Craig phones his parents whenever his ship returns to Honolulu and is happy in the Navy. We wish him all the luck in the world and God-speed return to civilian life.

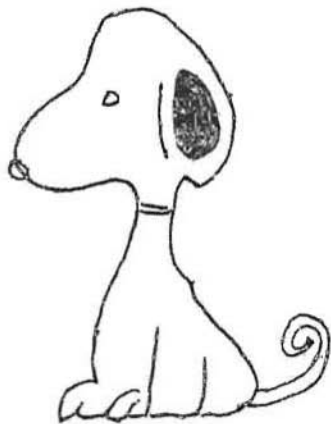

Denver Grill (A) drew bye.



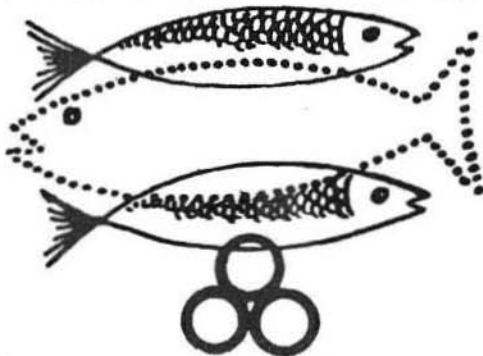
