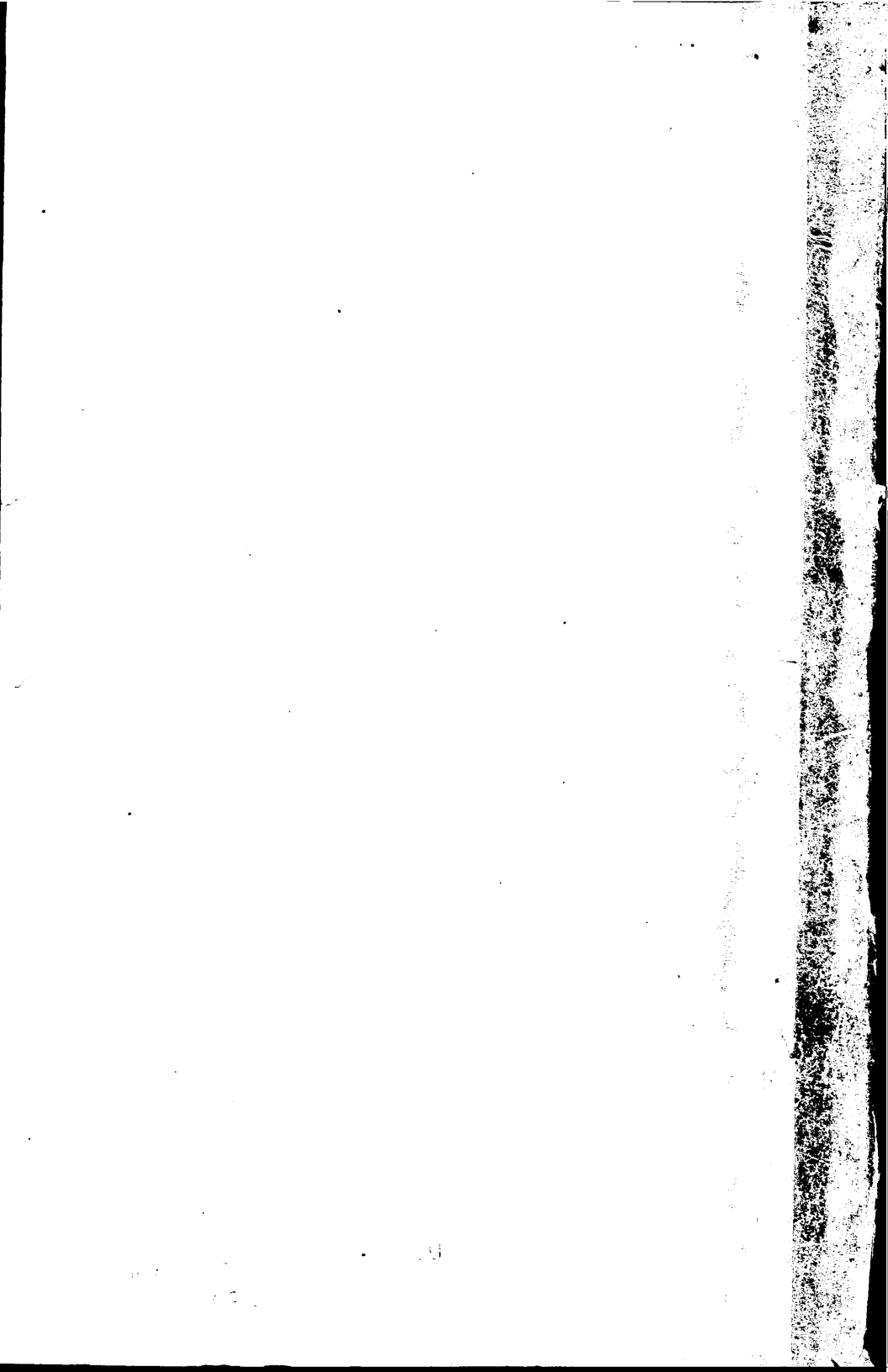

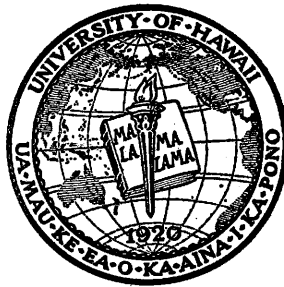

THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII

The University of Hawaii is an integral part of the public educational system of Hawaii, standing in the same relation to the Territory that the state universities bear to their respective states. It is the only institution of collegiate grade in Hawaii. Through financial aid from the Territory and the United States Government, the University of Hawaii is enabled to offer, to all qualified persons who may apply, instruction in many subjects as indicated in subsequent pages.

The University comprises two undergraduate colleges, a Graduate Department, Extension Department and several special institutions such as the Aquarium and Marine Laboratory, the Waiakea Experiment Station, and the Psychological Clinic. The *College of Arts and Sciences* offers cultural and professional courses leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts; the *College of Applied Science* offers instruction in scientific and technical fields leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science; the degrees of Master of Arts and Master of Science are granted for graduate work in accordance with certain prescribed regulations.

RULES OF ADMISSION AND REGISTRATION

1. All candidates for matriculation should first make application to the Committee on Entrance.

Such applications should not be deferred until Registration Day, but should be made at the earliest day possible.

2. Candidates will be admitted as *Regular Students*: (a) by presenting 15 entrance credits; (b) by transfer from another university or college.

3. Candidates who are 21 years of age or over will be admitted as *Special Students* by filing with the Committee on Entrance a statement of the course or courses desired and satisfactory evidence of adequate preparation.

4. A Late Registration Fee of \$1.00 will be required of all students who register later than the announced registration days.

5. Any student withdrawing from the institution without first having obtained either a leave of absence or a certificate of honorable dismissal may be reinstated only upon payment of a Reinstatement Fee of \$5.00.

Application forms will upon request be furnished by the Committee on Entrance.

The College of Applied Science offers the following courses of study leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science, the diploma to designate the course which has been pursued:

1. A course in AGRICULTURE.
2. A course in ENGINEERING.
3. Courses in SUGAR TECHNOLOGY:
 - (a) Agricultural Division, with emphasis on field operations.
 - (b) Chemistry Division, with emphasis on mill practice.
 - (c) Sugar-house Engineering Division, with emphasis on construction and operation of sugar mills.
4. A course in HOME ECONOMICS.
5. A course in GENERAL SCIENCE, including:
 - (a) Physical Sciences,—mathematics, physics, chemistry, and geology.
 - (b) Biological Sciences,—botany, entomology and zoology.

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES**PROGRAMS OF STUDY**

THE PSYCHOLOGICAL CLINIC

A psychological and psychopathic clinic will be organized in January to carry out the provisions of Act 140 of the 1921 Legislature. Dr. S. D. Porteus has been appointed Director and Professor of Clinical Psychology.

The first work of the Clinic will be the mental testing of persons referred to it by the various public institutions and the courts. In addition it is expected that research in certain fields of psychology will be carried on and a limited amount of instruction given to advanced students.

THE WAIKEA EXPERIMENT STATION

The University is establishing an agricultural experiment station at Waiakea, Hilo, Hawaii, as provided by Act 191 of the Session Laws of 1921. A tract of over 90 acres was reserved for the purpose in laying out the Homesteads. Mr. Robert Pahau has been appointed superintendent and the work of the station is already well under way. Although experiments in cane culture will be the primary work of the station, diversified crops and livestock will not be omitted from the program of experimental work.

SENIOR R.O.T.C.

A Senior Reserve Officers' Training Corps unit has been organized in the University of Hawaii by the War Department. All male students of American citizenship in regular standing in the University and physically able are required to enroll. The present enrollment is 128.

DORMITORY FOR MEN

A dormitory for men accommodating twenty-six students and a proctor will be ready for occupancy in December. There are four suites consisting of two bedrooms and a study, each accommodating four men, ten single rooms, a general living room, and lanais. Bookshelves and dressers are built in, and beds will be provided. Other furniture will be supplied by the occupants. Each student must bring a pillow, four single bed sheets, two pillow cases, blankets, and counterpane marked with his name and room number. Occupants of single rooms may, if they prefer, provide a couch cover instead of a white counterpane. The bed linen will be deposited with the caretaker. The room rent includes the laundry of the bed linen and the care of the room. A rental of \$35.00 per semester will be charged, which will be pro rated for the period between the opening of the dormitory and the end of the first semester of 1921-22.

DINING HALL AND CAFETERIA

A dining hall and cafeteria will be completed in December, accommodating both men and women. A monthly rate of \$20.00 will be charged for breakfast and dinner. Lunch is on the cafeteria plan.

THE UNIVERSITY Y.M.C.A.

Important among the new advances being made in the student plans and activities at the University is the preliminary work being done in organizing a Student Association of the Young Men's Christian Association. The University Y.M.C.A. is not yet definitely organized but plans are under way for a formal organization in the near future. Several students have been given employment through the work of the student employment committee. Seven discussion groups of a religious and secular nature have been meeting weekly, with an enrolment of eighty-one students.

Mr. Dwight Rugh, a recent graduate of the University of California, is in charge of this organization, the central purpose of which is to maintain a wholesome Christian atmosphere on the University campus.
