IN the Police Court Saturday there were three cases of drunkenness. Ioken, for assault and battery, forfeited his bail of \$12; Kekaluma, charged with a similar offence upon a woman, was fined \$7 and costs \$3.20.

THE recent rain has had the effect of increasing the water supply in the Makiki reservoir, which has just been cleaned. Horticulturists will be glad to learn that at present there is no prospect of the supply being stopped.

Lyons & Levy will sell to-day at 12 noon, at Sales Room, a lot of splendid fat turkeys.

It is announced that the Weekly Advertiser is to be published in a new form on Saturday. It will contain a variety of matter prepared expressly for the weekly issue, especially adapted to a family newspaper and to a paper circulating amongst those who live in the country and are engaged in planting, farming or other rural pursuits.

He was seized with an apoplectic fit and fell over the parapet of the prison, where he was in the custom of walking, and when picked up, he was dead. Mr. Buckle leaves three daughters and one son, and was about 55 years old. The funeral takes place this afternoon at 4 o'clock, under the direction of the Masons.

THE four members of the Ministry, hand in hand, making for the legislature of 1884, was the subject of Saturday's Pae Aina picture. Each gentleman had a Government candidate in his pocket, their legs dangling below, and they were followed by Colonel Spreckels with a club, full of coin. 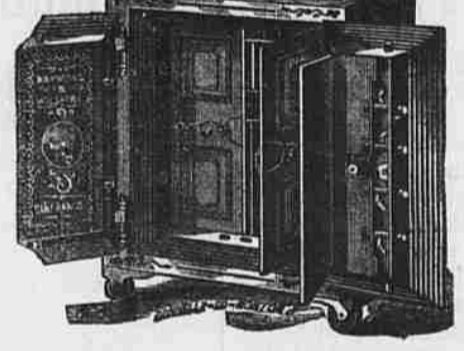

HAWAIIAN COIN.

In November last Superintendent Burton of the Mint, representing the United States Government, entered into a contract with Sir Claus Spreckels for the coinage of \$1,000,000 of the denominations of quarters, halves and dollars for the Hawaiian kingdom.

This is no doubt owing to the fact that a number of business men in Honolulu have taken legal steps to prevent the issuance of bonds to the amount of \$1,000,000, bearing interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum.

By the Alameda another lot of Hawaiian silver coin was received, amounting to \$170,000, making the stock in the treasury \$300,000, which as yet lies idle awaiting probably the decision of the full Bench upon the mandamus case.

A Chronicle reporter visited a number of gentlemen who have business with the islands, yesterday, and among the number was one who evidently was familiar with all the facts in the case.

He said: "Yes, I have heard all about the trouble. It appears that the Hawaiian Government and Sir Claus made an agreement by which the knight was to furnish \$1,000,000 in silver coin of the intrinsic value of our quarters, halves and dollars.

For this service he was to receive \$1,000,000 in bonds, which would bear interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum. This is what the people find fault with.

They very justly protest against paying \$80,000 a year interest for coins which they could get along very well without. But this is not all.

The \$1,000,000 in coin is actually worth but \$850,000—that is, the value of the bullion used only amounts to that figure. Of course this is a very nice speculation for Sir Claus, but you can't blame the people for kicking.

I don't think it will do them any good, however, as I expect you know Sir Claus has everything his own way down there.

Ex-Senator Paul Neumann has charge of the case on the part of the Crown, which means Sir Claus, and there is no doubt in my mind but that the bonds will be issued.

Most financiers would not care to invest in Hawaiian bonds, but there isn't any danger that Sir Claus will get left on the transaction.
