# BICYCLE RACES

- AT -

## Kapiolani Park.

RUBEY DEXTER AND JACK ATKINSON WIN GLORY.

Mr. Henry Giles the Local Champion, Downed by Dexter and Atkinson.

The much talked of Bicycle race took place yesterday afternoon, a large number of people witnessed the event, the races were hotly contested and exciting, especially so as the public had been made aware of the existence of some feeling among the contestants by the recent law suit hereby. Dexter was forced into to get possession of his wheel which he had recently purchased, in order to be placed on even terms with Giles. Reuby Dexter and Jack Atkinson were decidedly the heroes of the day, both fairly outriding, and wrestling the laurels from the favorite Giles. In the one mile handicap Dexter paced Atkinson who defeated Giles, although Chapman who had been given a sixty yard handicap came in first and took the races, the flying paid no attention to him but practically made it a race for second place, it was an interesting and exciting struggle between the three local riders, Dexter, Atkinson, and Giles, in which Atkinson was victorious. The three mile race was the event of the day, the three flyers Dexter, Atkinson, and Giles came to the scratch, also Geo. Angus and Chapman. A good start was effected, the riders getting away well together, it soon became evident that Atkinson was pacing Dexter, while Chapman and Angus alternately paced Giles. Positions were soon taken and maintained for over two and a half miles, when nearing the last quarter Atkinson, who had all the while been steadily pacing Dexter, shot like an arrow from the bunch and came down the home stretch with Dexter still clinging to his pace maker, the burst of speed proved too much for Giles, who was now third, near the finish Dexter shot ahead of Atkinson and crosses the line a length ahead, Atkinson second, Giles third. In this race Dexter and Atkinson both proved themselves the equals if not the Superiors of Giles. Dexter had twice the same day met Giles in a 1/4 and 1/2 mile dash and defeated him, Atkinson had met Giles in a mile race and defeated him, it was however the general belief that in a longer race Giles would be able to vanquish his adversaries, the result however showed Dexter too much for him and entitled Dexter to the first rank of local Bicyclists.
