But this even does not make a fair exhibit. The Egyptian people outside the ruling class are "fellahs," who own no land of their own, but cultivate the soil, paying "tribute of all they possess" to their taskmasters.

Just let us go a step further, and show just how little Mr. Carter and his Opposition colleagues really know of the comparative national debts of the world.

NATIONAL DEBT PER HEAD POPULATION. Hawaiian Kingdom 13 dollars, Victoria (Australia) 163, New South Wales 191, Queensland 283, South Australia 247, New Zealand 291, etc.
