A RAILROAD AROUND OAHU.

If the ministerial "idea of a railroad around the coast line of Oahu" is new and novel, it is not any the less deserving of due consideration on that account. We are not quite so anti-ministerial as to reject the "idea" with the exclamation, "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth!" but are willing to discuss the question on its merits. We are also willing, at present, to accept the statements, that "not more than ten miles have any engineering difficulties, and these can be surmounted at moderate cost," and that "the entire road with a certain amount of rolling stock can be put in operation for less than a half million dollars." We are willing, we say, to accept these statements as correct, for we are not sufficiently acquainted with the designated route to dispute them. The proposition may be utopian; it may be premature; it may be a grand practical idea, worthy of immediate execution: we are not in a position to judge. The wisdom or absurdity of the suggestion, to our mind, is involved in these questions: Would this railway pass through a populous and productive country? If not now populous and productive, is it capable of becoming so? And would a railroad be the means of effecting this result? A negative answer to these questions, particularly the two latter, must determine the project as an idle fancy. If, on the other hand, the country is rich in natural wealth, of which railroad connection with Honolulu would be the best and quickest developer, it must be admitted that the idea is sound and sensible.

RAIN, RAPTURE, AND ROADS.

The rains—the frequent rains—keep nature in one broad smile of delight. The hillsides, the plains, the taro patches, the banana fields, the kitchen gardens, and the whole domain of vegetation ripple and sparkle and beam with life and pleasure and gratitude. We, too, feel inclined to smile and be glad and thankful; but a thought of the roads and streets checks the smile and converts the grateful emotion into something else, and we begin to declaim against the rain for all this mud and slush and discomfort. The rain rebukes us by saying, "My mission is to do good; the Government should prepare for my coming. If monies appropriated during the past six or eight years had been intelligently and judiciously expended, and prison bone and muscle had been employed to the best advantage, there would be no occasion to complain of bogs and mud-puddles at every time of my benevolent visitation." Are we fair in upbraiding the rain, or is the rain just in censuring the government—successive governments?

COLONIAL NEWS. NEW ZEALAND.

Sir William Jervois, now Governor of South Australia, is to succeed Sir Arthur Gordon as Governor of New Zealand. The native difficulty is still unsettled, but negotiations are being opened up, by which the Waikatos are to leave the King party and come and settle on lands on the Lower Waikato river. They are sending deputations to look at the land offered them. If they take them this will disintegrate the King party.

Sydney Taiwhanga and the other two native chiefs who formed the deputation to London have returned to Auckland. A meeting will be held at Waitangi, Bay of islands, on Dec. 8th, when the doings of the deputation in London will be explained, also the scheme proposed for dealing with the Maori land.

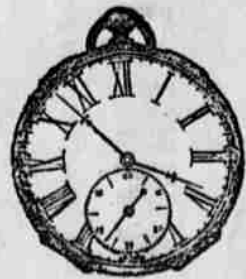
