The War Department has informed you of Toshio's death. I want to express my sympathy for you and all his loved ones in your hour of sorrow.

I had your brother's body removed from where he fell in battle to an American cemetery where he was given a decent burial. Later on the Quartermaster, General, Washington, D. C., will give you the location of his grave. Also, later on his personal things will come through army channels.

As you and I enjoy peace and liberty when war is past, we will remember the brave men like your brother who died for these ideals.

May our Heavenly Father comfort you by His presence in these hours of grief.
