KILOHANAS TRIUMPHANT

Bring Off Two Neat Society Comedies with Eclat.

The New Chaps Cover Themselves with Glory—Full House Applauds without Stint.

Whenever any enterprise of great pith and moment is advocated by the elite, society never gets excited, as that would be considered bad form. Dignity, decorum and reserve are at par and the grand dames simply flutter, and Saturday evening was the occasion of the most recherche fluttering. The event was the presentation of two plays at the Opera House by the Kilohana Art League's Dramatic Circle and shortly before eight o'clock the neighborhood presented a scene of beauty with delicate laces and ermines, queenly silks and satins. As carriage after carriage rolled up to the entresol, fair maidens and matronly dames, attended by escorts in the full splendor of evening dress, gave an air of brilliancy to whilom dreary surroundings and a feast to the eyes of the crowd of spectators who lingered near the entrance. All classes were represented and by the cream of each strata of the social world. Religion, law, the army, navy and the sciences wore their best fronts, and the large number of visiting strangers were convinced that Honolulu is no mean rival when put to the test in social amenity and cordiality.

The comedies presented were of an exceptionally fine degree of merit and were rendered by the players with an air that did not require the ordinary indulgence of regard to amateurs.

The first was "By Way of a Joke" and the cast was as follows: Mr. Bertram.....Mr. Andrew Adams Jack Dunstan.....

Most of the performers had held up the mirror to nature before and it was generally known what they were capable of and the audience centered on those who were new-comers. In this rank, Mr. Andrew Adams was a revelation as "Mr. Bertram" and from the first showed that he was entirely at home in the character, not from the mere fact of rehearsal, but from nature. He was entirely devoid of mannerisms, cool in his every phase and apt in the fun-making role that was his. From the beginning he was with the audience and the audience was perforce with the comedy. In fact every one of the cast was good and each vied with the other in presenting an unbroken line of delicate lights and shades.

"The False Note" was successfully uttered and in such a manner that the audience cashed it before they discovered any trace of false publication. This charming little sketch was presented with the following cast:

Major Judkins.....Mr. C. Forster Granville Crawley.....Major George C. Potter Percy Fenn.....Mr. Andrew Adams Miss Judkins.....Miss Edna Kelley Miss Elizabeth Partridge.....

In this, as in the first event, the listeners were treated to an agreeable surprise in another new face. Mr. C. M. V. Forster, as "Major Judkins," and the judgment in general upon Mr. Adams was accentuated in the applause and recognition given Mr. Forster. The other characters were thoroughly sustained and each and everyone of the ladies and gentlemen need not have any misgivings as to lack of critical appreciation whenever and wherever they may again be called on to repeat their elegant and chaste renditions of their respective lines of character. In fact each and every one of the artists in both comedies compared favorably with professionals of note and gave assurance of their abilities to cope with higher comedy, and it is hoped the test will soon be made.

The musical portion of the entertainment was by the Y. M. C. A. orchestra under the baton of Mr. Wray Taylor, whose selections were choice and the rendition thereof perfect. In its entirety the whole affair has become a pleasant memory that cannot be too soon revived and more frequent presentations become the rule.

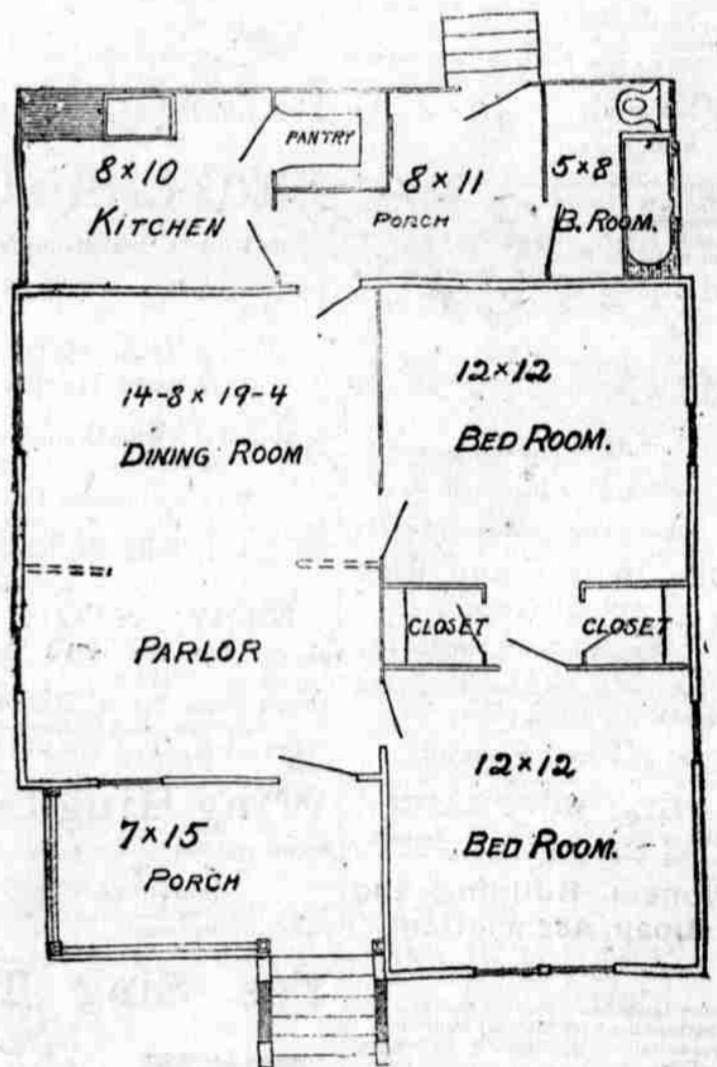
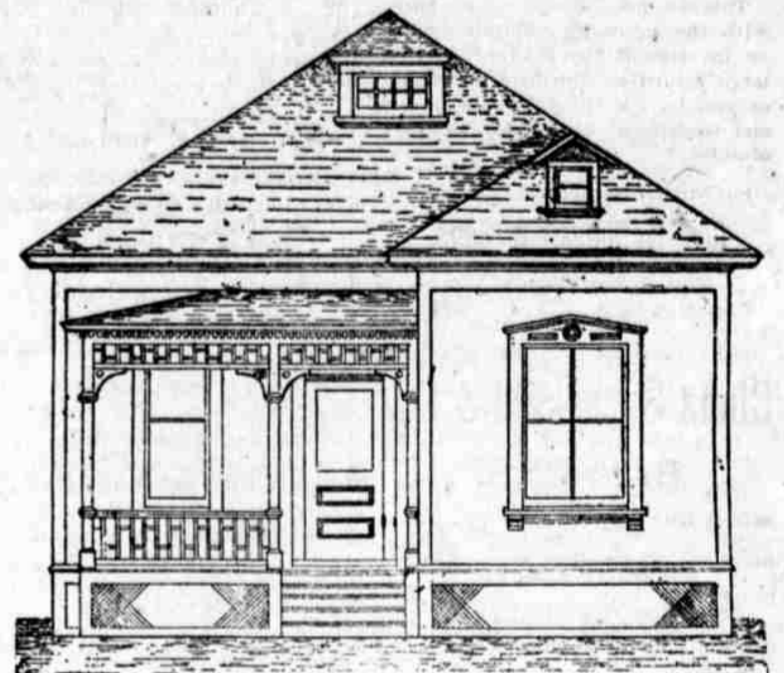
