of the 34 Judicial Circuit held in Waimea, Island of Hawaii:

CIVIL CALENDAR.

**Haelehookano, k. vs. R. M. Overend,** action of replevin. Judgment (being confessed by defendant) was entered for plaintiff. Wm. A. Kinney for plaintiff.

**Akini, ch. vs. Geo. P. Kamanoa,** action to recover the amount of \$350. Tried before a mixed jury. D. H. Hitchcock for plaintiff; defendant for himself. This was the only mixed jury case tried. The Court instructed the jury to return a verdict for plaintiff.

**Haelehookano, k. vs. W. H. Rickard,** action of replevin. Defendant confessed judgment and agreed to pay the value of the horse. Wm. Kinney for plaintiff, Cecil Brown for defendant.

**The case of Kapuwana, k. vs. Kahuluna, k.** ejectment was withdrawn, being settled out of Court. D. H. Hitchcock for plaintiff, G. W. Pilipo for defendant.

**The case of S. B. Kaalawamaka, k. vs. Kankalek, k.** ejectment was withdrawn, being settled out of Court. D. H. Hitchcock for plaintiff, Wm. Kinney for defendant.

**The case of Kalihihili, w. and Keoni Kane, w. L. Kaina,** ejectment; was continued by May term. D. H. Hitchcock for plaintiff, Messrs. Hitchcock and Nawahi for defendant.

**L. Kaina 2d vs. Kahuluna, k.** suit for \$30. Damages by pigs of defendant to taro patch of plaintiff at Puna, Hawaii. The jury was waived in this case.

During the progress of this case the Court commented on the non-compliance of the law respecting the transmission of merits to the next session.

posed persons to the office of the Minister of the Interior, that by law executors and administrators of estates may be fined for non-compliance regarding the sending of those records to the Minister of the Interior. The Court held that the Minister of the Interior or his clerk were the proper certifying officers, and not the executors of an estate.

Prior to the adjournment of Court *sine die*, the Deputy Attorney-General moved for the examination of T. Paakiki, deputy sheriff of Waimea and Mr. Kiha, deputy sheriff of Hanalei, for misconduct in the discharge of their official duties.

The Court adjourned until the 30th of May, 1884, when it was ascertained that the sheriff of Waimea was that a warrant of arrest dated the 3d Oct. 1883 was issued against one Mahukaliili for for-

The said warrant was not served until the 10th October, which was done by James Bright, another police officer of Waima.

The complaint against the deputy sheriff of Hamana, was, that he had conversed with Kaloioa, a native of the Hawaiian K. was in prison, awaiting their trial under a charge of robbery. The evidence showed that Kaloioa was told by Kina, the police officer, that if he (Kaloioa) retracted what he had previously told the district magistrate, and testify that he (Kaloioa) saw Kawaiki strike the Chinaman, he (Kaloioa) would be acquitted, which Kaloioa did say by appearing before the Judge a second time. The evidence against Kaloioa was then dismissed, and Kaloioa was used as prosecuting witness against Kawaiki.
