to easing the curfew, both by way of exemption or otherwise. As it now stands, I am told that the curfew is very demoralizing.

5. On the East Coast.

a. The Attorney General is very anxious to have Mr. Ennis go to New York for a conference with General Drum's staff. This has been conveyed to General Drum.

b. We are awaiting from General Drum specific suggestions regarding prospective measures.

6. The memorandum of understanding between the Secretary of War and the Attorney General provides in effect for consultation with local U. S. Attorneys before action on individual exclusions. When this agreement is signed General DeWitt should be advised of the precise terms of this particular part of the agreement. In fact, it would be well if a directive were addressed to all the commands, advising them of such of the terms of this memorandum as would affect them, such as clearing all orders, as well as public proclamations, publicity, etc.

7. We are to receive from Colonel Bendetsen a copy of Civilian Restriction Order No. 1. We do not seem to know just what this covers. If this should be something that should have been cleared with the Department of Justice under our agreement which covers all orders to civilians, it would be well to point this out to Colonel Bendetsen for future guidance.
