SATURDAY'S PARADE.

History of the Hawaiian Islands Symbolized.]

The Barbaric Past Exhibited Side by Side With Modern Civilization.

For a few hours in the forenoon of Saturday last rain was suspended. The sun shone out gloriously and shed the radiance of his countenance upon a scene which led the majority of the population of Honolulu to don their holiday attire.

When the pageant entered the Palace grounds His Majesty was seated on the front veranda, and opposite to this a sham fight took place between the spearmen, each hand being led by a Chief.

carrying a banner, with a flower girl on either side; His Excellency the Hon. Antonio Rosa and Major J. T. Baker, each carrying a tabu stick; H. B. H. the Princess Poemakalani, Mrs. Abigail Maikai, Her Majesty the Queen, attended by His Excellency Governor R. H. Baker and Mr. George C. Peckley respectively on either side; Mrs. Hoapili Kaula, who was the bearer of a large kahili; His Excellency the Hon. Paul P. Kanoa and their Royal Highnesses Princes David, Jonah and Edward. In this order the society was conducted into the throne room, where His Majesty the King awaited its approach.

Whilst the foregoing ceremony was in progress, the historical procession was in course of formation. The point of rendezvous was the further end of King street in the vicinity of its junction with Nuuanu street. The Hon. J. A. Cummins, Marshal of the Day, was early astrid directing the operations, mounted upon the gray charger which has become a familiar feature during the last few days.

The procession was headed by the Royal Hawaiian Military Band, under Bandmaster Berger, wearing their newly-acquired dark uniforms; and the Royal School in their military garb. Of the symbolical personages, the first were two Pukuanas on foot, in the gorgeous capes and headgear which it was the custom to wear in the early days. The characters were taken by Keaweahu and Kamaeomoku, who were attended by nine youths intended to represent the li, and seven Kukini (runners or messengers) of the time of Kamehameha I.

The canoe of Kamehameha I. Next came the Pelelu, a large double canoe of the same period with its twelve rowers, mounted on wheels and attended on foot by two kahili bearers and fourteen warriors or spearmen; the double canoe Keawentiaume, likewise with twelve rowers and similar emblems of royalty; the single canoe Kanauli, of the King of Kauai, with three paddles; a single canoe with two old men, Pakaa and Kaupakaa, the fishing canoe Malau-hi-aku of Kamehameha I., with four rowers and two fishermen, who went through a series of evolutions representing the throwing of bait and catching of fish; the Royal canoe of Kamehameha I., with five rowers clothed in the brilliant feather cloaks and headgear of the period.

An interesting feature which followed was a couple of fishing canoes with the magic sticks or wands of olden times called Makalei, which were supposed to attract the fish. These canoes had ten rowers, and were fitted with the nets of the period. The canoe of Kawelo and Makuahike was similarly equipped and had eight rowers. At the side of the car which bore this craft was a model of the fish uhu makaikai. The canoe of Maui, with five rowers, completed this section, and had to one side a model of the fish pima. The two latter were attended by living representations of mermaids.

The next car carried the hula o healani, or Queen's dancing girls, who performed the native step dance to the tune of the ancient instruments of music. Modern aquatic pursuits were next symbolized with a barge manned by Reformatory School boys, a racing gig and a whale boat, attached to which latter was a whale of goodly proportions, from whose head there spouted at intervals a jet of water. The Reformatory School band brought up the rear.

The procession, thus formed, slowly made its way along King street, stopping occasionally to afford a good view to the public, whose numbers increased at every step until the Richard street corner was reached. From there to the Palace gate the crowd was very dense, the people frequently manifesting delight at what was passing.

LATEST NEWS.

The R. M. S. S. Australia, which arrived yesterday, brought no later European news, but subjoined a summary of principal events in the Colonies.

The Great Barrier Tragedy.

The capture in New South Wales of the two men and the woman alleged to have been identified with the Great Barrier murder, was reported by the previous mail. News is now to hand of their arrival in Auckland, whither they were conveyed by the steamer Waihora. Caffrey appeared subdued, but Penn stepped jauntily on to the wharf with an air of bravado which had characterized his demeanor in Sydney. Caffrey has made a statement describing the voyage in the cutter. The first attempt was to reach the coast of South America, but failing this an endeavor was made to make for Tasmania. No land was sighted after leaving New Zealand until reaching the Australian coast three months later.

Miscellaneous. The New Zealand 4 per cent loan of £1,567,800 has been floated in London, the price at which the money was offered being £97 5s. The whole amount offered was £2,000,000.

A movement has been set on foot in New Zealand to encourage the immigration of discharged officers and soldiers and civil servants from India, and is expected to cause a constant stream of settlers.

The trial of Thomas Hall and Margaret Graham Houston, for attempting to murder the wife of Hall, commenced at Timaru on October 11th. The trial concluded on October 19th, and resulted in the conviction of Hall and in the acquittal of Miss Houston, whom the jury declared to leave the box without a stain upon her character. Ever since the apprehension of Hall on the charge of attempting to murder his wife, rumors have been circulated that Captain Cain (Mrs. Hall's father) had died by poison. The death took place last January. Some short time since the remains were exhumed, and certain portions subjected to chemical examination. It appears that antimony was found in large quantities. An inquest is now being held, and it is thought that Hall will be arraigned on the charge of murder.

The new Governor at Fiji, Sir Charles Mitchell, has been appointed Consul-General for the Pacific.

The leading Australian timber exporters are New Zealand and Western Australia, who last year exported £152,000 and £104,000 respectively, New South Wales coming next with £100,000.

It is stated that there are 1,800 ironworkers out of employment in New South Wales at the present moment. The amount paid in wages is £187,000 less than if the men were at work. The depression is the severest that has been known in that colony for the past 25 years, and it has been generally increasing during the past two or three years.

The London "Times" states that a wholly fictitious value has been placed on many of the Queensland mines, in order to influence the market. Owing to the warning issued by the Government, the premium of several of the mining companies have declined a quarter per cent.

The Stark Purchase Commissioners have drawn up and posted to Wellington their report on the recent inquiry. It is understood that they failed to discover any traces of conspiracy in the purchase of the site, and exonerate the Government from any blame in the matter.

Two violent shocks of earthquake were felt at Taupo, in the neighborhood of Rotomahana, on October 30th.

Sir John Hall has written a private letter in which he states that it is unlikely he will ever again enter the field of New Zealand politics. The cause is the ill-advised action of hungry news-mongers in "advertising" the notorious Thomas Hall's family connection with Sir John.

The Church of England Synod in Sydney have agreed to the proposal that the Primate of Australia be created an Archbishop.

A Grey-mouth telegram states that the Union steamship Marowhera has gone ashore at North Beach.

Sir James Martin, Chief Justice of New South Wales, died November 14th, after a brief illness, which had been brought on by overwork.

A large increase of insolvencies is reported from Dunedin.

The Warden at Teetupa, South Australia, has reported that there are many indications of the Waukaringa gold fields being permanent.

It is rumored here that Sir John Pope Hennessy, the Governor of the Mauritius, will be appointed to succeed Sir George Strachan as Governor of Tasmania.

The Wairarapa "Star" talks about the disappointed, rat-eating, mosquito-bitten, sun-dried diggers of Kimberley.

Miss O'Gorman, known as "the escaped nun," is on a lecturing tour through New South Wales. The outcome of her lectures in some parts of that colony has been a series of riots between Catholics and Orangemen.

A hundred of the unemployed in Sydney are being supplied daily with rations by the Government. Numbers are being drafted to the country districts.

BY AUTHORITY.



AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND REGULATE SPECIAL PARTNERSHIPS.

Be it Enacted by the King and the Legislative Assembly of the Hawaiian Islands in the Legislature of the Kingdom Assembled:

ARTICLE I—FORMATION OF PARTNERSHIP.

SECTION 1. A partnership may be formed between two or more persons for the transaction of any lawful business. A special partnership may be formed between one or more persons, called general partners, and one or more persons called special partners, for the transaction of any business.

SECTION 2. Persons desirous of forming a special partnership must severally sign a certificate stating:

- First—The name under which the partnership is to be conducted. Second—The general nature of the business intended to be transacted, and the place or places where such business is to be transacted; giving, if possible, the street and number on the street. Third—The names of all the partners and the residence of each; specifying which are general and which are special partners. Fourth—The amount of capital which each special partner has contributed to the common stock. Fifth—The periods at which such partnership will begin and end.

SECTION 3. Certificates under the last section must be acknowledged by all the partners before some officer authorized to take acknowledgments of deeds, and filed in the office of the Minister of the Interior, who shall preserve the same and keep a record of the same, which shall be duly indexed. Such certificate, record and index shall, during all business hours, be open to the inspection of the public free of charge. A fee of fifty cents shall be charged for each name signed to any such certificate. If any false statement is made in any such certificate, all the persons interested in the partnership shall be liable, as general partners, for all the liabilities thereof.

SECTION 4. An affidavit of each of the partners, stating that the sums specified on the certificate of the partnership as having been contributed by each of the special partners, have been actually paid in the lawful money of the Kingdom, must be filed with the certificate above mentioned.

SECTION 5. No special partnership is formed until the provisions of the last four Sections are complied with.

SECTION 6. The certificate mentioned in this article, or a statement of its substance, except the amount of capital contributed by any special partner, must be published in at least two newspapers printed in the English language, in Honolulu, once a week, for four successive weeks, beginning within one week from the time of filing the certificate. In case such publication is not so made the partnership must be deemed general.

SECTION 7. An affidavit of the making of the publication mentioned in the preceding section, made by the printer or publisher of the newspaper in which such publication is made, may be filed with the original certificate above mentioned, and shall be prima facie evidence of the facts therein stated.

ARTICLE II—POWERS, RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF THE PARTNERS.

SECTION 8. The general partners only shall have authority to transact the business of a special partnership.

SECTION 9. A special partner may at all times investigate the partnership affairs and advise his partners or their agents as to their management.

SECTION 10. A special partner may lend money to the partnership or advance money for, or to it, and take from it security therefor; and as to such secured loans or advances has the same rights as any other creditor, but in case of the insolvency of the partnership all other claim which he may have against it must be postponed until all other creditors are satisfied.

SECTION 11. In all matters relating to a special partnership its general partners may sue and be sued alone, in the same manner as if there were no special partners.

SECTION 12. No special partner, under any pretence, may withdraw any part of the capital invested by him in the partnership during its continuance.

SECTION 13. A special partner may receive such lawful interest and such proportion of profits as may be agreed upon, if not paid out of the capital invested in the partnership by him or some other special partner, and is not bound to refund the same to meet subsequent losses.

SECTION 14. If a special partner withdraws capital from the firm, contrary to the provisions of this Article, he thereby becomes a general partner.

ARTICLE III—LIABILITY OF PARTNERS.

SECTION 15. The general partners in a special partnership are liable, to the same extent, as partners in a general partnership.

SECTION 16. The contribution of a special partner to the capital of the firm, and the increase thereof, is liable for its debts; but he is not otherwise liable therefor, except as follows:

- (1) If he has wilfully made or permitted a false or mate-

rially defective statement in the certificate of the partnership, the affidavit filed therewith, or the published announcement thereof, he is liable as a general partner to all creditors of the firm; or,

(2) If he has wilfully interfered with the business of the firm, except as permitted hereinabove, he is liable in like manner; or,

(3) If he has wilfully joined in or assented to an act contrary to any of the provisions of Article II of this Act, he is liable in like manner.

SECTION 17. When a special partner has, unintentionally, done any of the acts mentioned in the last section, he is liable, as a general partner, to any creditor of the firm who has been actually misled thereby to his prejudice.

ARTICLE IV—ALTERATION AND DISSOLUTION.

SECTION 18. A special partnership becomes general if, within ten days after any partner withdraws from it, or any partner is received into it, or a change is made in the nature of its business or in its name, a certificate of such fact, duly verified and signed by one or more of the partners, is not filed with the Minister of the Interior and notice thereof published, as is provided in Article I of this Chapter for the publication of the certificate.

SECTION 19. New special partners may be admitted into a special partnership upon a certificate and affidavit being filed and recorded according to the provisions of Article I of this Act.

SECTION 20. A special partnership is subject to dissolution in the same manner as a general partnership, except that no dissolution, by the act of the partners, is complete until a notice thereof has been filed and recorded in the office of the Minister of the Interior and published, at least once in each week, for four successive weeks in at least two newspapers printed in Honolulu in the English language.

SECTION 20. The name of a special partner must not be used in the firm name of the partnership, unless it be accompanied with the word "limited."
