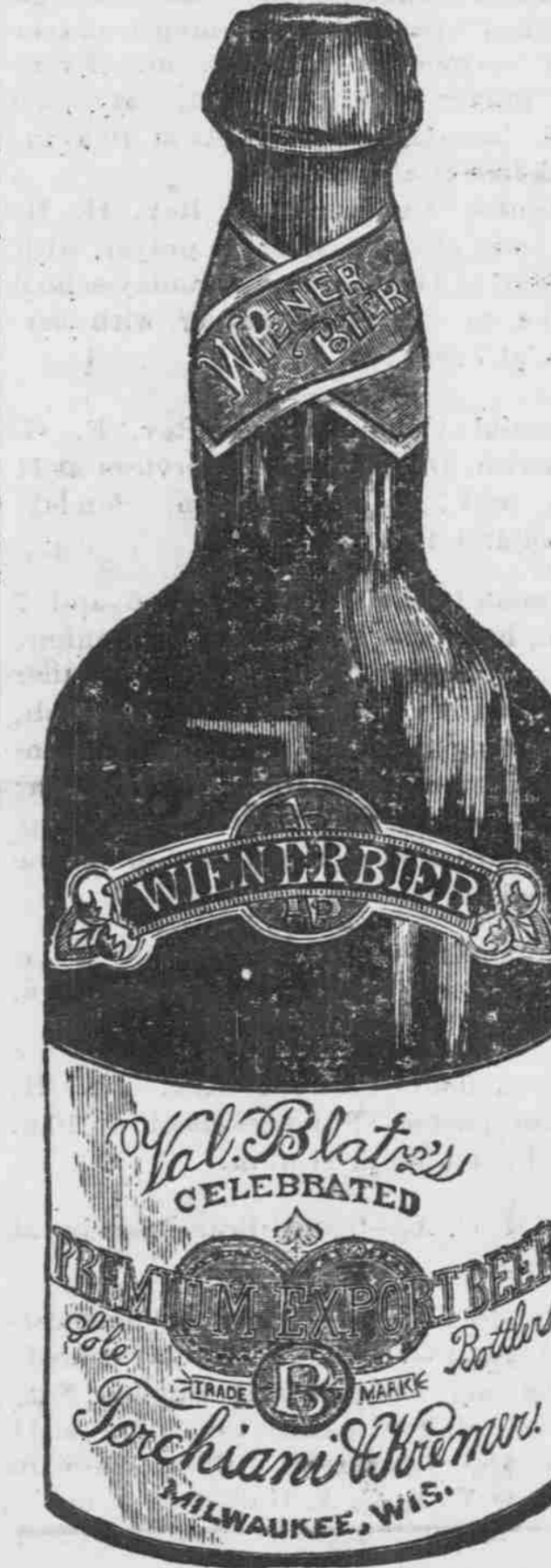

SEVEN THOUSAND COPIES.

The edition of the "Paradise of the Pacific" to be printed to-day for sending abroad will consist of seven thousand copies. It is necessary that it should be well known abroad that the quarantine has been raised and that the Hawaiian Islands are the most delightful spot on the earth for tourists to visit.

THE PACIFIC CABLE.

On March 24th Admiral Fairfax was asked at Sydney what steps were to be taken with regard to the survey of the Pacific cable route. He replied as follows: "You will see from the cablegrams that the surveying ship Egeria, Captain Aldrich, has arrived at Hobart. She is one of the largest surveying ships in our service, and specially fitted for this duty. It is probable that she will come to New Zealand next month, in order to commence surveying the cable route. She will commence from New Zealand to Tonga, Sandwich Islands, to Vancouver. A belt 200 miles wide will be examined, the various reported dangers by navigators investigated, and those found to have no existence erased from the charts. The task will occupy three years. The harbor of Tonga will be examined, on account of the desirability of having a coaling station there, and also that hitherto it has not been deemed prudent to take H. B. S. Nelson there till the place is thoroughly surveyed."

A SENSATIONAL STATEMENT.

Quite a sensation was caused in the impure lard investigation before the House Agricultural Committee at Washington on March 24th. W. G. Bartle, an ex-pork-packer of St. Louis, was on the stand, and stated that he had been in the pork-packing business for forty years, and knew that cholera-infected hogs were cut up and put upon the market as good meat. It was done in his business, and it was the custom among other packers to slaughter hogs from herds where they were dying by the hundreds from cholera, and to sell infected meat in the market. The custom, he claimed, was quite general, and packers could not deny it. He said he had gone out of the business because he considered it dishonest and a crime.

SUGAR FOR NEW YORK.

The American Refinery to Ship at Least 20,000 Tons Raw There.

[S. F. Post, March 21st.]

Preparations are being made by the American Sugar Refinery Company to ship about 20,000 tons raw sugar to New York, by way of Cape Horn. The Directors have concluded that their surplus this year will be full this much, even if the refinery is to run its full capacity. Purchasers are readily obtainable among the refiners in the New York Trust, so that no losses are anticipated. The American Company succeeded this year in capturing two-thirds of the Hawaiian crop. Its agents in the islands bought sugar right and left, the intention being to shut Claus Spreckels out by preventing him from buying any of the product of the outside plantations. The company was remarkably successful in fulfilling the first step of this ambitious design. Every ton of sugar produced this year, except on the plantations of Spreckels' and the various com-

panies he controls, is in the possession of the American Company. Spreckels only has 40,000 tons of sugar coming to him, while his competitors have 80,000 tons.

The second part of the plan to prevent the California Company from getting all the sugar required was not as successful. Spreckels bought enough in the Philippines and Central America to supply any deficiency, and the American Company found it had more sugar on hand than could be refined.

General W. H. Dimond, in speaking of the situation this morning, said: "The American Company has simply bought more sugar than it can refine. Last year the refinery turned out about 60,000 tons of sugar, running its full capacity. It will run at full capacity this year, no doubt, but certainly have a surplus. That is why shipments are and will be made to New York."

The firm of Williams, Dimond & Co. have chartered the ship Ivy to bring sugar from Honolulu hither. The Ivy can carry 1,600 to 1,700 tons. She is a small vessel, comparatively, and, as Williams, Dimond & Co. handle American Refinery sugar, there was some inquiry why the shipment was not made direct from Honolulu to New York, avoiding transshipment. The reason is that the contracts call for the delivery of the raw sugar in San Francisco, and it is here that the analysis and prices are made. Moreover, it costs no more to take sugar in the roundabout way than direct. Ship brokers would ask at least \$7 a ton for transporting sugar direct, and the rates are \$3 a ton from Honolulu hither and \$4 from here to New York.

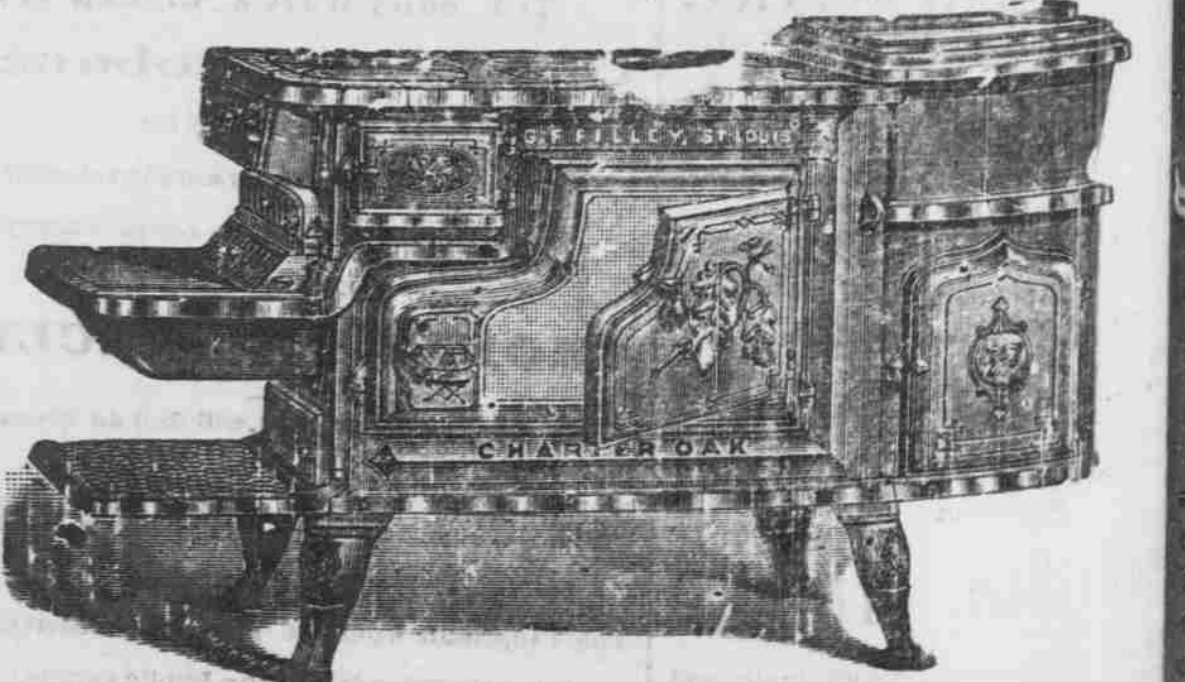

The storm was felt most severely at Haabai, in the Tongan group, where several small vessels were driven ashore, and ten lives lost. At Apia one of Messrs. McArthur & Co.'s schooners, the Tafua, was driven ashore and would, it was expected, become a total wreck.

The German warships Olga and Adler were lying in the port of Apia when the storm set in, and both vessels got up steam and prepared for sea in case of emergency. As it happened, they were enabled to ride out the storm at the anchorage.

R. M. S. Zealandia. The Oceanic Company's Royal Mail steamer Zealandia arrived last evening from the Colonies. She left Sydney March 21st, and arrived at Auckland on the 25th, experiencing fine weather, with easterly winds, during the trip.

Left Auckland on the 26th, and touched off Tutuila on the 30th. THE ART OF MASSAGE.

Its Early History—Several Kinds of Manipulations—Now Practiced. The art of massage is of great antiquity. There are always some kind folk who will take the time and trouble to search deep down into the annals of the past...

I have spoken of massage as a mechanical mode of treatment—and so it is; but those who undertake to perform it ought to have some head knowledge concerning their work as well as finger dexterity.
