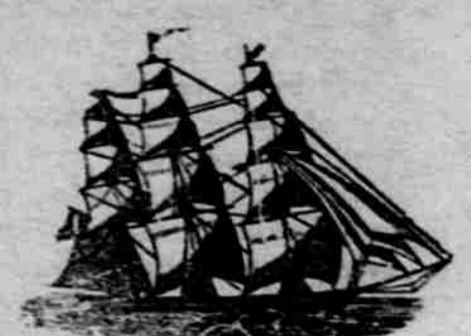

## HAWAII'S "BLUE" LAWS

CONSTITUTION and LAWS  
Framed by the Missionaries.

## LAWS of the HAWAIIAN ISLANDS.

5. If any officer shall act contrary to the requisitions of  
this law and require males and females to work together,  
or to sleep in the same yard, or compel a woman to perform  
labor not appropriate to her sex, or require one to perform  
labor for himself personally, or for a particular chief, the  
officer who does any of these things, shall in his own per-  
son sustain the punishment of that man or woman whom he  
had thus treated.

When this law shall be printed and put into the hands of  
the officers, then it shall take effect at all places on these  
Islands.

All the words of this law having been agreed to by the  
Nobles and by the Representative Body, we have hereunto  
subscribed our names on this eighteenth day of May, in  
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-  
one, at Lahaina, Maui.

(Signed.) KAMEHAMEHA III.  
KEKAULUOHI.

### CHAPTER XXVII. STATUTE REGULATIONS RESPECTING SHIPS, VESSELS, AND HARBORS.

1. It shall be lawful for ships and vessels of all countries  
at peace with this, and engaged in lawful pursuits, to come  
to and anchor at all the roadsteads, ports and harbors of  
the Hawaiian Islands. No embarrassment shall be thrown in  
their way by the governors or local authorities of any place.  
No impost, duty, or tax shall be required except by express  
provision of law.

2. Pilots shall be established at all the Hawaiian ports  
where pilots are necessary. His Majesty the King, together  
with the Premier and Governor shall make the appoint-  
ment, and give the commission. Said commission shall  
state the wages of pilotage.

3. If any man in a deceitful manner shall present himself  
as a pilot, and act as pilot at any of the harbors of the Is-  
lands and take the pay of a pilot without first having receiv-  
ed a certificate of appointment from the King, is guilty  
of a violation of this law. He shall be brought to trial and  
on conviction thereof shall be fined ten dollars, and shall  
furthermore restore what ever he deceitfully received in  
payment. And if he involve the ship in difficulty he shall  
pay to the captain all damages sustained by him, or in de-  
fault thereof shall be imprisoned one year.

4. If any pilot shall deceitfully take higher pay than is  
allowed in his certificate of appointment, he shall on con-  
viction thereof be fined four times the amount which he de-  
ceitfully claimed; thus, if he took one dollar wrongfully, he  
shall pay four, and if he took ten wrongfully he shall pay  
forty.

5. It shall be the duty of all Pilots or harbor masters to  
give to every Captain of a foreign vessel, the laws of the  
harbor where said vessel anchors and the captain shall give  
him a certificate of acknowledgement that he has received  
said laws. If any pilot or harbor master shall neglect thus  
to give a copy of the laws, and the captain of the vessel  
thereby becomes involved in difficulty, because of this  
ignorance of the laws, then the Pilot or harbor master shall  
be liable and shall pay to the Captain the full amount of  
all damages sustained by him.

6. When a merchant vessel arrives at any port or harbor  
of the Hawaiian Islands, no goods shall be landed from a  
foreign country until a correct manifest giving a full account  
of the goods be delivered into the hands of the harbor  
master. If the Captain have the charge of the sales, then  
he shall deliver the manifest, but if he have not, and the  
goods are consigned to some one resident on shore, then he  
to whom the property is consigned must deliver the man-  
ifest. When the harbor master receives said manifest, he  
will then give a certificate of permission that said goods  
may be landed. If the certificate be not given, then the  
goods, must not be landed. Whoever violates this law or  
intentionally evades it, and whoever delivers a false manifest  
shall be brought to trial and on conviction thereof shall be  
fined to the amount of one fourth of the value of all the prop-  
erty wrongfully landed by him.

7. When goods are once landed, having been registered  
on the Manifest, it shall not be proper for the Captain again  
to take them on board his vessel, nor shall it be proper for  
him to take other property on board, without giving, pre-  
vious to his departure, a correct manifest of said property.  
Whoever violates this law or evades it shall be fined to the  
amount of one fourth of the value of all the property thus  
illegally taken away.

A windy treat, of music by the band, was given employees in the Palace yesterday morning.

The Mannerchor Society meet this evening, for practice, in the parlors of the Pacific Hotel.

Nunana street, between School street and the Eagle House, muchly needs re-macadamizing.

Taro-patches are drying up, in many places about town, where natural irrigation is depended upon.

There were but few spectators, outside of Portuguese, present at the battalion regimental drill last evening.

Deputy Sheriff W. A. Hardy, of Hilo, accompanied by his wife, returned home yesterday by the steamer Kinan.

Captain Griffiths of the bark Albert hopes to be enabled to sail for San Francisco at the end of the present week.

Highway robbers and footpads are now hunting the vicinity of the Pali. A chinaman reports being held up last night and robbed of \$5. No arrests.

The "Greek Hercules" Dr. J. T. Hatzopoulos will exhibit feats of strength at the Opera House on Saturday next. Tickets for sale at Levey's.

Examination and registration of voters has been stopped for the present in town. The "Doe" and his assistants are on an inspecting tour of the outer districts.

Assessments are said to be now levied on local Japanese for the purpose of carrying the war into China. On the other hand the Chinese have taken time by the forelock and sequestrated a number of the Japanese gentler sex.

The steamer James Makee which was reported to have grounded at a port in Kauai arrived in port here last evening. She will go on the Marine railway for repair.

The Odd fellows reception to Gorham D. Gilman, the Hawaiian Consul at Boston Mass., given in Excelsior hall in this city, last evening, was well attended.

The following names have been added to the Australia list of outgoing passengers, viz: Mrs. [Lieut] Werlich and child, Chas. Colburn and daughter, Hon. R. R. Hind wife and daughter and G. A. Martin.

Mrs. M. M. Thirds a noted lecturer on Theosophy arrived by the steamer Australia and will assist in teaching the theosophical ideas to all who may desire to become learners thereof. The lady will meet local Theosophists this evening, in Theosophy Hall, Foster's block, corner Marine and Nuuanu streets.

It is reported that Capt. W. B. Godfrey, of the Inter-Island S. S. Co., who goes forward with his family to San Francisco on next Saturday, by the steamer Australia will bring down the new steamer now building and which is intended to replace the lost steamer C. R. Bishop.

The obnoxious vines still overhang the wall of Bishop's residence on Emma street. Minister King may lose an eye yet from the obstruction.

It is reported that young Arthur Fitzsimmons, a youth known to the public, was shot at last evening by a mounted police-officer, without cause, halted and searched. An investigation is in progress.

**Death of Mrs. Kahai.**

Mrs. Malia Kahai, a well-known Hawaiian, died at noon after a short illness, at the residence of Hon. J. A. Cummins. The deceased was born at Manoa on the 13th of December 1851. The immediate cause of death was a severe attack of the grippe. Dr. McLenthan was the attending physician.

Colon, (Colombia), Aug. 1. The British warship Mohawk, six guns, a twinscrews cruiser of the third class, commanded by Captain Leslie C. Stuart, has landed a force of sailors and marines at Bluefields.

New York, Aug. 1. The Herald's Valparaiso special says: Letters received from Rio Janeiro say the restrictions there are worse now than during the revolution. Passenger travel is not allowed by land, while departure by ship calls for the utmost scrutiny on the part of the authorities.

Washington, Aug. 1. The President today approved the application for the retirement of Admiral Stanton, to take effect July 30th. This results in the promotion of Commodore Erben, now commanding the European station, to be Rear Admiral, and the assignment of Commodore Richard Mead to command the North Atlantic station, vacated by Admiral Stanton's retirement.

Lyons, Aug. 3.—At the conclusion of the trial of Caserio, the murderer of President Carnot, in the assize Court here today, the prisoner was sentenced to be executed by the guillotine.

A protest to Congress will soon be entered from the Oklahoma and Indian Territories against Indian dances. These dances, it is claimed, have become so vulgar that some of the more modest white people and the best Indians believe that the National Government should interfere.

The American yacht Tolna, with count and countess Festetics on board, arrived here on the 4th inst., and will remain for two months.

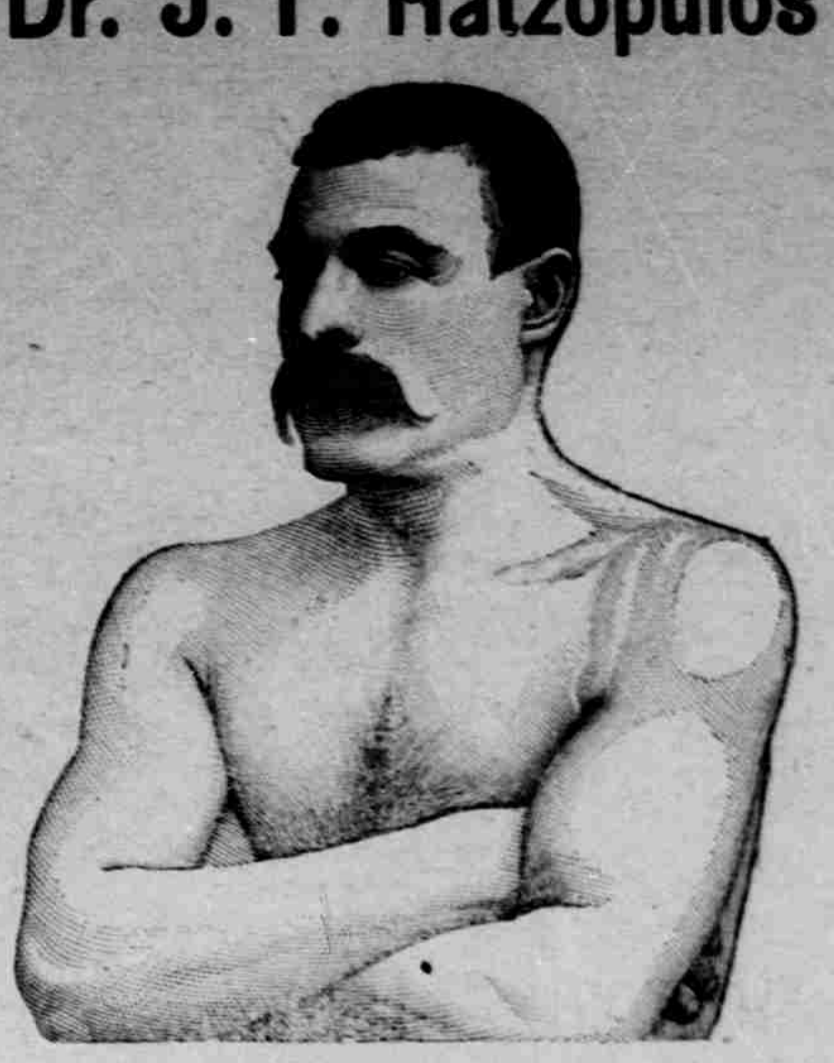

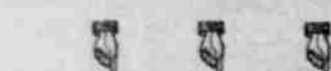

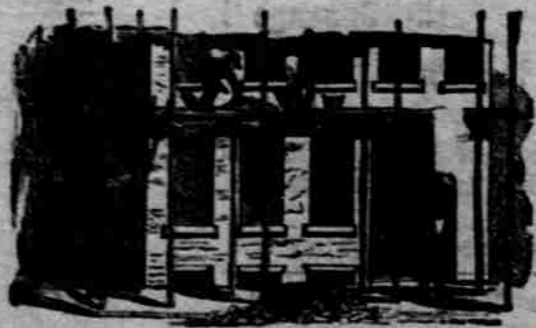
