

EVANGELICAL ASSOCIATION.

The Annual Session Came to an End Yesterday.

The deliberations of the Congregational clergy composing the Hawaiian Evangelical Association for the session of 1896 came to an end yesterday and most of the members are already on their way home.

A number of important matters such as the titles to church lands, support of impoverished churches, Kahunism, etc., were referred to the Hawaiian Board, with power to act.

The Earth Reproduced.

Elisee Reclus, the French geographer, is out with a plan to construct a globe, a facsimile of the earth, on a scale that shall be exactly one-hundred thousandth part of the actual size.

The magnitude of the work will be appreciated when it is stated that the structure will be 418 feet in diameter, so that the Bartholdi statue, if erected inside of it, would not reach to its center.

Even on this large scale the Himalayas would be only about three and a half inches high, Mont Blanc about two inches, the Grampians half an inch, while the Palisades of the Hudson, at their highest points, would be about one-sixteenth of an inch above the level of the river.

SUNDAY KEEPING.

Things are getting confused. Here is the Hawaiian Evangelical Association requesting, with the aspect of demanding, that President Dole, as Commander-in-Chief, order the discontinuance of target-shooting with Army guns on Sunday, and passing resolutions of regret that Minister Cooper, as Bandmaster-in-Chief, should have instituted Sunday band concerts.

Reading about a marble bridge to be erected over the Tennessee river suggests anew the proposition to make bridges in Hawaii of stone. There is rock enough on all the islands for the purpose, and once well built a stone bridge would endure for generations.

Neither the Executive nor the Legislature has the right, under the constitution of this republic, to make decrees or laws prescribing how any citizen shall spend his time on Sunday. All that secular law has to do with, here, is to protect the people's right to one day's rest each week from their usual occupations.

The BULLETIN believes in Sunday as a civil institution to the extent stated, but as a religious institution its observance, under our constitutional religious liberty, must be left to every man's conscience.

It is well that the Government has decided to make Arbor Day simply a school holiday, and also to have it in the naturally proper season of spring. As a general public holiday it would be dull and stupid without other exercises than tree-planting, and these other exercises if held would detract from the main object of the day.

There is no doubt among those who have acquired information on the matter, that the principle of the wide tires bill is a good one. Since we suggested the propriety of delay the House has amended the bill so as to make it probably as good as possible until it can be judged in details by its operation.

An Italian has invented an adaptation of the slot-machine to savings bank purposes, and the New York Herald thinks it would be a good institution for America. There is no doubt it would be equally good for Hawaii.

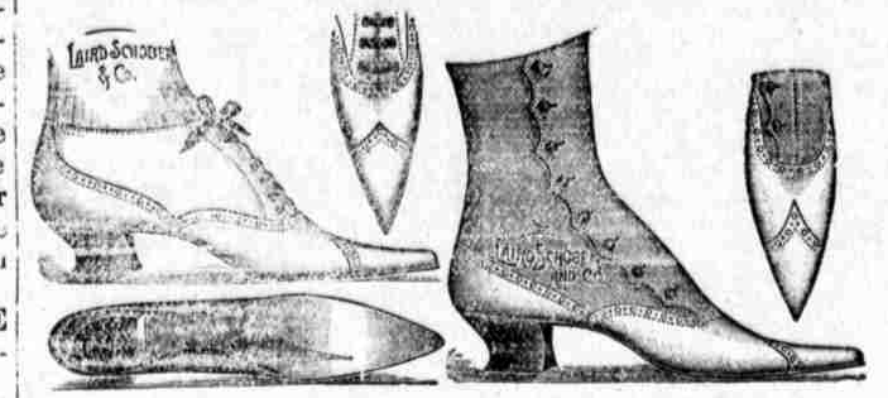

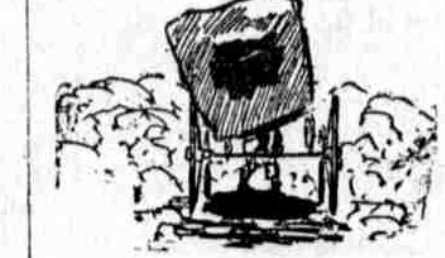

The band will give a concert at the government building this afternoon. The new club house on the Pacific Tennis grounds will be "dedicated" on Saturday. The new Club Hotel on Beretania street will be open to the public at 5:30 p. m. today. Sam Lederer is to be fore again this year with fireworks and flags for the Fourth at the I X L. Senator Horner recovered from his recent illness and occupied his usual seat in the Senate today. The Loyal Temperance Union had an interesting meeting at the Central Union church last night. Mrs. Geo. Otterson will leave on the 29th inst. for a three months' trip to California and Washington. Registration in Hilo is proceeding quite rapidly, as many as three and four persons a day complying with the law. 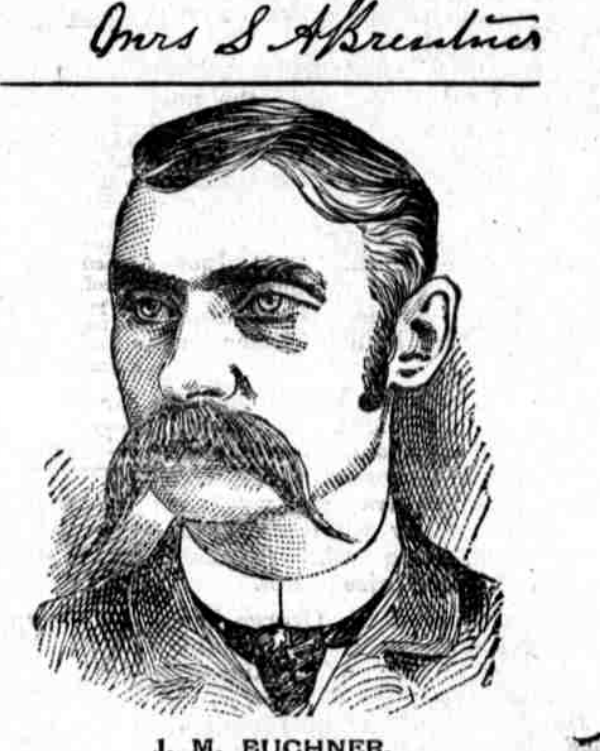
