RICH LACE IN ANTWERP. The Genuine Article—A Young Lady's Treasure—Cherished Heirlooms. (Cor. N. O. Mcayne.) Lace in quantity is never seen in the street in Antwerp, unless it is worn by English or Americans; for no Antwerp lady would wear her rich lace in the street or allow herself to appear in a cheap imitation.

One of these was only a child and would naturally have inherited a magnificent collection of lace, gathered and inherited by her mother. But she was not inclined to work with the needle, and rebelled against the necessary condition imposed, of learning how to mend and actually make lace, so as to be able to keep it in perfect condition.

A lace as made in Antwerp is a very very desirable possession. It is not cut up and wasted from the piece, as with us, but an accurate pattern is sent and the dress is outlined from it and the pattern wrought in accordance to cost. The lace pieces for bonnets, fans, parasols, and every article of the toilet for which lace is used are all made and finished upon the edge in the same way and are beautiful and permanent possessions.

But the Antwerp lady more frequently gets the dress than her New York sister the cloak; for the reason, probably, that less money is spent in Antwerp on trifles and on the costly articles of street attire, bonnets, parasols, and, above all, gloves, which are such an important and costly item in America.

The Telegraph's "Lightning Arrester." To the uninitiated it is a great puzzle how the dangers of lightning are averted where there are so many conductors of electricity as in a telegraph office. More than 2,000 different wires come into the Western Union building, and run more or less directly to the desks of the operators. Even when less electric attractions are wanting, most people confess to a certain feeling of insecurity when the elements rage and wake up terrifying flashes of forged fury.

Every wire, as it enters the building, passes through the bottom of a long narrow board, and then again through it at the top. This board is a lightning arrester. If the current is heavy, its first effect is to deprive it of much of its force. Should even this fail to deprive the current of its fatal power, and it passes on to the top of the board, it touches a spring which drops instantly and shuts off all connection with the operating room. The spring is called the push magnet, and beyond it no overcharge of lightning, whether proceeding from a storm or from contact with other wires, can possibly go.

An Item of Expense. The street railways which in the course of the year amount to a good round sum is that for salt used on the tracks in snowy or sloppy weather. At every viaduct, curve and crossing a man is stationed with a bucket of salt, busily sprinkling the tracks. When the entire street railway system of the city is considered it will at once be seen that the outlay for the material used and labor employed reaches far into the thousands of dollars.—Chicago Tribune.

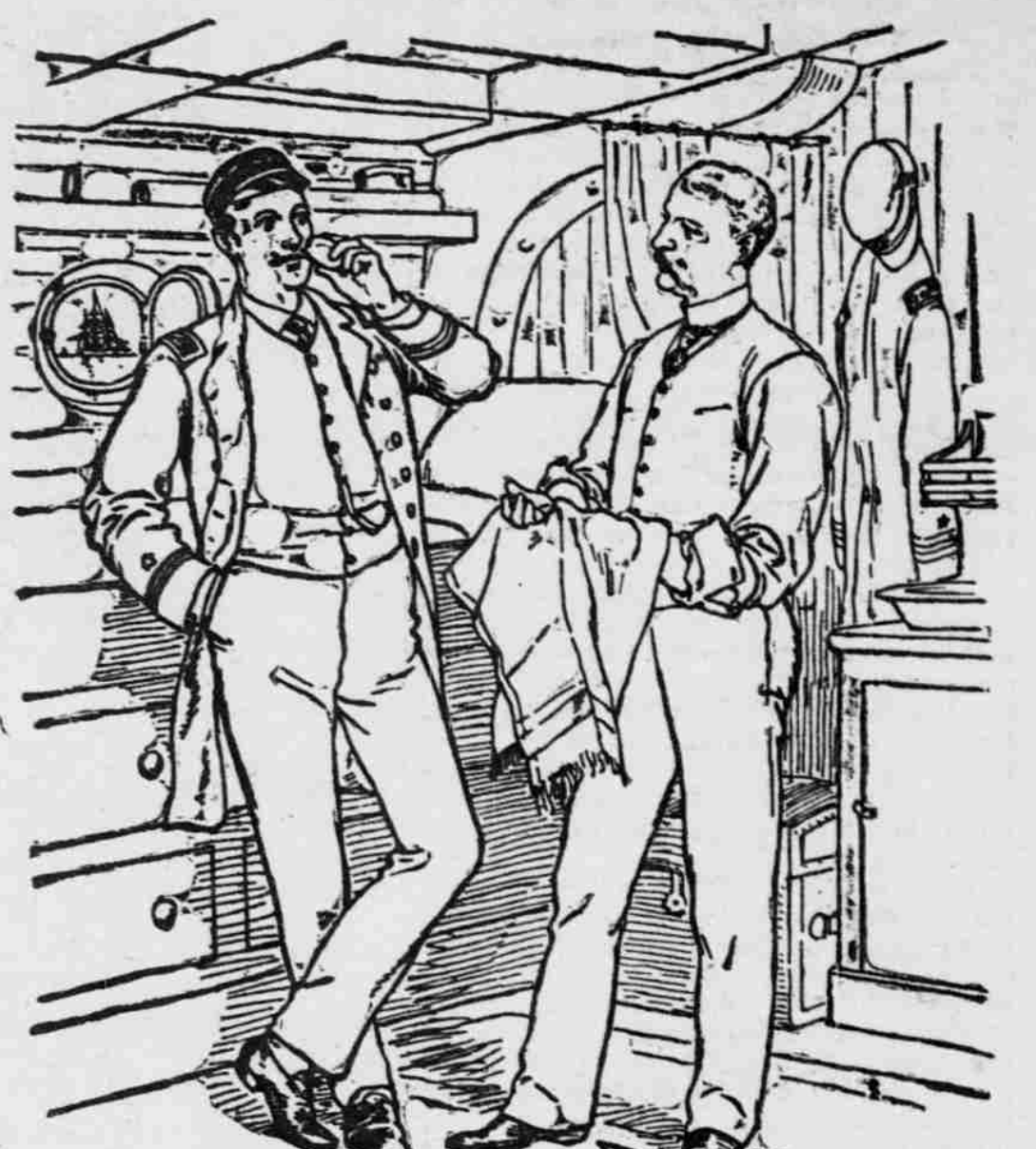

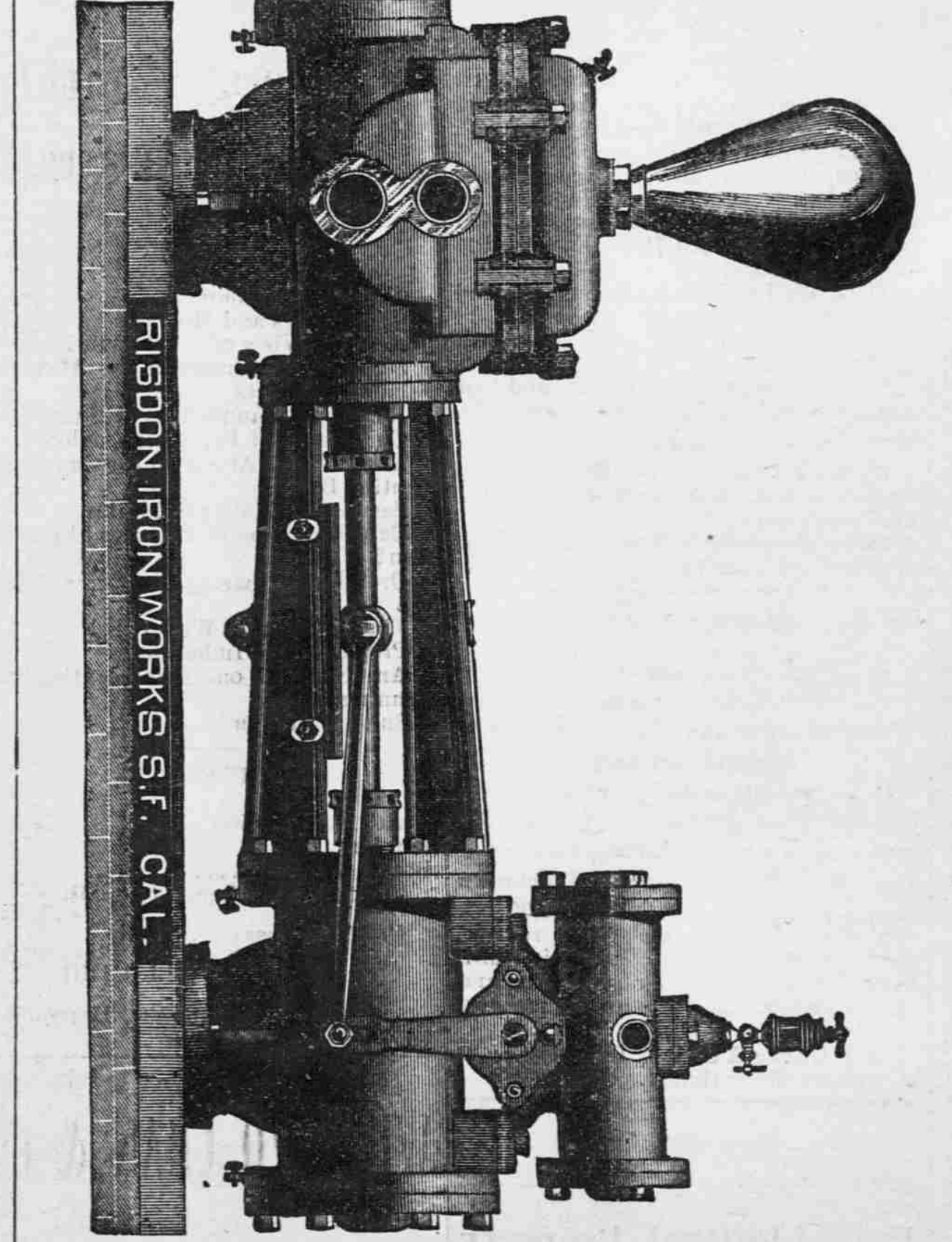

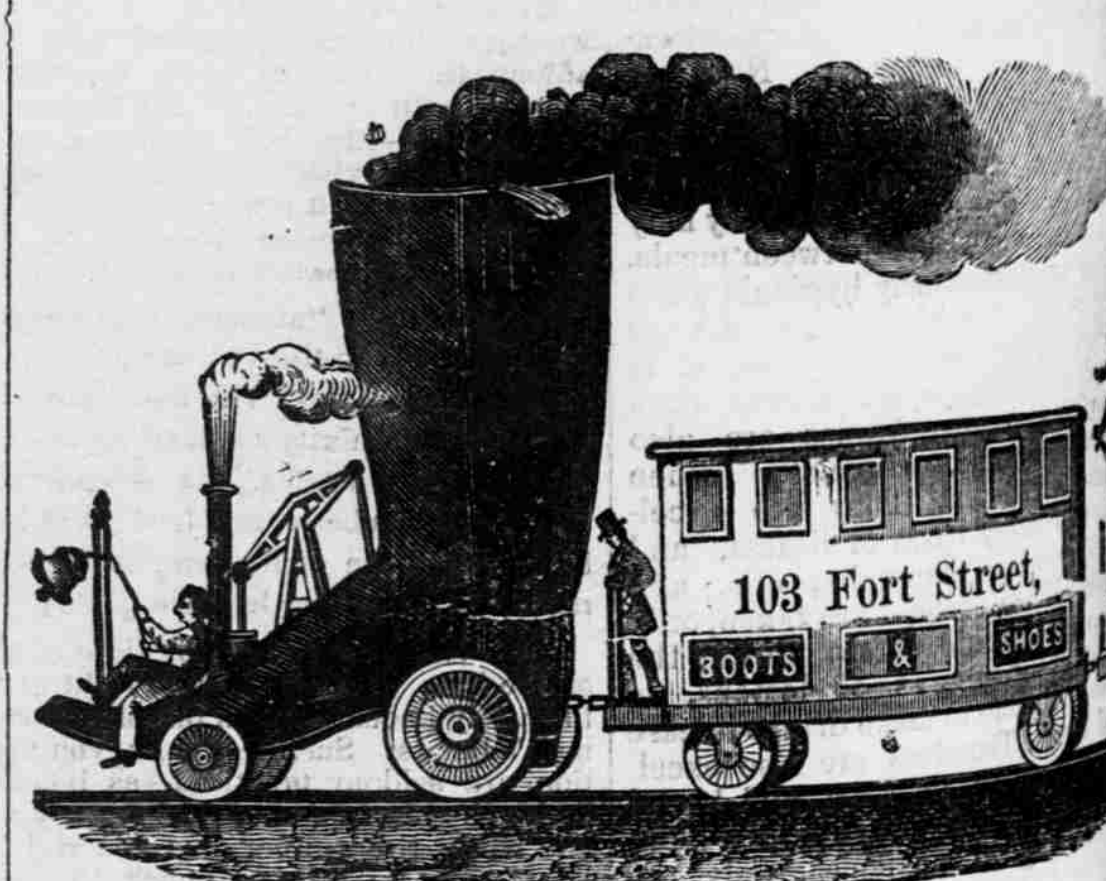
