UNITED NATIONS DAY MESSAGE TO T.T.

(From the President of the Trusteeship Council Mr. Francis Brown, United Kingdom for U.N. DAY, October 24)

"Today is the twenty-first anniversary of the founding of the United Nations, and it is customary on each of these yearly United Nation Days for the President of the Trusteeship Council, on behalf of the Council as a whole, to send a message to all the peoples and governments of the Trust Territories, to bring to them all the warmest greetings of the Council, and to wish them well in their future development. That is why I am addressing you today, as this year's President of the Council.

"The Trusteeship Council has now been at work for 19 years, furthering the objectives of the International Trusteeship System as set out in Chapters XII and XIII of the United Nations Charter -- that is to say: to further international peace and security; to promote the advancement of the inhabitants of the Trust Territories, and their progressive development towards self-government or independence; and to encourage respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms. That has been, and is, the Council's task.

"Only three, of the original eleven, Trust Territories now remain in the care of the Council and of the Administering Authorities. It is to the peoples and governments of those three remaining territories - Micronesia, New Guinea and Nauru - that I send the Council's good wishes. Let me assure you all that, in our Session this year, as always, the Council has sought to consider your development and your problems and your future, with all the care and interest that has been shown in the past. We have been helped by special representative;

from Australia and the United States, and by members of the Congress of Micronesia, the House of Assembly of Papua and New Guinea, and the Legislative Council of Nauru. In all our deliberations I know that the thought foremost in all our minds has been how best we could help you towards the objectives laid down in the charter of the United Nations.

"It is in that same spirit that I am glad to have this opportunity to send to you all this message of goodwill and support from the Trusteeship Council of the United Nations here in New York."

FIRST MICRONESIAN RECEIVES COMMERCIAL PILOT'S LICENSE

(Saipan, Mariana Islands, TTPI, Oct. 7)...Ramon de leon Guerrero, 23, of Saipan has become the first Micronesian to receive a commercial pilot's license from the Federal Aviation Agency. He completed his requirements in June of this year.

Recipients of commercial pilot's licenses must be in good health and have completed requirements for a private pilot's license in addition to 250 flying hours. Mr. Guerrero received his flight instruction from Sky Ranch Aviation and Pacific Flight Service in Honolulu. He is presently on vacation in Saipan.

MILITOBİ STRIKES REEF

(Saipan, Mariana Islands, TTPI, Oct. 11)...The Militobi, 483 ton Government-owned field trip vessel which is operated in the Marshalls District by the Kwajalein Island Trading Company, was driven on to a reef at Likiep in bad weather October 8.

Cargo was offloaded on to a small Marshallese craft, the Louisa, and the Militobi was refloated this morning with the assistance of a tug from the Kwajalein Test Site.

No serious damage was reported, according to Transportation Officer James Cook.

U.S. CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE

The following reply was received recently, to a question that was asked the administrators of the Government-wide service Benefit Plan (Blue Cross-Blue Shield Health Insurance), concerning identification cards.

"This office automatically issues two identification cards to each enrollee at the time of enrollment or upon subsequent change in his enrollment status. If an enrollee wishes to have additional identification cards issued to his dependents, it is suggested that we be notified by letter, at which time we will issue the requested number of identification cards. All identification cards issued to an enrollee will be in the name of the enrollee only, and not in the name of any other family member. Every eligible member of an enrollee's family may use a card printed in the enrollee's name and should encounter no difficulty in obtaining medical benefits." Address:

In the Marianas and Palau, nominations were handled by political parties, while in the other districts the nominations were submitted on an individual basis in accordance with the Election Law for the Territory, Public Law 2-16.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON UNABLE TO VISIT T.T.

(Saipan, Mariana Is, TTPI, Oct. 13)...In a message received today by the High Commissioner, President Lyndon B. Johnson expressed his regret at being unable to visit the Trust Territory as part of his tour through the Western Pacific and Asia. The President's message to the High Commissioner and the people of Micronesia stated: "Mrs. Johnson and I greatly regret that we will be unable to visit the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands during our trip to the Western Pacific and Asia. Although time will not permit such a stop, I assure you and the people of Micronesia that we are deeply conscious of their needs and aspirations and that this Administration will continue to give full weight to the requirements for educational opportunities, improved health services, better communities, and the chance to make economic use of their resources. Will you please convey to the people of the Trust Territory our deep interest in their future and our regret that circumstances preclude our visiting, even briefly, their islands on this trip."

JOHN HAY WHITNEY FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION

The Education Office would like to remind you that the deadline for receiving John Hay Whitney Fellowship applications for next year at the John Hay Whitney Foundation is November 30. There are a very limited number of application blanks which are available upon request. John Hay Whitney Fellowships are open to students in academic study to Trust Territory citizens who are under the age of 35. In most cases candidates must be college students, graduate students, or college graduates who desire to study beyond the Bachelor's degree in the humanities, the natural or social sciences, or in the profession. Candidates contemplating non-degree program need not have completed a college degree. They should, however, possess a background of training and leadership experiences which will enable them to profit significantly from a year for specialized study. Projects in such fields as business and industrial administration, and labor education are welcome. A program of study may include practical as well as formal academic work. Projects in regular vocational training will not be considered. Awards are for a full year of serious work, not for incidental, temporary or summer projects. Applications are available at the Education Office.

YASUO ERRY DIES

(Saipan, Mariana Islands, TTPI, Oct. 10)...Yasuo Erry, 36 year-old member of the Truk District Legislature, serving as a language instructor with the Peace Corps in Florida, was found dead in his Key West hotel room at 12:30 a.m. October 6. An autopsy report revealed that he had suffered a massive coronary caused by a ruptured blood vessel of the heart.

Services were held for him at the First Christian Church in Miami. His remains are being returned to Truk.

Deepest sympathy was extended to Congressman Erry's family by the High Commissioner and his staff, Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall; Mrs. Ruth G. Van Cleve, Director, Office of Territories, Department of the Interior; and John Pincetich, Peace Corps Director for the Territory.

In another message of sympathy, Under Secretary of State Nicholas Katzenbach stated: "He was a man dedicated to his people, and he rendered invaluable assistance to Peace Corps Volunteers preparing to serve those Micronesian people. The Peace Corps shall revere his memory."
