A DARING BURGLARY.

Chief of the booty secured were \$100 in gold and some notes, two gold watches, diamond earrings and other jewelry. Furniture was damaged and clothing strewn around the house.

AMATEUR OPERATIC SUCCESS.

The Mikado by Gilbert and Sullivan Produced by Loani Tateat.

Very favorable reports were heard of the rehearsals of the Mikado Opera Company, composed entirely of local amateur talent, and the happy expectations thus raised were not disappointed in the first public production.

The Hawaiian Opera House was filled even to standing room for this event yesterday evening. Practically all of Honolulu's notability was represented in the auditorium.

The King and Princess Liliuokalani, and Hon. John O. Dominis and A. S. Cleghorn, were in the royal box. The following were the dramatic persons:

The Mikado of Japan—Mr R. Monteagle Nanki Poo (his son)—Mr W. H. Hoogs Noko (Lord High Executioner)...

Mr. E. F. Bishop Poo Bah (Lord High Everything Else)—Mr W. Lewers Poo Bah (Lord High Everything Else)...

Mr. C. Widemann Yum Yum, Yum Yum's (Miss Nolte) Piti Sing, Yum Yum's (Miss J. Bowler) Poo Bah, Yum Yum's (Miss M. T. Lishman) Katisha (an elderly lady in love with Nanki Poo)...

Mr. W. W. Dimond (Katisha) appeared near the close of the first act. It cannot be invidious to say that she was the prima donna of the opera. The character and the music require that she should have been so, and her carrying out of the part justified hers at least as a correct assignment.

With a sweet and flexible voice, an intelligent and potent expression, and action of animated gracefulness, Mrs. Dimond imparted a fresh liveliness to the piece from her entrance, maintaining it with unflagging fidelity to the grand finale.

Her singing of the difficult measures was such as only natural qualities of a rare order well cultivated could fit anybody for emulating.

Mr. R. Monteagle, holding the titular role, entered in great state near the middle of the second act. He was arrayed in sombre gorgeousness, and attended by Hi Kichi (Mr. W. T. Monsarrat) holding a vast umbrella over his head. The attendant towering a head over his monarch made everybody laugh with his capital business, as his lithe figure swayed in eagerness to keep up with the slightest movement of His Majesty the Mikado.

After his duet with Katisha, the song, "Mikado," was given by that dignitary. Monteagle in this as well as his bearing throughout gave thorough satisfaction.

The Mikado abounds with rattling solos, duets, quartets, and choruses, besides containing several songs of a sweetly plaintive character.

Among the more comical incidents of the play two may be mentioned. One is where Ko Ko tries to "get used" to Nanki Poo's endearments toward Yum Yum, the loving pair being only too willing to aid him in his experiments with his tender feelings.

The other is when the discovery is made that Nanki Poo, executed on paper by Ko Ko with Poo Bah accessory, is the Mikado's son, and the culprits writhe and wriggle in anguish under the cold and cruel judgment of the Mikado.

That which mostly added to the artistic effect throughout was the true Japanese stage settings. To anyone at all conversant with the marvelous effects the Japanese landscape gardens produce, the scenes were most truly appreciated.

In the first act, the summer-house, with its characteristic veranda of plain, unpainted wood, tiled roof, stuccoed joints, carried one to the "Land of the Rising Sun," and in the second and final act, the painter had portrayed to a nicely the beautiful grass-roof of a country farmhouse, with all its rural beauty and simplicity.

For a first appearance especially, the Mikado Opera Company have merited unstinted praise. Their success is mainly attributable to Prof. Sauviet the conductor. His capacity for such work, a labor of love to him, was fully revealed to the community last night. For many weeks the professor had given nightly service to the training of all for their parts. Only a small proportion of his material approached ripeness for being utilized in such an ambitious musical enterprise when he took it in hand. Prof. Sauviet's high professional experience, his rare power for organizing, his ability of conducting, and remarkable patience and perseverance all contributed to a result that may well gratify even such a veteran musician. It was astonishing to see the professor using one hand in giving time emphatically to the singers on the stage while performing his piano accompaniment in the orchestra.

Mr. J. F. Brown's work as stage manager had also no small share in the whole happy achievement.

The performance will be repeated to-morrow night. No better proof of the triumph achieved in the initial production could be wanted than the fact that a throng has besieged the ticket office throughout this forenoon in order not to be disappointed in securing seats when the sale began at one o'clock this afternoon.
