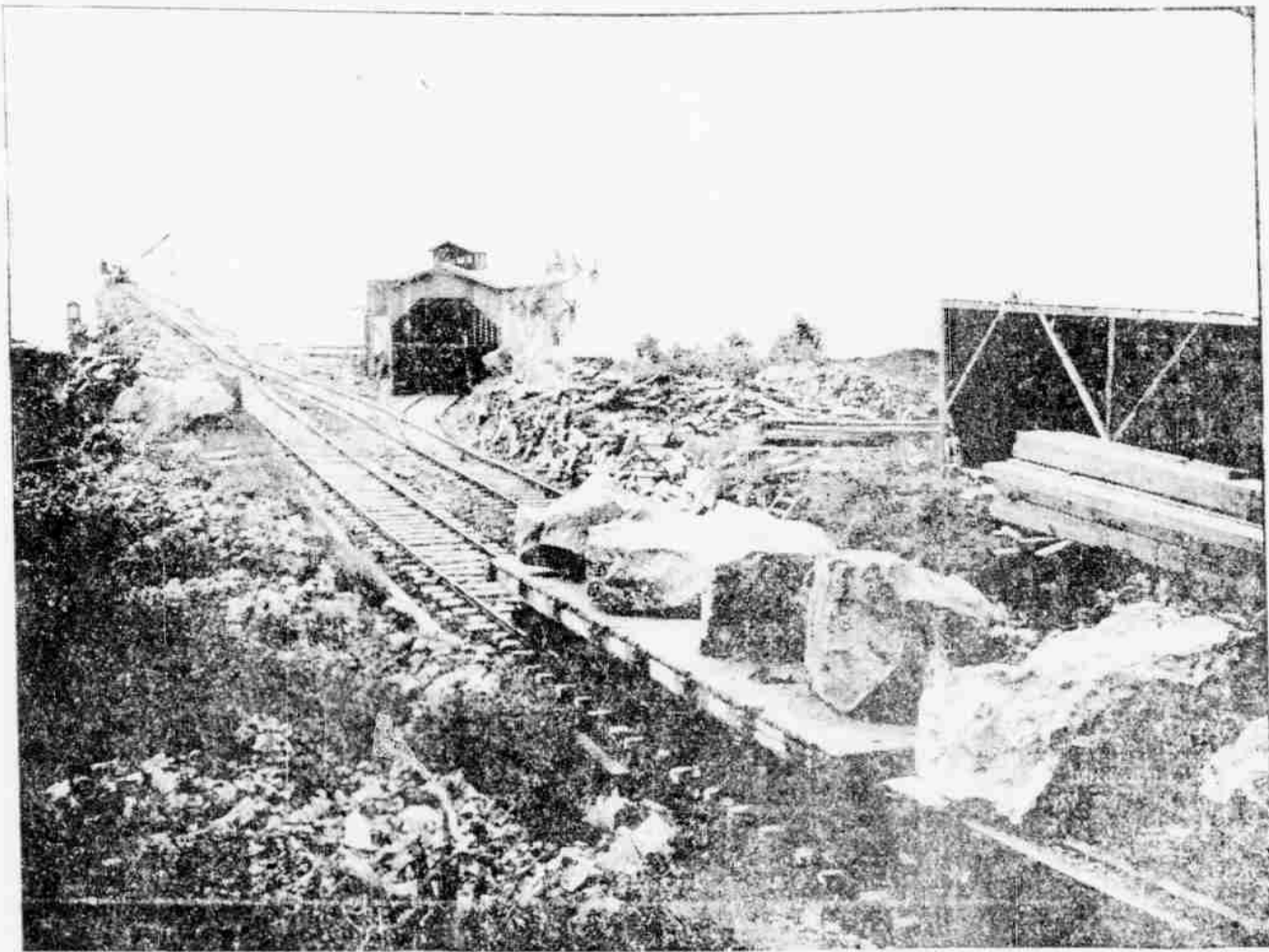
CONTRACT TO BE RATIFIED TODAY

KING COPS FIFTEEN-MILE CHAMPIONSHIP OF HAWAII

Pacific Coast Premier Beats Antone Kaoo More Than Six Laps and Turns Handspring After Running Distance in 1:38:18.

There was a thrilling race between King and Kaoo in the fifteen-mile championship of Hawaii at the Alhambra Park yesterday afternoon.

The little fellow got King set for the first mile, which was a hundred and twenty seconds. This is slower than any other King has ever run in his life. The soldier took the lead in the second lap of the second mile, making the six rounds in 7 minutes and 30 seconds.

The old Waialua Horse crossed the finish line yesterday about three seconds after King, and one mile he had the soldier. The Hawaiian champion was just as fast as a road runner, and when King started past him on the second mile and came up behind him in the third lap of the fifth mile, the old horse acted as though he was losing heart. As King passed him opposite the left grand bleachers, Kaoo stopped running and claimed that the soldier fouled him.

The Premier kept tight on going, while the local champion expostulated that King struck his right foot in passing. He walked around the track until he was opposite the end of the grandstand, and then turned off to go to his dressing room, but William Simerson, his manager, and others motioned for him to continue the race.

He trotted off again in a half-hearted way, and got into his stride again after King had passed another half mile. The understanding before the race started was that if one runner intentionally fouled the other, and it was left to the judges to determine whether the foul was intentional or not in the opinion of the race. The runners were so fast that they were further apart than they were in the inside of the track, and King had been gained on in the fourth lap.
