1. The War Department concurs in your recommendations, with regard to relaxation of passive protection on V-E Day. The following changes are suggested:

a. In paragraph 4a(3) of your 1st indorsement, CIV 381, 9 December 1944, change "Air Corps Installation Security Inspection Responsibility List, which it is understood is now in process of preparation," to read "Army Service Forces and Army Air Forces Installation Security Inspection Responsibility Lists".

b. In paragraph 4f (1), insert "and the Installation Security Inspection Responsibility Lists" after "Master Inspection Responsibility List".

2. With respect to paragraph 4g of 1st indorsement, noted in paragraph one (1) above, attention is invited to War Department Circular No. 418, 25 October 1944, which gives Defense Commanders authority to relax restrictions on civilian flying within air defense areas to greater degree than is permitted under General Order No. 7, Eastern Defense Command, 7 October 1944.

3. The recommended actions of your command, and the proposed proclamation will be put into effect immediately upon appropriate announcement of V-E Day by the War Department.
