Old-Time Travelling in Spain.

The following extract from a letter written in 1624 by a member of the escort who attended the transport of the royal jewels of England from Madrid to London, after the breaking off of the Spanish match, is curious as showing the safety of travelling in Spain at the time, as well as the characteristic story-telling facility of at least one of the convoy. Spanish brigandage, which we were apt to associate with Andalusian lands, does not seem to have existed at the time this letter was written:

We were but five horsemen in all our seven days' journey from Madrid to Bilbao, and the charge Mr. Witches had is valued at four hundred thousand crowns; but 'tis such safe travelling in Spain that one may carry gold in the palm of his hand, the government is so good. When we had gained Biscay Ground we passed one day through a forest, and, alighting off our mules to take a little repast under a tree, we took down our alforgas and some bottles of wine (and you know 'tis ordinary here to ride with one's victuals about him), but as we were eating we spied two huge wolves, who stared upon us awhile, but had the good manners to go away. It puts me in mind of a pleasant tale I heard Sir Thomas Fairfax relate of a soldier in Ireland, who, having got his passport to go to England, as he passed through the wood with his knapsack upon his back, being weary, sat down under a tree, where he opened his knapsack and fell to some victuals he had; but on a sudden he was surprised with two or three wolves, who, coming toward him, he threw them scraps of bread and cheese till all was gone, then, the wolves making a nearer approach to him, he knew not what shift to make, but by taking a pair of bagpipes which he had; as soon as he began to play upon them the wolves all ran away as if they had been scared out of their wits; whereupon the soldier said,—"The devil take you all; if I had known you loved music so well you should have had it before dinner!"

LEGISLATIVE

Friday, June 3.—Petitions read and referred:

From Makawao, Maui, that employers be not allowed to imprison their employees for any cause whatever.

From Manoa, that parents who do not send any children to school be exempt from the school tax.

From the same place, that Chinamen who embark in the poi business be made to pay a license; that horses be taxed according to value; that milk cows and working oxen be similarly taxed.

The Attorney-General submitted a written opinion (in response to a Resolution of the Assembly) to the effect that there was no law or treaty stipulation which will prevent the Assembly from passing an Act prohibiting the importation of intoxicating drinks.

Mr. Kauai presented a resolution appropriating \$9,000 for a bridge at Waimea, Kauai.

Mr. Mahoe, a resolution for the repair of the Court House at Waiulua, Oahu, \$50.

Mr. Aiwohi, \$5,000 for improvement and extension of the wharf at Mahukona.

Mr. Kamakele read first time his bill to repeal Chapter 57 of the Penal Code, "To mitigate the evils and diseases arising from prostitution."

Mr. Kalua offered a resolution appropriating \$6,000 for the erection of a prison at Honouliuli, Maui. Referred to a special committee.

The Assembly then, in committee of the whole, Mr. Kapena in the chair, proceeded to the order of the day, which was the Appropriation Bill.

Some discussion arose upon the item of permanent settlement for Her Majesty Queen Emma, which several members were desirous of raising to \$16,000, but on explanations made by the Attorney-General, it was passed as in the bill—\$12,000. P. Kanoa and H. S. Swinton, respectively, \$2,400 and \$600, passed. Recess till 1 o'clock.

The House sat for two hours in the afternoon, and got about half through the Department of the Judiciary. The salaries of the Chief and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court and of the Police Justice of Honolulu, which had been increased in the bill, as reported by the Ministers, were reduced to the original amounts. Those of several district justices on Kauai were increased.

SOME sketches, which are curiosities, made by Maskelynes automaton "Zoe," are on sale at the bookstore.

TO-DAY will be held an election for a Representative to supply the vacancy for Honolulu. We hear of several candidates, but there is very little interest manifested among the electors. Albert Kuniakoa, who was a member in 1880, is most prominently spoken of.

THE attraction on Kulaokahua plains this afternoon, will be a cricket match, between eleven members of the Honolulu Cricket Club, and eleven from H. B. M.'s Champion. Wickets will be pitched at 12 o'clock, noon. A good game is anticipated.

The Isle of Content.

A speck in the ocean is Pitcairn Island, or the "Isle of Content," as it is aptly called. Although only six miles in circumference it is inhabited by ninety-six of the happiest persons in the world. The island is situated in a delightful climate, about three thousand miles westward of the northern coast of South America. All the tropical fruits grow there in abundance. The inhabitants form an English colony, and live a simple, happy life, undisturbed by the strife of the world around them. Money is practically unknown among them. The one magistrate on the island has a sinecure. There are no disputes, and lawlessness is unknown among them. Each man has his own house and land. The life is communistic in a way, for all are socially equal and share their goods with each other when one becomes needy. Shoes are seldom worn by the women. The children, when only a few years old, learn to swim and tumble around in the breakers without fear or danger. The people are religious, and worship in the little church which they themselves built, some one of their number reading the fine old service of the Church of England, and also preaching every Sunday. They are always exceeding zealous in succoring shipwrecked sailors, and seem, on the whole, to lead a truly ideal life of quiet and contentment realized by very few in this busy world of men.

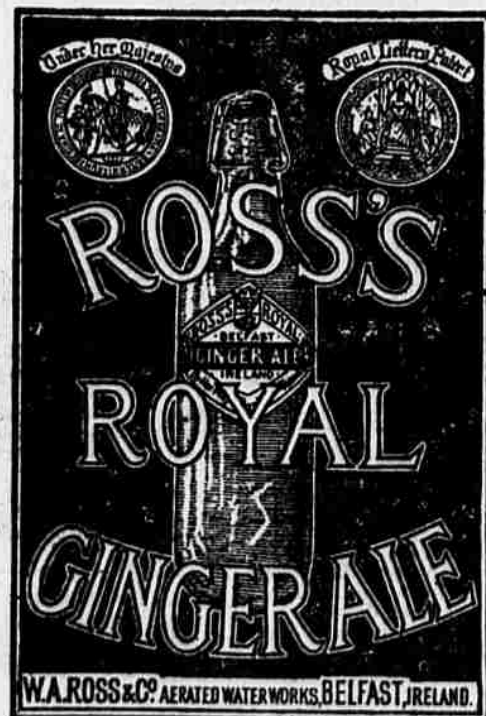
