The adjourned meeting of the Y. M. C. A. will be held at the Lyceum to-night, at 7:30 P.M.

Her Royal Highness the Heir Apparent will hold a reception at her residence, Washington Place, this afternoon, from 3 to 5.

On the last trip of the Kekaula-ohi to Hanalei, one of her crew fell overboard during the night. The schooner was immediately put about and the man picked up.

Friend Hassinger saw a person tax collecting yesterday, called and asked him if he would give him a receipt for his, at the same time handing him a handful of tacks.

The Chinaman arrested for smuggling opium in cases of goods ex Australia last week was tried in the Police Court yesterday. He was sentenced to two months' imprisonment at hard labor. The goods were confiscated, which with the opium was valued at about \$2,000.

News of an attempt to commit suicide was received by telephone from Kailua, Oahu, yesterday morning. A woman was found in a house near Maunawili, with her head badly cut; a hatchet, hammer, and two stones were on the floor near her. She was subject to asthma, and gave that as the reason for endeavoring to take her life.

The steam-whaler North Star, in charge of the mate Mr. Carter, arrived yesterday, 68 days from Juan Fernandez. She has 200 barrels sperm oil. Mr. Carter reports that when cruising off Molokai on Tuesday afternoon last, he fell in with a school of whales. He immediately lowered his boats, and succeeded in striking four of them. Two of them were saved, the other two were lost, also one of the boats and its crew. The vessel has gone to Kealakekua Bay to meet Capt. Owen. The men will recruit there, after which she will return to Honolulu to fit out for the Arctic.

An alarm of fire was turned in from Ward No. 4 at a few minutes past two yesterday afternoon. The fire was in the coach house on the premises occupied by Major J. H. Wodehouse, on Emma street. A bale of hay was burnt up, and the side of the building badly scorched. In the back wall of the building, (against which the hay was lying) are two knot holes, on the outside of which, between it and the fence, on the ground, nearly under one of the holes, a match was found with the phosphorous off the end of it, which had evidently been struck with the intention of lighting it, but did not burn. On making a further examination about the premises, an old wardrobe in the house was found to contain a lot of hay saturated with kerosene oil, and under the house a bundle of papers was found, also saturated with oil. The fire is supposed to be the work of an incendiary.

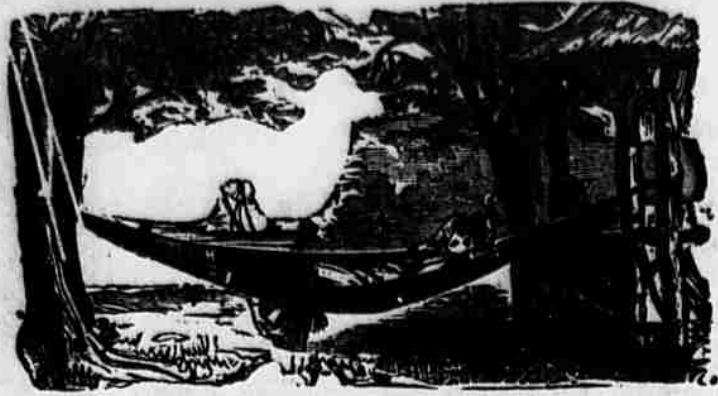

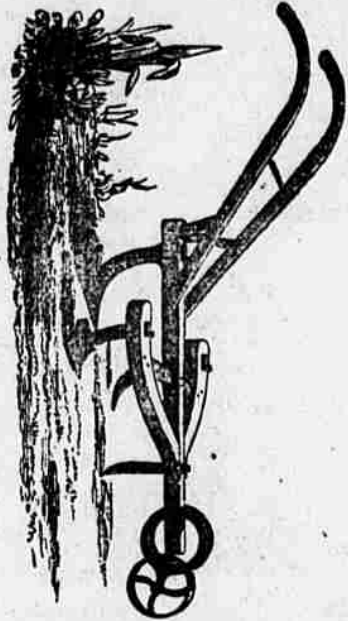

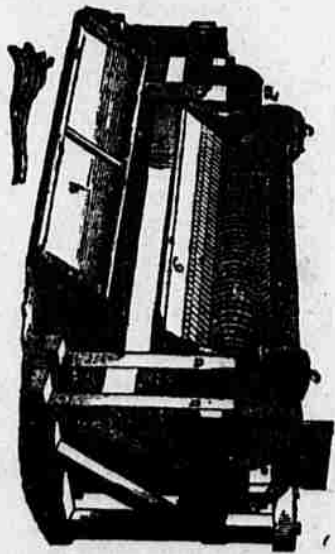

**Vaccination.**

It is greatly doubted whether vaccination is a protection against small-pox. The statistics of the London Metropolitan hospitals go far to shew that it is not. Out of 15,171 small-pox cases, from 1876 to 1880, no less than 11,412 were of persons who had been vaccinated. But even this is not conclusive against the efficacy of vaccination. It is well-known that the human system undergoes a thorough change every few years. Not a particle that existed in the body seven years ago forms a component part of it now. With such a change it is absurd to expect that a single vaccination in early infancy can be perpetually effectual throughout life. The propriety of repeating it at various periods of life is thus evident.

Though it may be well doubted whether vaccination be an entire preventive against small-pox, we think it is clearly established that it greatly modifies its effects. Those who have been vaccinated are not so much affected by small-pox as those who have not. They are more likely to recover, and are not so greatly marked in person by the disease. This result alone is sufficient to commend vaccination to the prudent. Then the opinion of the most eminent physicians is unanimous in its favor. There is no danger in getting vaccinated, and there is more inconvenience than pain, or trouble, connected with it. That, however, is inconsiderable, and should never prevent any one from getting it done. The more one is affected by the vaccination the more he stood in need of it being done, and the worse he would have been with small-pox had he taken the disease without being vaccinated. We would certainly say to all—Get vaccinated. If it does no good, it will do no ill, and carries with it besides a great relief to the mind, which of itself is a considerable protection against the disease. —*Scottish American Journal*, January 26.

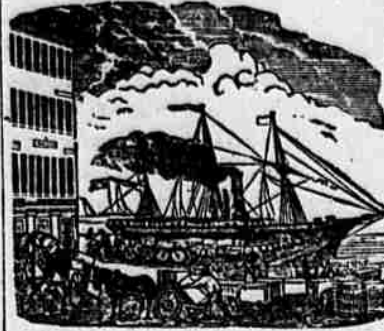
