IN HONOR OF KWAJ. D-DAY

This Thursday, Kwajalein will be remembered. Remembering that four years ago our Island was secured from all Japanese opposition. Remembering that from the Marshall Islands operation, our forces went on the force the "Nipponese to their knees" in a series of many bitter fought campaigns. This day will be commemorated by a fitting ceremony in which General Hull, Commanding General of the Pacific Forces, will dedicate a plaque in honor of the 7th Infantry Division, who made the initial landing on Kwajalein.

TERRIBLE CONFLICT BREWING OVER GANDHI ASSASSINATION

NEW DELHI, Jan. 31(AP) An assassin killed Mohandhi K. Gandhi, India's apostle of peace, at prayer time last night. The 78 year-old Mahatma, or Great Souled One, was cut down by the bullets of a young Hindu for what police called political reasons. The news crossed India's troubled continent and bloody rioting broke out in Bambay, perhaps the forerunner of terrible conflict. Fifteen were reported killed and 54 injured in fighting between Hindus and Moslems.

MODERATE TO HEAVY EARTHQUAKE

A "moderate to heavy" earthquake somewhere in the Pacific area south of the Equator was recorded simultaneously today on seismographs in the United States and Hawaii. The coast and geodetic survey instrument at Honolulu recorded a "heavy" earth tremor beginning at 4:06 A.M. (PST) with an estimated epicenter 2,800 miles distant, possibly between the Fiji and Samoa Island. Prof. Perry Beyerly at the University of California, Berkeley, reported his seismograph showed a "moderate" earthquake beginning at 4:09 A.M. (PST) possibly located in Peru. Fordham University seismograph traced a "sharp" quake 3,800 miles from New York City in an undetermined direction. The shocks were recorded at 4:15 and 4:23 A.M. (PST)

### YANKEE FRIEND SHIP

Glasgow, Scotland, Feb. 2-- (U.P.)--- The "Yankee Friend Ship" loaded with food and good will for the Scottish people, docked in the River Clyde today and Sir Harry Lauder went down to the port to express Scotland's thanks with some of the songs which have endeared him to the American people.

Bagpipes skirled the gay strains of "Hieland Laddie" and the 77-year-old Sir Harry led the crowd on the windswept dock in "three cheers for the people of Boston".

The venerable Scottish minstrel then led the crowd in singing two of his best-loved songs, "I Love A Lassie" and "Keep Right On To The End Of The Road."

The first parcel brought ashore from the flag decked ship was given to Tom Johnston, former Secretary of State for Scotland, and now chief of the Scottish Tourist Board. The taken parcel was presented by William M. Bump of the Boston Chamber of Commerce and Vice-President of the American Airlines.
