The mission of the **Network of the National Library of Medicine (NNLM)** is to advance the progress of medicine and improve the public health by providing all U.S. health professionals with equal access to biomedical information and improving the public's access to information to enable them to make informed decisions about their health. The Program is coordinated by the National Library of Medicine and carried out through a nationwide network of health science libraries and information centers.

A bit of history

The National Network of Libraries of Medicine (NNLM), established as the Regional Medical Library Program in 1965.

The network grew with additional regional medical libraries designated. The participation of the U.S. Affiliated Pacific was added and serviced by the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) Biomedical Library.

The 1990s saw an increase in demand for quality consumer health information. The introduction of the internet also provided new opportunities for Interaction and communication
NNLM and NLM responded to this challenge in dynamic ways.

IN 2018 NLM reevaluated the network, restructuring and rebranding it. New regional affiliations and a new name – but same NNLM.

- Membership is *free* but there are some requirements to participate. Each NNLM member institution must agree to make these basic contributions:
- To designate an individual as the local contact person (the "NNLM Liaison") for network information/communications.
- Be listed in the public [NNLM Membership Directory](#). Once the membership application has been processed, new organizations will be added to the directory.
- To keep their institution record up-to-date by reviewing it annually and whenever organization changes occur.
- Membership is institutional, and each Member organization will have liaison(s) listed. Liaisons' contact information will be visible in the Membership Directory and will receive emails and other communications from NNLM. Any staff can create free user accounts to access training and receive information from the Network.

Full or Associate Membership

The main difference between Full membership in NNLM and Associate membership is the interlibrary is available to Full members.

Full members are expected to loan (basically scan or PDFs of articles),

Unless there is a reciprocal agreement, the usual charge is \$12.00 and higher (can be to \$30.00)
