Sir—In conformity with the requirements of the Civil Code, I have the honor to submit to your Excellency my Annual Report of the business of this Bureau of your Excellency's Department, with the Statistical Tables for the year 1880 in the following order, viz:

- No. 1.—Imports free by Treaty, duty paid, bonded and free by law, at all the ports of the Kingdom.
- No. 2.—Value of all imports, showing country from which imported.
- No. 3.—Cargoes valued above \$10,000.
- No. 4.—Domestic and Foreign Exports.
- No. 5.—Domestic Exports, showing country to which exported.
- No. 6.—Merchant and Whaling vessels.
- No. 7.—Spirits, wines and beer drawn for consumption.
- No. 8.—Customs Receipts.
- No. 9.—National vessels.
- No. 10.—Passenger Statistics.
- No. 11.—Hawaiian registered vessels.
- No. 12.—Arrivals and departures of merchant vessels, where from and where to.

Also, the Statistics of duty paying, free by Treaty, bonded, and free by law goods, and spirits, showing values and quantities in detail.

Table No. 1.—Shows the value of all goods and spirits imported, showing \$69,709 less in value than in 1879.

Table No. 2.—Shows the Countries from which the Imports are drawn, showing an increase of \$206,202 57 in free by Treaty Imports, and a decrease in duty paying Imports.

Table No. 3.—Shows the cargoes valued over \$10,000, the Port from which they arrived, the vessel bringing them, and the value of each cargo.

Table No. 4.—Shows an increase in most of our principal Exports, and an increase of \$186,725 90 in value.

Table No. 5.—Shows the Country to which the Domestic Exports have been shipped, with the quantity of each.

Table No. 6.—Shows the number of Steamers, Merchant and Whaling vessels, that have visited this Port during the year and their nationality. There were 14 vessels, with 10,148 tons less than last year.

Table No. 7.—Shows the spirits, wines and beer drawn for consumption, showing 14,477 gallons more of wines and spirits, and 6,120 doz and 3,527 gallons of beer less.

Table No. 8.—Shows the Customs Receipts for the year, showing an increase of \$42,510 58.

Table No. 9.—Shows the different national vessels that have visited this Port during the year.

Table No. 10.—Shows that a total of 5,593 passengers have arrived, and 1,928 have left this Port during the year. Also that 1,899 have called on their way to and from New Zealand and Australia.

Table No. 11.—Is a list of 31 Hawaiian registered vessels, showing sailing foreign, 3 steamers and 42 sail vessels engaged in coasting, with a total tonnage of 10,148 90-95, a small increase over last year. Four coasting schooners were lost during the year.

Table No. 12.—Is an exhibit of all Steamers and Merchant vessels, that have arrived at, and departed from this Port for the year, showing the flag, and country from which arriving, and to which departing.

The total value of Exports is \$4,908,444 87.

The total value of Imports is \$3,678,208 41. Showing an excess in value of Exports of \$1,230,236 46.

This excess of Exports will most probably be considerably increased in 1881.

The business of this Bureau shows some increase over the previous year.
