Bond Instructions Are Given

HITCHCOCK'S DIRECTIONS FOR BOND ISSUE

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 5.—Secretary Hitchcock of the Interior Department has issued instructions for the sale of the four per cent bonds provided for under the Hawaiian Fire Claims appropriation approved January 26.

George A. Davis this afternoon filed another motion for a new trial of B. H. Wright. The grounds briefly stated, are that E. P. Dole, former Attorney General, was an important witness in the case who disobeyed the court's subpoena to appear.

Appointments Are Confirmed, House Against Lazaretto

SENATE. Fourteenth Day.

A. N. Kepoikai, Treasurer of the Territory, in a communication read directly after the opening of the Senate this morning, referred to the importance of all matters of revenue and tendered any assistance required of himself or his department by the Senate or committees thereof in elucidating financial questions.

SENATOR ACHI presented a resolution that the Treasurer of the Territory notify the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States that the money to provide for the expenses of payment of fire claims will be appropriated within one week.

SENATOR BALDWIN was against the resolution. How was the honorable member going to guarantee the passage of any bill within a week, seeing that the House of Representatives would have to be taken into account.

SENATOR BALDWIN said the Committee on Ways and Means had reported in favor of laying the Achi bill on the table because the item was in the Emergency Appropriation Bill.

SENATOR PARIA supported the amendment. Senator Kalaoukalani doubted the advisability of rushing the measure. The bill introduced by Senator Brown to provide for a Government depository provided means of meeting the expenses in question.

SENATOR BERG conceded that the previous speaker was partly right, yet the bill of Senator Brown provided only for expenses of the bonds. This appropriation was to defray the expenses of a special agent of the Treasury coming here to pay the claims.

SENATOR McCANDLESS could see no harm in pleading the Senate to pass this appropriation within a week. Concurrence of the House would certainly be obtained promptly.

SENATOR BALDWIN's motion the bill was placed on the order of the day.

JURY OBTAINED FOR TRIAL OF JAMES H. BOYD

The following jury for the trial of James H. Boyd, former Superintendent of Public Works, on indictment No. 1 for embezzlement of public funds was obtained early this forenoon of the third day.

ATTORNEY CATHERY for the prosecution made a demand for the production of the defendant's commission as Superintendent of Public Works. The defendant admitted that he had held the office in question.

R. D. MEAD was called and identified a check for \$200, signed by W. O. SMITH, trustee, which was filed as an exhibit.

MANUEL K. COOK, clerk in the Public Works office, produced a cash book. Attorney Robertson for the defendant objected to its admission.

ATTORNEY ROBERTSON renewed his objection on the ground that it was not a book of original entry. This also was overruled.

AN auxiliary book marked "Public Works Receipts" was next produced. Mr. Robertson objected again, only to be overruled.

S. M. DAMON was among the additional jurors summoned this morning. His position as the salaried head of Bishop & Co.'s bank was pleaded, as well as the fact that he was a witness in the case, and he was excused.

ROUNDING UP NEGROES.

THREE negroes, Brady Clemons, Archie Williams and Charles Russell, were arrested last night by Deputy Sheriff Chillingworth on warrants charging them with being the parties who so cruelly beat and robbed a Chinese at Moanalua last week.

THE men were arrested in their room at Palama and pretended ignorance of the crime. However, their stories as to their whereabouts on the night in question do not hang together and the officer is pretty sure he has a clear case against them.

HIGH Sheriff Brown has received a photograph and description of Fred A. Beach, who is supposed to have come here from Chicago. He is wanted for the embezzlement of \$11,000 on January 22 last.

A reward of \$500 is offered for capture.

At the opening of the session this forenoon, the following communication was received from Treasurer A. N. Kepoikai and referred to the Finance Committee:

KEPOIKAI'S LETTER. I have the honor to herewith notify you that, whereas several measures have already been introduced in your Honorable Body, affecting the revenue of this Territory, it is but proper that my Department should be appraised before being passed upon finally.

Revenue measures are of such vast importance these days, that they should be carefully looked into and properly safeguarded.

Therefore, permit me to suggest that all and every information within the reach and the province of this department to impart, will be readily given.

At the same time, assuring you of the cooperation of this department with any committee to whom you may refer any such measures.

THE following communication from the Superintendent of Public Works was next read.

COOPER ON USURERS. I have to acknowledge receipt of House concurrent resolution No. 1, concerning the payment of laborers employed by the department and calling attention to the fact that third parties are in the habit of advancing money to the laborers at exorbitant rates of interest.

BOTH of these subjects have had the previous attention of the department, and orders have been given strictly prohibiting any person advancing or loaning money to laborers at usurious rates of interest.

THE payment of laborers at the end of each week wherever the same is practicable, meets with my approval.

A communication from the Senate announced the adoption of the joint concurrent resolution protesting against the making of a national lazaretto out of the settlement on Molokai and submitting the same for action by the House.

MR. KUMALAE moved the adoption of the resolution and was seconded by every Republican in the House. The Home Rulers bucked the proposition and Mr. Kaaiho moved for indefinite postponement, while Mr. Paole arose and gave a history of the settlement from its inception with reference to the number of lepers at the place from

TACOMA, Wash., March 5.—Fire broke out today in the hold of the American-Hawaiian freighter Arizonian. Considerable damage was done, which will delay the sailing of the steamer several days.

Will Remain In Cuba

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 5.—It has been decided that the small complement of American troops now in Cuba shall remain indefinitely to care for the new American stations secured at Guantanamo and Bahia Honda.
