The Life of the Land is Established in Rightness.

HONOLULU, NOV. 7, 1894

A FIZZLE.

The proposed "charitable" association which is being arranged by Messrs. Bolte and Jones, and which has for an object to protect the ill-used planters is not getting along so nicely as the promoters hoped. It was believed that the scheme should be kept secret, but the wicked HOLOMUA disclosed it through sources that cannot be fathomed—by the promoters and Mr. John D. Spreckels and his representative here are now in full possession of the facts that inform them of the treacherous move of a few disgruntled and impecunious financiers.

The proposition to treat the scheme as a charitable move or at least an attempt to do a benevolent thing to the plantation stockholders, big and small, is simply humorous. The secret object of the business is to furnish certain commercial gentlemen whose financial legs are not so stiff as they should be with means through the manipulation of which they will be able to tide over the present depression in the commercial market and probably reach a safe shore after their financial swimming excursion.

They may find a few suckers who will follow them in their enterprise against Spreckels, but the majority of our planters will not embark in a venture which may cost them the enmity of that unrelenting concern which is represented by the king of Hawaii, Spreckels.

The association according to the terms of the agreement can not go into active operation until owners of 100,000 tons of sugar have subscribed. If the small stockholders watch their interests and take out injunctions against the directors of their companies, as has been done in two instances the prospects are that the association will be a total fizzle, and the promoters find that their dream of wealth and financial supremacy was only a bubble and a dream.

THE Planters' Labor and Supply association has finished its work. A most unsatisfactory labor report was presented and very little work was done. The planters are either depressed or aware of the ominous calm that undoubtedly precedes a storm. Not a word was said in regard to Messrs. Jones and Bolte's "trust" and the Spreckels representatives who now have got onto the inside track of the new scheme retained a perfect silence while Mr. W. G. Irwin resigned from the presidency of the company.

The proposed establishment of an experimental station deserves the highest praise and will be beyond doubt be fully appreciated by all practical cane-growers. The association rubs the back of Frank Hastings by giving him a testimonial. At the same time it gives Thurston \$1,500 in cash. We are inclined to believe that Frank wouldn't mind changing with his famous or infamous boss.

It is understood that minister Hatch disavows the anti-asiatic expressions of Mr. Thurston published in Washington papers. It is now the custom of the representatives of the republic of Hawaii to "lie" out of every bad break made by its members. Would it not be better to employ gentlemen and trained politicians instead of placing "scrubs" in official positions where they always succeed in bringing ridicule and contumacy on the head of the government represented by them? Mr. Hatch has undertaken a serious contract if he believes that a double-barrelled smile from him and Damon can settle diplomatic disagreements and smother demands for explanations by the foreign representatives.

We give space in today's issue to two correspondents who deal harshly with the Dailey company. We always believe that all sides should be heard but we must say that we decidedly disagree with the would-be critics. In tomorrow's issue we shall refer more fully to this matter.

WHEN the Japanese citizens a few days ago celebrated the birthday of the Mikado at a meeting at the Beretania Street Armory, somebody in the government saw fit to send a detachment of armed "citizens" to the place of celebration and allow a number of half-baked "republicans" to sport pistols and make a general asinine display of themselves. There was absolute no call for such a procedure. It is to be hoped that the action of the armed clerks, tailors and shoemakers was solely due to their own fertile imagination and not encouraged by the authorities. Under all circumstances we shall recommend the government to stop the indiscriminate carrying of fire arms by its patriotic and at times very "spirited" counter-jumpers. One of these days the pistols will be taken away from the irresponsible blather-skites and the A. U. P. will count a few members less. If the government did send these armed wolves in citizens clothes to guard a peaceful meeting of peaceful citizens of a foreign nationality it deserves all the ridicule and contempt which now fall to its lot.

Barnstormers All.

Allow me to take you to task for your adulation of the company of players who are now holding the boards at the Opera House. From your repeated commendations of their play I was almost persuaded that it might be a mistake on my part to suppose that they were unfit for most of the pieces they have attempted to render, and so, against my better judgment, I was induced to go and see their presentation of the "Henrietta," last evening. The first solecism I observed on the part of the management was the crediting of the play to Stuart Kobson as (author) were as everyone who knows anything of such matters knows that Bronson Howard wrote that charming play. The most unpardonable solecism, however, was the placing of such a play in the hands of such players, who are no more fit for it than they are for purposes of legislation. After having seen Stuart Robsonate person Bertie it was little joy to me to watch the very stagey Mr. Snow in that part; and with recollections of others of Robson's troupe, the very "dizzy" acting of some members of the Dailey combination proved exceedingly dismal. This remark applies with especial force to the parson, who in a good troupe, is the life and soul of the piece, from the moment of his entry on the stage. The stock-jobbing parson of the author is by no means the stiff, dismal and seedy old party presented to us last night. Without going into a detailed critique of the presentation, let me venture the opinion that Mr. Snow passed the line of mediocrity, old Vanalstyne and his other son, with the old clerk closely approached that line, while the entire balance of the company were strung away at varying distances in the rear. It was most oppressive to sit through the solemn stillness attending some of the scenes that, with an even moderately accomplished company, would have kept the house convulsed with mirth. I am quite confirmed in my previous opinion that Mr. Dailey, having struck "velvet" on his last engagement here, thought he could safely dispense with what little talent his troupe contained, and palm off upon our long-suffering Honolulu public any kind of "barnstormers" that he could gather at the sound of his whistle from among the attaches of the numerous San Francisco stages. In my humble judgment this action on Mr. Dailey's part was not fair to Honolulu, nor creditable to himself, in fact, it looks not unlike dishonesty on his part.

Will you print the foregoing, as a mild, but well deserved protest against this action of Mr. Dailey in setting before the public of this city bills of fare very good in themselves, but so very badly served as to neutralize the good intentions and talents of the literary cooks who prepared them for the public, thus obliging a Good Natured Critic.

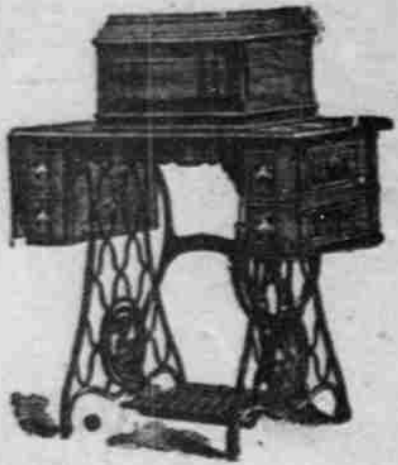
