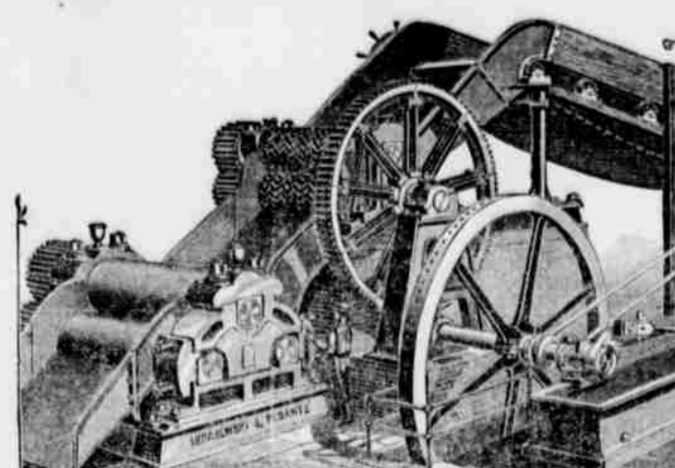

KRAJEWSKI CANE CRUSHER

We beg to draw the planter's attention to this machine for which we claim the following advantages:

THE CRUSHER will cut the cane transversely in pieces about 3 inches long and extract about 50 per cent. of the juice and fiber. The crushed cane in a uniform layer, to the 3 roller mill, thereby causing a perfect feed and increased extraction of juice.

THE CRUSHER will leave the "skin" on the cane, thereby giving the juice a better chance to be expelled than if the cane was ripped open, subjecting the pulp to the hard packing on the return bar of the 3 roller mill.

THE CRUSHER will save labor in handling of the cane, as an irregular distribution of cane on the carrier will not materially affect the regular and even feed to the 3 roller mill.

THE CRUSHER will not require additional steam or boiler power, as it has been demonstrated in actual practice, that the increased extraction of juice has improved the trash as well as to fully make up for the additional use of steam to drive it.

THE CRUSHER is strongly built, the rollers are made of solid steel rings on the shafts. The pinions are all of steel and the spurwheel is provided with segment rim. Its speed is about the same as the mill rollers, thereby giving comfort and safety in running. It is so constructed, that should iron parts, such as bolts, ear coupling links and pin-coupling keys, etc., go through, it will not injure any of the parts.

Of course with this even feed of crushed cane from the crusher we are enabled to close down our mill in 10 to 15 minutes before, and from experiments of drying the trash, there was only 40 to 45 per cent. of moisture left in it. 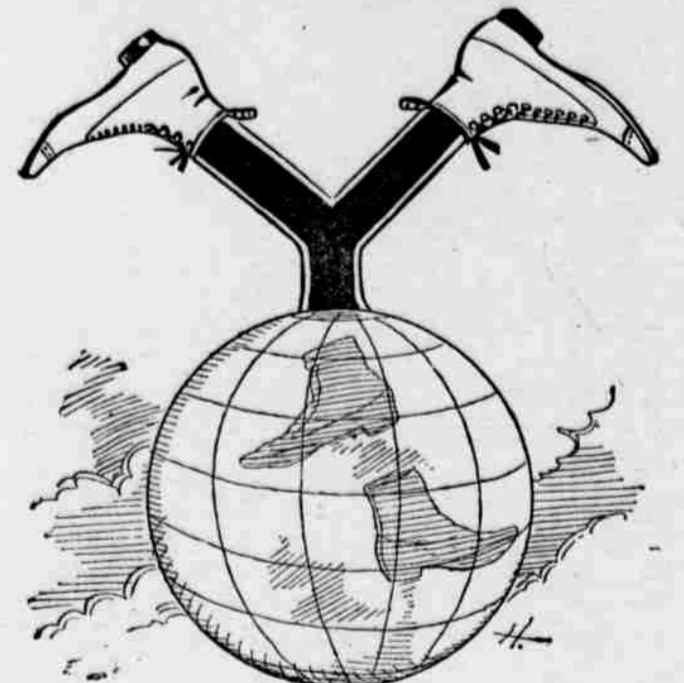

A REVENUE CUTTER NOW.
S. S. LEHUA TO GO INTO SERVICE FOR THE GOVERNMENT.
Will Cruise After Smugglers—Around Oahu—Visits to Molokai and Maui.
At the meeting of the Councils late Tuesday it was decided to charter the steamer *Lehua* for use as a revenue cutter. A provisional appropriation of \$10,000 was made with the understanding that the scheme be tried for one month. If successful the steamer will be used longer.
The matter was brought up by the Attorney-General. The cutter will be operated under the Customs and Attorney-General's Departments. For some time opium in large quantities has been passing around among the islands. Some believe that the *Lehua* will pay for herself in a few weeks. There are others very much opposed to the venture, characterizing it as an unwarranted expenditure of money. Much of the time the steamer will be in sight of the lookout station.
The *Lehua* will be manned and armed for her new business. Her route will be chiefly around Oahu, frequently making the circuit of this island. At times, when deemed advisable, she will drop over to Lahaina and cruise around Molokai.
The vessel belongs to the Wilder line and was only this week laid up for the season. She will be commanded by Capt. Wier, the regular master. Port Surveyor Saunders may be in charge of the expedition.
WANTED TO DIE.
Japanese Lost in the Sea Had Suicidal Tendencies.
It is not doubted that the Japanese who ran away from Quarantine Island and was later found floating in the sea committed suicide. His widow says that several times lately he has tried to kill himself. "If," he remarked, "another attempt should be made from any source to overthrow the present Government, I shall not be in it. I recognize the utter uselessness of any such attempt, and feel convinced that the Royalist cause is totally dead."
The rumors about a revolution on Maui appear to be confined to Honolulu. Residents of Maui entertain no fear of such.
Olowalu mill has suspended grinding for the season.
Lahaina mill will resume work within a few days.
Mr. W. Decoto, the head over-see of the Pioneer mill, had his arm severely bitten by a stallion on last Friday. Prompt attendance to the matter has, however, prevented any serious results.
The racing mare Silky belonging to R. Ballentine, Esq., will be shipped to Honolulu on the next Hall. Mr. Chas. Daria will accompany the fleet little mare.
Lahaina sports contemplate having some races on the Lahaina track on Kamehameha a day which promises to be quite an event to judge by the interest manifested in the affair.
