**GENERAL INFORMATION**

*University of Hawaii.* The University of Hawaii, located in Honolulu, on the island of Oahu is a state university and a federal land-grant institution, accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. The University embodies seven undergraduate colleges: Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Education, Engineering, General Studies, Nursing, and Tropical Agriculture. It offers graduate work leading to the master's degree in some 58 fields and to the doctorate in 18.

*Admission.* Students wishing to take summer session courses for credit may submit transcripts of their college records or certificates of good standing signed by their registrar or dean. Teachers in service may submit certificates signed by their supervising official. High school graduates who have not enrolled in college must submit certification of admission to an accredited college. Printed certificate forms will be sent, upon request, from the Office of Admissions and Records, University of Hawaii.

*Tuition and Fees.* The tuition fee is \$10 per credit hour. The incidentals fee is \$13. An activity fee of \$2 is charged every student for the first six-week term. No laboratory or other course fees except in Applied Music and Institute courses. All fees are payable at registration time. No money should be sent in advance. No extra charges are made for out-of-state students.

*Campus Dormitories.* Several hundred dormitory rooms will be available to summer session students. Inquiries and applications should be sent to: Director of Student Housing, Johnson Hall A, University of Hawaii, Honolulu, Hawaii 96822. It should be noted that admission to the University is made without reference to the availability of housing, and students residing off-campus must make their own housing arrangements.

*Other Information.* Fuller details are published in the 1965 summer session catalogue, to be published in the spring.
