THE LEGISLATURE.

FIFTEENTH DAY. Tuesday, June 10. (Concluded.) PETITIONS. The following petitions were presented by the members named: Rep. Brown—from 82 Chinese residents of Honolulu, that the laws in relation to Chinese immigration be repealed or amended.

SIXTEENTH DAY.

Thursday, June 12. (Concluded.) Rep. Kauii agreed with Noble Baldwin that this was not the proper time for discussing the bill. The introducer had stated that it wasn't his private measure, and, although the speaker was opposed to the bill, he believed it ought to take the usual course.

SEVENTEENTH DAY.
