As senior chaplain I arranged for Catholic services for the Combat Team, bringing a Catholic chaplain (see par. 3) for one service, and sending the men to a nearby army Mass on another Sunday. On two Sundays no services were possible due to combat conditions.

Nearby Jewish services were publicized, and transportation provided; however only one officer of the Combat Team responded (there are only a few men of the Jewish faith in the unit).

In combat I assisted the battalion service in caring for sick and wounded, both our soldiers and civilians.
