Dear Sir:

This is being written in the interest of my brother,
Pfc. Roy Satow (37702608), Company B, 442 Combat Team, Camp
Shelby, Mississippi.

Roy was one of the first volunteers for the Combat
Unit last year from the Granada Relocation Center and was in-
ducted in July. Just about six weeks ago, as preparations
were being made for the 442nd to go overseas, he developed a
bad leg, was hospitalized, transferred from Company E to B,
and put on light duty. In the meantime, the 442nd left, and
he was terribly disappointed in being left behind.

He now feels very much frustrated in being relegated
to light duty since he had volunteered to get into the war.
He thinks with his limited physical capacity, he could make
his best contribution by transferring to the Military Intel-
ligence School at Camp Savage, Minnesota. Capt. Paul Rush, Jr.,
Director of Personnel at Camp Savage, has written him to the
effect that Savage would request for his transfer as soon as
he obtained a release. Accordingly, Roy has executed Army
circular 164. His Commanding Officer has okayed his release,
but it was disapproved by the Lieut. Colonel whom I understand
made some disparaging remarks about the Camp Savage School.

Is there any way by which my brother can get to Camp
Savage under the present circumstances? I understand that the
Battalion left behind of the 442nd is to act as cadre for the
Nisei newly being inducted. Certainly with his intense desire
to get to Camp Savage and get into the struggle where he can do
the most good being frustrated will not be too great a help
in the total situation.

I would appreciate getting your advice so that I can
counsel him properly.
