Her Highness Ruth Keelikolani opens her new residence this evening with a reception and ball.

The telephone line for Koolau is up, as far as the half-way house. It will be up as far as the Pall on Saturday.

The Luau given by Her Highness Ruth Keelikolani yesterday was largely attended by both foreigners and Hawaiians.

Mr. Adams holds his Regular Cash Sale at his salesroom to-day, when he will offer dry goods, groceries, clothing, &c., &c.

The well borers, on Princess Ruth Keelikolani's property, at Palama, have struck a soft spot, and are now sinking at a rapid rate.

A foot bridge, about 500 feet long, has been built out into the water from the foot of Punchbowl street. A boat house will be built at the end of it for His Majesty's boats.

Sunday, the 12th inst., is the Eighth Anniversary of the Accession of His Majesty to the Throne. To-morrow will be observed as a Public Holiday, and all Government offices will be closed.

The Engine for the Marine Railway was landed from the ship Duke of Abercorn this week; also an engine for Claus Spreckels. Capt. Reynolds was employed by the consignees to take them out of the vessel.
