### Latest Foreign News.

London, March 22.—The condition of Queen Victoria's limb, which was injured by her fall Saturday last, continues quite satisfactory. Her Majesty keeps her room, in accordance with the advice of her physicians not to move about, and the swelling in the knee is subsiding, and it is hoped by the physicians in attendance that it will disappear entirely in few days. There has at no time been any ground for the excitement over the matter, which seems to have been created in New York, and which has not prevailed here. The matter creates very little comment in London.

New York, March 26.—The steamer from Panama, with dates of the 17th, brings the following news: The condition of affairs in Peru continues unaltered, but as the Chileans have released several of their more important prisoners, the latter have returned to Peru to advocate the establishment of peace. The prospects of action in this respect continue to improve.

Much alarm is felt in Guayaquil, and all citizens unite in denouncing the Dictator. Rioting is prevented solely by the presence of the Italian and English men-of-war. The revolutionary troops will enter the city without a struggle. The latest intelligence is that they were close in the vicinity. Public opinion is strongly pronounced against the Dictator, who declared that he will hold out all hazards, even if the destruction of the town should follow.

Odessa, March 27.—A Socialistic manifesto is in circulation in the Southern part of Russia inviting people to avail themselves of the coming fetes of the coronation of the Czar to pillage the houses of the nobles and the Jews. A deputation of nobles has gone to St. Petersburg to ask Count Tolster, Minister of the Interior, to provide for the protection of their property.

Washington, March 24.—A party of gentlemen have just returned from New York and Cleveland, respectively, having gone to these two cities at an appointed (Continued on page 4.)

**SHIPPING NOTES.**

The bk. St. Lawrence will be due in the mouth of June with a load of coal, consigned to Wilder & Co.

Heavy gales have been reported during the early part of this week as blowing outside. The Captain of the *Hesperian* thought at one time, her masts would be blown out of her.

The *Kalakaua*, Capt. Miller, sails on Monday next for San Francisco. The bark *W. H. Almy*, Capt. Freeman, arrived yesterday, 18 days from San Francisco.

The *Waimanalo* brought 310 bags sugar, 110 bags rice, and 16 bbls molasses.

The *Gazette*, in its last issue, shows a lamentable want of knowledge of political history, when it says, "At the coronation of Alexander III, were present the most distinguished men," &c. We admit the fact, but the *Gazette* ought to remember that was prior to the "dynamite age." No country that values her public men would dream of sending them on such service now-a-days.

**LOCAL & GENERAL ITEMS.**

Go and see the fine flowers, &c., Lyons & Levey will sell at 12 noon.

A Pigeon shooting Match at Kalihi is proposed for to-morrow.

We learn about 5,000 tons of coal are now on the way to these islands from Australia.

LYCAN & Johnson have received some new goods by Suez. They will open them to-day.

Our thanks are due to J. W. Robertson & Co. for files of papers by all the late mails.

The Band has done an extra amount of work this week and we have had an extra amount of pleasure in consequence.

It was rumoured in town yesterday that three bodies of Chinamen had been thrown overboard from the *Madras*, the night before.

Work on the foundations of Campbell's new block is finished, and the first stratum of brick work has been laid.

PEOPLE need not get frightened that small-pox will get abroad in the town, as every precaution necessary is being taken.

Why were so many barricades built on Queen street yesterday morning? They surely weren't all needed to allow work to be done on the roads.

THE Chinamen at the Immigration Depot at Kakaako were most of them shipped yesterday. Strings of them were to be seen passing up the town.

YESTERDAY the balance of Chinamen from the *Glenelg* (some 600) were landed at the Kahakaaulana Quarantine Grounds. No signs of ill health are observable amongst them.

We believe there is no law which authorizes the lona of a gang of prisoners to hit them or administer corporal punishment to them at any time, and yet this was done on Queen street yesterday morning. It ought to be looked into.

We are requested to announce that the rehearsal of the Amateur Musical Society announced for this evening, has been postponed until Monday evening, when a full attendance of members is requested.

In all districts of the town we find evidences that the building trade is in a brisk condition. New buildings are just being started while others are just being finished. Shops seem to be the most popular form of building. The only puzzle now, is, who is to occupy them all?

The captain of the *Madras* yesterday asked the Board of Health to reconsider their resolutions and permit him to land passengers in quarantine. The Board, however, refused to do so, and still hold to their former determination, not to allow any of them to land.

WM. HARBOTTLE, whose death was reported in our columns yesterday, was the only Brigadier-General in the Hawaiian Army. He was also captain of the first Hawaiian brig-of-war, the *Kai*. Both these appointments were conferred on him in the reign of Kamehameha III.

It was reported yesterday that there was a case of small-pox in town, and another in the Quarantine grounds, both Chinese patients. We were unable, however, to get any verification of it last night, and so far as we can find out there is not the slightest foundation for these rumours. People ought to be prosecuted who raise such fearful alarms.

By files received by the Australia we see that difficulties have occurred between the New Zealand Government and a section of the Maories, over an attempt made by the Government to explore a certain portion of the interior. Finally the greater portion of the *Ngatimaniapoto* tribe allowed the exploration, but the dis-

satisfied ones captured the exploring party and only gave them up when compelled by the balance of the tribe. Since then the troops have captured 23 of the rebellious natives, and they are now awaiting trial. An outbreak was feared at first.

The *Alta*, of March 16th, says: "The Hall Brothers are building a steamer 160 feet long. Her decks are now being put in, and she will come here for her boilers and machinery."

YESTERDAY Captain Wolters, of the bark C. R. Bishop, met with a serious accident. He had to move his vessel from her moorings to make room for the *Janet* Court, and was accompanying Captain Fuller along Allen & Robinson's wharf to be shown where his vessel was now to be moored. Captain Fuller was walking a pace or two in advance, when, suddenly, without any warning, and from no visible cause, five pieces of lumber, 10x12, fell down on Captain Wolters and broke his left leg, just above the knee. Dr. Meyer, of Kauai, was immediately sent for, and with the assistance of the two doctors of the German man-of-war, fixed his leg so that he could be moved. He was taken to the residence of Mr. Bolte, at Waikiki, where he now is under the care of Dr. Brodie. At last accounts he was progressing favorably.

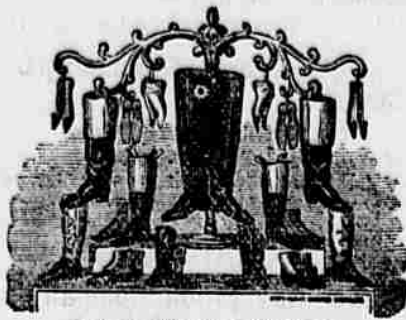

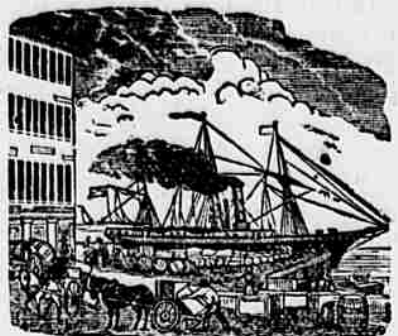
