SHIPPING NOTES.

Schr Gen. Seigel bro't 852 bgs paddy. The Shannon has returned to Wilder's wharf and the Canopus to the mall wharf. The Emerald is discharging at the Esplanade. The s.s. Mariposa Captain H. Z. Howard, arrived yesterday. 5 days and 20 1/2 hrs from San Francisco, with 2 horses, 1 cow, 1 buggy, 1 rockaway, 885 sks of oats, 784 sks of barley, 930 sks of flour, etc. Schr Julia took 12 bgs of sugar. The H. W. Almy sailed yesterday, for San Francisco. She took 3185 bgs of sugar, 2630 bgs of rice, 782 bgs of paddy, 33 cs of boots, and 22 pkgs of household goods; total domestic value \$38,772.50.

LOCAL & GENERAL NEWS.

There were great disturbances in town last night. Men's Velling, at reduced prices, at Chas. J. Fisher's. Fine French Kid Shoes, every pair guaranteed, at Chas. J. Fisher's. Twenty Button Kid Gloves, at Chas. J. Fisher's. Strong rumors of a total change in the Cabinet were heard yesterday. The finest assortment of leather and fine trunks at Chas. J. Fisher's. Last night between 11 and 12 o'clock no less than five foreigners were locked up, while under the influence of liquor. The sale of the Windsor Restaurant, advertised to take place today by Mr. E. P. Adams, is postponed till further notice. Mr. H. Nolte, of the Beaver Coffee Saloon, very generously treated the boys of the Industrial School Band to cold drinks, yesterday. Three Ex. W. M. Gibson, and J. M. Kapena were on the wharf yesterday awaiting the arrival of the Mariposa. They looked as if their doom had already been sealed.

The slowest day's run made by the Mariposa on this first trip was 959 miles, and the fastest 877. This is very close to 15 knots an hour all the time. The walls of the Anglican Cathedral are rising slowly. They are now about 4 feet above ground. At this rate it will take years to finish the noble structure.

On Monday work was commenced on the new Library and Reading Room building opposite the Y. M. C. A. Hall in real earnest. We hope it will progress rapidly in the good hands of Mr. E. B. Thomas.

LATE FOREIGN NEWS.

The Union Telegraph operators are on strike.—At the return of an excursion party on the Patapsco, Baltimore, July 24th, a little wharf gave way on which the excursionists were standing. About 70, mostly women and children, were drowned.—A Swedish Monitor, the Thordoen, foundered near Norrkoping. Crew saved.—700 deaths a day from cholera in Egypt.—Captain Webb the famous English swimmer tried to swim across the whirlpool rapids above Niagara falls on July 24th. He nearly accomplished the feat, but was engulfed in the whirlpool. His body has not been found. He leaves a wife, and 2 children. Tom Thumb is dead.—A fire in a anthracite furnace.

No., exploded; 2 killed, many hurt.—The Cholera is spreading throughout Egypt and causing a panic.—Stanley takes a ten months' journey across Africa. By alliances with native chiefs he has prevented De Brazza's schemes.—The Madagascar Government has notified foreigners of its inability to protect them.—At a mill hand picnic at Cleveland a riot occurred. 50 persons badly injured.—A boiler explosion occurred at Glens Falls, N. Y., 12 persons wounded some fatally.—Fire in Portland July 27th—damage \$100,000.

Melbourne, July 14.—A telegram has been received announcing the arrival of the steamship Austral, all well, at Rio de Janeiro on the 12th instant. She put in to replenish her supply of coals. Unfavourable weather was experienced on the passage.

Quarantine has been established here for vessels from Fiji, in consequence of a report that smallpox, cholera, and measles are prevalent there.

The Argus has despatched Mr. Julian Thomas ("The Yagabond") to report on the New Hebrides.

London, July 15.—French despatches from Tamatave, dated 6th July, are entirely silent as to the reported insults to the British authorities and officers of the Dryad. Two night attacks have been made by the Hovas, who have been repulsed with serious loss.

London, July 16.—M. de Lesseps threatens that unless some decision is come to with respect to the second canal across the Isthmus of Suez, he will appeal to the French to resist further concessions.
