ways and in varying degrees, the Carribean has a lot to teach the CNMI about development in general and tourism in particular," the delegation members said. "The Carribean countries and territories, most of which achieved self-government and independence in the 60's and the 70's started to develop their economies long before we in the CNMI did, so we can learn from them without re-inventing the wheels."

Among the key findings and observations made by the delegation during the mission are: In countries and territories

where the tourism industry appears to be very successful, the government plays a major role in the industry's planning, development, training and education, regulation and licensing, and promotion under one roof. Such government involvement is in the form of either an executive department of tourism or a tourist agency authorized and empowered to do more than tourism promotion, as in the case of MVB in the CNMI.

In the Bahamas, tourism is managed at the highest level of of Tourism.

The delegation was also told repeatedly that planning and stringent licensing and regulation is the key to successful tourism industry. Zoning was repeatedly emphasized in all the meetings between the delegation and the local government and business leaders.

In Puerto Rico, the government tourist agency, the Puerto Rico Tourist Co., has the power to designate an area, site or building, a "tourists zone" for special protection and improvement

In the Cayman Islands, the Bahamas and Aruba, hotels and other tourist related business are not allowed to operated unless inspected and licensed by the tourist department.

Education and formal training and the role the government played in them is also an important factor in the successful tourist industry.

The Carribean is also the site of a number of expensive condominiums and villas owned by rich foreigners. They are a major part of the tourism industry and are a significant source of foreign exchange.

Cruise ships, which account to up to 50% of the tourists also frequent the Carribean route. The delegation proposes that if the CNMI wants to develop a cruiseship business from Japan, adequate port and shopping facilities as well as entertainment should be established way ahead of time.

Innovations in luring and keeping tourists are commonplace in the area. Weekly and month-long festivals are organized for the enjoyment of the

Preferential tourists visas are accorded Canadian and American citizens as they have contributed to the local economic development of the islands.

Also foreign businessmen are restricted to from engaging in small businesses except in limited areas while alien labor has been restricted in most of the places visited by the delegation.

All island countries and territories have very progressive laws











The Association of Pacific Island Legislatures, during one of its session have passed a resolution requesting the US Department of State to approve the CNMI's request to receive financial aid from third countries.

Following is a copy of the approved resolution:

In 1978, the United States Department of State cabled the embassies of the US a notice which established a policy that appropriate third country financial and technical assistance would be permitted to the island groups of the TT of the Pacific Islands, including the CNMI.

The people of the CNMI repeatedly and regularly expressed their desire to receive approval of assistance for infrastructure and other capital improvement projects, such as an air traffic control tower at the Saipan International Airport and the Talfofo Basin water project on the island of Saipan.

Cable T.V. Group Vice-President Harrison Flora said that although the pole rentals remain at \$3.50, the management has already agreed that they will pay any difference retroactively if their negotiations came out higher, according to a faxed response to the Variety's inquiry.

CUC contends that since Cable T.V. had been paying the amount for the past 8 years, it is now time to increase their rents since the cost to emplace and maintain power poles have also gone up. "The CUC thinks that it is only fitting that the pole rental rate go up to help meet the increasing costs," the press release

CUC officials also stated that the position they have taken on the matter is only "simple and fair." The CUC has set to \$6 the new pole rental rate Cable T.V. should pay in a year.

stated.

"We see nothing unreasonable about the new rate. It is only \$2.50 per pole per year more than what was being paid in 1983 and only \$1.50 more than what Saipan Cable T.V. offered six weeks ago," the CUC press release stated.

CUC officials further stated that the "CUC has both the right and the duty to charge a reasonable rate for use of public utility

Flora however said that the CUC has not been able to justify the increased rate they were requiring. The Cable management's position is that they do not intend to pay more for the poles because such action will just hasten the next Cable T.V. rates, Flora stated.

Flora clarified that a meeting between Cable T.V. management headed by its president Lee Holmes was supposed to have taken place Tuesday however, since Guerrero if off-island for the rest of this week, another round of talks have been scheduled for the 19th.

He further contends that although the Cable T.V. have complied with the changes on the 1981 contract regarding Cable's equipment, their attempts to negotiate the rate from 1987 to 1993 have been blocked.

The disruption of cable services in the As Lito area was a result of a vehicular accident. Cable services to 100 families living in the area have been disrupted since CUC officials would not allow the Cable crews to transfer the cable lines to the new poles.

Cable T.V. Group Vice-President Harrison Flora said that although the pole rentals remain at \$3.50, the management has already agreed that they will pay any difference retroactively if their negotiations came out higher, according to a faxed response to the Variety's inquiry.

CUC contends that since Cable T.V. had been paying the amount for the past 8 years, it is now time to increase their rents since the cost to emplace and maintain power poles have also gone up.

"The CUC thinks that it is only fitting that the pole rental rate go up to help meet the increasing costs," the press release stated.

CUC officials also stated that the position they have taken on the matter is only "simple and fair." The CUC has set to \$6 the new pole rental rate Cable T.V. should pay in a year.

"We see nothing unreasonable about the new rate. It is only \$2.50 per pole per year more than what was being paid in 1983 and only \$1.50 more than what Saipan Cable T.V. offered six weeks ago," the CUC press release stated.

CUC officials further stated that the "CUC has both the right and the duty to charge a reasonable rate for use of public utility

Flora however said that the CUC has not been able to justify the increased rate they were requiring. The Cable management's position is that they do not intend to pay more for the poles because such action will just hasten the next Cable T.V. rates, Flora stated.

Flora clarified that a meeting between Cable T.V. managementheaded by its president Lee Holmes was supposed to have taken place Tuesday however, since Guerrero if off-island for the rest of this week, another round of talks have been scheduled for the 19th.

He further contends that although the Cable T.V. have complied with the changes on the 1981 contract regarding Cable's equipment, their attempts to negotiate the rate from 1987 to 1993 have been blocked.

The disruption of cable services in the As Lito area was a result of a vehicular accident. Cable services to 100 families living in the area have been disrupted since CUC officials would not allow the Cable crews to transfer the cable lines to the new poles.

This was also the case for 10 subscribers in Lower Navy Hill.



agreement to the proposal yet...and that approval is not yet legally binding," Concepcion stressed.

Various inquiries on the possibility of establishing a park in the Samoan Housing area were then raised by various members of the committee. Earlier, a resolution was approved by members of the house specifying the need to use the housing area as a public park and a petition to do so was signed by various civic-minded citizens that was sent to the Governor.

Concepcion said that he will "strongly recommend that to the 5-member board...to consider it before finally making a final decision.

He mentioned that his job is to let the members of the MPLC Board become "well versed" on both pros and cons of any development.

When asked by the committee on whether he is in favor of establishing a park in the Garapan area, Concepcion said "do we really need another park now?'

He explained that there are areas on Saipan that are already designated as parks but goes unutilized

underdeveloped..."nice to talk about parks, but if we start with one again...are we really serious to put money and keep it in good condition?

Cong. Jesus Attao said that they should start first with locating the property then funding comes next..."MPLC will designate and then Legislature will

Concepcion also pointed out that based from a survey that was conducted by the MPLC about two weeks ago, only around 20 families stay within the area, given a walking distance of 2 miles from the Samoan housing, while the rest of the area are already occupied and rented to mostly foreign commercial businesses.

"The Legislature should also consider the function of the park...what purpose it will serve...most residents live on the South of Horigucihi building going to Gualo Rai area...," he

Attao cited that the park will benefit the whole of the Commonwealth, as proven by the supported petition..."as it will also benefit the future generation...care for our children.."

Cong. Benavente agreed and said that funding is not necessarily that important..."what is important is that people will have a property where everybone can

Speaker Pedro Guerrero, on the other hand, referring to both the Garapan Park proposal and the Hotel project, said that a public hearing has to be conducted.

Guerrero added that It is only fair for everybody to be given a "chance in a lifetime" to participate on how public lands will be used.

The Speaker also recommended that increase in development should be "scattered" among the various islands to at least provide for a balanced growth.

MPLC head said it is up for the board to decide and conduct a public hearing..."given that obligation to act on everybody's

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

Filing season for taxpayers is here again. Revenue and Taxation has most of the necessary forms for taxpayers to file their tax returns. These forms can be picked up at the Civic Center Office in Susupe and at the Revenue and Taxation offices in Tinian and Rota. Taxpayer assistance is also provided in these offices. No appointment is required. The Civic Center Office in Susupe is opened from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Taxpayer assistance is also available during lunch hour to accommodate those taxpayers who can come only during lunch break.

Deadlines for filing returns are as follows: Individual Income Tax Return Corporate Income Tax Return For fiscal year taxpayers

April 15, 1991 March 15, 1991 15th day of third month after closing of fiscal

Taxpayers are not required to stand in line at the Tax Office to file their completed returns. Completed tax returns may be mailed to Revenue and Faxation, Civic Center, Susupe, Saipan, MP 96950. Returns filed through the mail must be postmarked on or before the due date set for the filing of the returns. Returns postmarked after the due date will be considered returns not timely filed and applicable penalty and interest will be imposed. Completed tax returns may also be dropped at the box located at the Civic Center Office. A taxpayer need not stand in line only to file his/her return. Taxpayers are encouraged to utilize either system to alleviate the congestions currently being experienced at the Civic Center Office.

The Division of Revenue and Taxation provides taxpayer assistance and other services. If a taxpayer requires the assistance of the Division in figuring the amount of tax to be paid or in filling out the return, the taxpayer will be required to complete certain portion of the return prior to being serviced. Taxpayers filing Form 1040A-CM are required to complete all items in the return through line 22. In addition, taxpayers must meet ALL the conditions


described on page 36 of the instructions booklet for Form 1040A-CM. Taxpayers filing for 1040-CM are required to fill in the complete all items through line 37. In addition, such taxpayers must also meet the conditions specified on Page 19 of the instructional booklet for form 1040 CM.


Revenue and Taxation also provides services to taxpayers on an individual walk-in basis. However, taxpayers utilizing this system are advised that at times, they may have to stand in long lines in order to get to one of the taxpayers service representatives at the counter. Like the system described in the preceding paragraph, taxpayer requiring assistance on a walk-in basis will be required to fill out all the parts of the returns as indicated in the previous paragraph. Taxpayers utilizing this system are asked to comply with the requirements so that assistance can be expedited and waiting period minimized.

In addition to the service provided by Revenue and Taxation, there are other persons in the community who are knowledgeable and can prepare tax returns. Taxpayers can seek the assistance of these individuals when preparing their tax returns. However, if the taxpayers pays someone to prepare his/her return, the preparer is required by law to sign the return and furnish all information required in the paid preparer's portion of the return. Taxpayers are reminded that they are still responsible for the accuracy of every item entered on their returns regardless of who provided the assistance. This is true even if the assistance was rendered by any employee of Revenue and Taxation.


Revenue and Taxation is asking the cooperation of all taxpayers to comply with the procedures and guidelines stated above as they are designed to expedite a smooth and less painful filing season for everyone.

Refund checks resulting from overpayment are scheduled to be prepared and mailed AFTER April 15, 1991.


