THE NEW BANK

Was opened yesterday morning at the office of Messrs. W. G. Irwin & Co. An announcement in another column states that a copartnership has been formed between Claus Spreckels, W. G. Irwin and F. P. Low 'for the purpose of carrying on a general banking and exchange business at Honolulu and such other places in the Hawaiian Kingdom as may be deemed advisable.'

The new bank is prepared to do the usual banking business and is arranging to sell exchange on the principal points in the United States, Europe, China, Japan and Australia. Deposits can be made at once.

Governor Low being the manager of the Anglo-Californian Bank and connected with the new enterprise of Spreckels & Co. should be a guarantee of sufficient capital to back the new banking house.

At present, of course, their arrangements are hardly complete, but, we believe, it is their intention to erect suitable buildings of their own. At present Mr. W. G. Irwin is the manager of the bank and he will as quickly as possible, complete the routine of a banking house.

The old banking house of Bishop & Co. has hitherto had a monopoly of banking business, and, we believe, that but few, if any, complaints have ever been made against them. It is no surprise to us to see a new bank, in fact we have often been surprised that there has been but one such institution in a place of the size and population of this Kingdom.

In Australia every country township of a thousand inhabitants has its two or three banks. Several gentlemen from Australia, England and America have, from time to time, proposed to start this enterprise, but, from some reason or other, have hitherto abstained. It is now unfeignedly accomplished, and while wishing no harm to the old banking house of Bishop & Co., we wish the new banking house of Spreckels & Co. their share of success.

THE MERCHANT OF VENICE.

Saturday night's performance at the Music Hall was again a pronounced success. There was a crowded house, a good support, and extra musicians, to mention, to enliven the tedium of the waits.

The character of Shylock is so often overacted and overdressed that one connects a storming, gorgeously dressed old Jew with the part. Very different is Mr. Bandmann's conception of Shylock. He is quiet, except when roused by the insult offered him on account of his Jewish belief and his usury, when he becomes very bitter and revengeful and upon that feeling bases the extraction of his extraordinary bond.

Miss Beaudet made an interesting Portia and sustained this part well throughout. The support was better than hitherto and with longer opportunity for active experience there is no telling to what stage of perfection the amateurs might attain. THE new Hawaiian silver coin has been circulated. A GERMAN canary, belonging to Mr. R. W. Laine, has been lost. THE clink of coin was heard through the town yesterday and everybody seemed pleased to get it. MESSRS. G. W. Macfarlane & Co., paid the first of the new coin into the Custom House, the amount being received by Mr. E. R. Hendry. MR. Daniel Lyons is not yet through with the contempt of Court case. He is to appear to-morrow morning at ten o'clock in the Supreme Court. TO-NIGHT is the Library benefit at the Music Hall when Narcisse, Mr. Bandmann's great play, will be performed. The price of admission, to all parts of the house, is a dollar. THE band will serenade Mr. Berger to-day on his departure for the Coast to bring back his family. The bandmaster will only be absent three weeks, and the band continues its concerts as usual during his absence. THE Order of the Crown of Hawaii seems to be the order of the day at Lihue, Kauai. Mr. G. N. Wilcox and Mr. W. H. Rice are the last "whom the King delighteth to honor." Both are Companions. MR. James Dodd went over the route taken by the funeral on Sunday afternoon with his water cart, before the procession started, but unfortunately the effects of his sprinkling were not visible to the mourners. THE funeral of Her late Royal Highness Princess Kekaulike took place Sunday afternoon. The cortege left the late residence of the deceased shortly after two o'clock, minute guns being fired from the battery at the same time. There were nearly five hundred people in the procession, about forty carriages following the horse.

The following gentlemen have been elected officers in the Puna Sheep and Stock Ranch Company: Mr. F. Spencer, President; Mr. G. W. Macfarlane, Vice-President; Mr. H. R. Macfarlane, Treasurer; Mr. J. Robbins, Secretary and Auditor.

J. B. GRANT, of Kapaa, Kauai, was found guilty, last Friday, of assault with a deadly weapon—a helve—and sentenced to one year at hard labor and to pay a fine of one hundred dollars. He pleaded not guilty, and appealed at once to the jury court.

SEVEN good and handsome horses and eighteen mules, arrived at the Consuelo for Messrs. Miles Bros. The mules have already been sold but the horses are now for sale. Besides a handsome pair of black carriage horses there are some good upstanding trotting mares.

THE new bank and the new coin were the prominent topics of conversation yesterday. The coin was circulated from the Treasury and by Spreckels & Co., there being a great demand at both places for it. It is probable that the Government will endeavor to call in all the Mexican, French and Italian dollars now in circulation.

A NEW Hawaiian steamship line, to run between San Francisco, Honolulu and China, is being incorporated. Arrangements will be settled in a few days. The name of the company has not yet been decided upon, but Colonel Spreckels will be one of the prominent partners though the company will be distinct from the Oceanic S. S. Co.

COLONEL Spreckels will probably receive silver certificates from the government, for his new coin, redeeming them by taking the coin which has been made legal tender. Yesterday he deposited a quantity of coin in the treasury and received his own in exchange, which explains "How it came out."

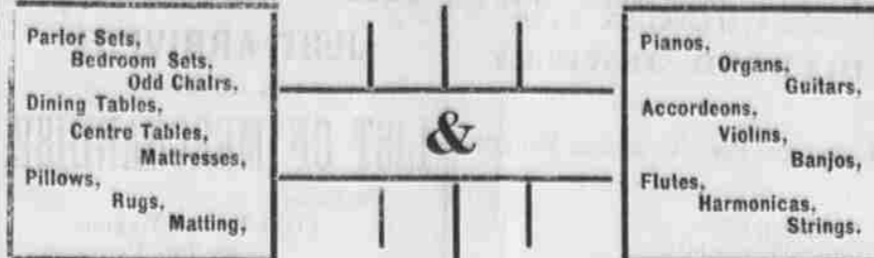
