On Wednesday the 19th inst., Mr. Celso Cesar Moreno, the Special Agent of the China Merchants' Steam Navigation Company was presented to His Majesty by His Excellency the Minister of Foreign Affairs, who received him cordially, and recognized him as an old acquaintance. Mr. Moreno stated to His Majesty the object of his visit to this Kingdom, and that he was the bearer of a few presents from the company he represented to His Majesty and His Excellency Gov. Dominis. Mr. Moreno concluded by inviting His Majesty to visit the steamship *Hochung*, sailing under the Chinese flag, which invitation was graciously accepted, and the following morning the 20th inst., at half past nine o'clock designated as the time. On Thursday morning at the appointed hour His Majesty and suite, consisting of the Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Col. great depot of wheat and flour on hand. The Pacific Mail steamer cannot perform this service for want of proper stations in the north of China. The Pacific Mail and O. & O. steamers go to Hongkong in the south, and have no business at Shanghai.
We find the foregoing in the San Francisco "Bulletin" of the 29th ult., to which we desire to call the especial attention of our people. It is noteworthy from the article referred to, that the Chinese have at last awakened to the importance of extending their commercial relations with the outside world. To this end, as incidentally remarked in our issue of last week, a new impetus has been given to the movement by the establishment of a steamship trade direct between China and these Islands. We say establishment, because we have had not only the rumor but the fact, demonstrated by the presence of the pioneer steamship of the line in our harbor last week, the *Hochung* from Waipoua, with 451 Chinese passengers for these Islands. It may be well to observe just here that the 451 passengers mentioned above are not all common laborers. They consist of mechanics embracing almost all branches of business, nor are they of the class who come as paupers, but all paid their passage. It will also be observed from the article we have quoted that the China Merchants' Steamship Navigation Company is an organization composed of wealthy merchants resident in China, who have carefully calculated all the contingencies of the new undertaking, that in the establishment of a steamship line for direct trade between China and these Islands, with the ultimate purpose of extending the line to San Francisco.

From the extract of a letter of C. C. Moreno, Esq., the accredited agent of the China Merchants' Steamship Navigation Company, it appears that the company he represents, which is a private corporation, composed of wealthy Chinese residents of the Empire of China, whose Board of Directors have carefully examined all the facts connected with the enterprise of establishing direct trade between China and this Kingdom in the first instance, and as an assurance of their faith in the project, have sent the avant courier of their new line, in the shape of the *Hochung* to this port with a passenger list of 451 Chinese. This being the true state of the case, it is evident that the steamship company has fully matured its plans after due deliberation. The stockholders are men of immense wealth, and are shrewd, experienced business men, who see in the establishment of direct trade between Honolulu and China a fair business venture, and have determined to test their judgment by the stern logic of facts. This new line of steamers is no ad captandum affair but an accomplished fact, the best proof of which is found in sending the *Hochung* as the pioneer ship of the new line.

Direct trade between China and these Islands will be a direct and positive benefit to this Kingdom in a thousand and one different ways, and therefore, we rejoice at the prospect of such a commercial as well as sensible arrangement, because we desire to see the business prospects of these Islands enhanced. We earnestly trust therefore, that sound wisdom may guide the councils of His Majesty in the negotiations with Mr. Moreno, the special agent of the steamship company, in the arrangement of the most feasible plan to secure direct trade with China and this Kingdom, and the proper regulation of Chinese emigration to these Islands. This is not the time to suffer narrow views of state policy to control the action of Government, but rather the hour when liberal and enlightened principles of statecraft should govern those whose duty it is to guard the interests of this little Kingdom. It should be in mind that the establishment of direct trade with any foreign nation will be a vast benefit to the revenues of this Kingdom, and therefore every possible facility should be granted by this country to induce such direct trade. As Mr. Moreno is the only and authorized agent of the company proposing to establish this direct trade, we trust that His Majesty and advisers will act in a liberal spirit towards him, and that his mission may prove a success, because upon such a result depends in a great measure the future prosperity of these Islands. The establishment of a direct line of steamers between China and Honolulu and its ultimate extension to San Francisco, will be a benefit to our people in a double ratio, because it will bring down to a minimum both freight and passenger charges between Honolulu and San Francisco, besides it will open up a market for all that can be produced on these fertile Islands and thus insure prosperity.
