

Kuioka immediately. Bowling starts in February and Softball in March.

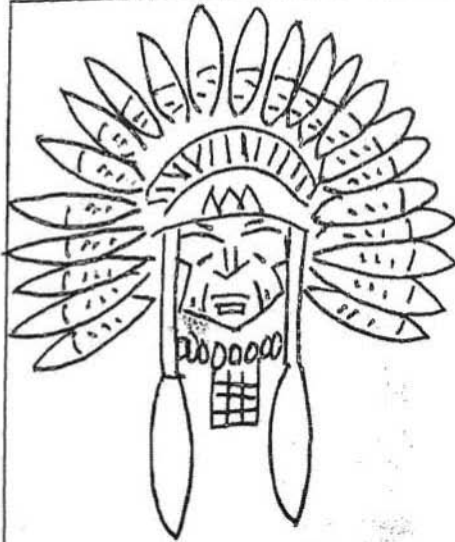
A good start for a wonderful year ahead. Let's be active!

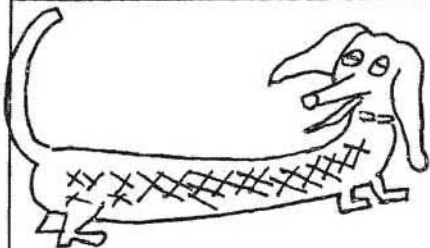
