THE CONSTITUTION.

What the Original Document Contains and Provides.

New York, December 18.—It is probable that the only copy of the original Constitution of Hawaii is in possession of Professor W. H. B. Thomas, of Philadelphia. Inasmuch as some Hawaiian documents seem to sustain the position taken by President Cleveland in the Hawaiian Islands controversy...

The declaration of rights, both of the people and their chiefs, as the Hawaiian Constitution is called, was originally drawn up by a graduate of the seminary at Lahaina-luna. This declaration was afterward revised by the King and a council of three chiefs. The Constitution shows the missionary training of the Hawaiian people, and there certainly is no reason for objection that God is not recognized, for the declaration starts off with a scriptural text, and is extremely pious and biblical throughout.

This kingdom is permanently confirmed to Kamehameha III. and his heirs, and his heir shall be a person whom he and the chiefs shall appoint during his lifetime, but should there be no appointment, then the decision shall rest with the chiefs and House of Representatives. This Constitution was signed October 8, 1893, at Honolulu, by King Kamehameha III. and his Prime Minister.

DISMISSED WITHOUT NOTICE. A Member of the Legislature of 1893 Given Office.

Mr. Wm. Wood, Deputy Sheriff of Ewa, was notified by Marshal Hitchcock on Saturday last that his services were no longer required after the end of the year, and that all government property in his keeping must be returned over to Mr. A. Kaui, Representative for Ewa and Waianae, who has been appointed to succeed him. The dismissal took Mr. Wood by surprise, as he had received no previous intimation of his superior's intention to dismiss him, and no reasons were given for the act.

The Unknowns and Planets met on the League grounds yesterday morning at 10 o'clock to decide the championship of the Amateur League. After playing five innings the third ball was reported lost and the Unknowns were declared the winners. The score standing 21 to 4. The balls were all stolen.

The lad could not find Mr. Babcock, however, and deposited the purse at the Police Station, telling Capt. Langley that it belonged to Mr. Babcock. The purse was returned to the owner.

MURDEROUS ASSAULT.

A Woman Deals Her Paramour a Cruel Blow.

Mrs. Vina King gave herself up to the police yesterday morning for assaulting a man named George Washington with a pickaxe. Both are colored people and came from the States only a short while back. The woman was formerly stewardess on the barkentine S. N. Castle. As far as can be gained the facts are that Washington went to Mrs. King's room at Ludoviko's lodging house, Queen street, and found another colored man there. Being slightly under the weather he was angered, as the woman had been living with him. He slapped the woman on the face and she, fearing his anger, rushed out on the street. The man went to the bed and lying down fell asleep. The woman returned and while he was asleep struck him on the head with the sharp end of a pickaxe, making a very serious wound. In the District Court this morning her case was remanded until the victim should be able to appear. This afternoon the man is in a precarious condition, but it is expected he will recover. He is at the Queen's Hospital.

FATAL THUNDERSTORM.

Two Human Beings and Some Animals Killed at Koloa.

A catastrophe of an unusual nature happened at Koloa, Kauai, on the 25th ult., which resulted fatally to a Japanese man and woman, likewise causing the death of two cows and a horse. At 4 o'clock in the morning a heavy thunderstorm began to rage, which increased in severity until between 5 and 6 o'clock. At that time the kitchen of a house on the plantation grounds was struck by lightning, fortunately without doing any other mischief than the demolition of part of the structure. Almost simultaneously the laborers' quarters were struck, in one room of which a Japanese man and woman were domiciled, the

stroke killing them both. Two cows and a horse were also killed, windows were smashed, and buildings otherwise damaged. An inquest was held on the bodies of the two Japanese, the verdict ascribing the cause of death to lightning. The couple were buried the same day.

A Sheet of Copper Between Them and Death.

When examined on the Marine Railway, the steamer C. R. Bishop was found to have holes nearly through the bottom. In one place worms and rats had eaten away a space several inches square, leaving little excepting the copper to keep out the sea. The company that lately made the voyage to and from Laysan Island in this steamer may congratulate themselves they are in the land of the living.

Chinese Rumpus.

A good-sized free fight between Chinese combatants at King and Kekaulike streets last night collected a crowd of several hundreds. Nothing was done to stop the disturbance until J. A. Mehrtens, captain of police and deputy marshal under different past much-abused regimes, sprang out of a hack in which he was driving from Palama, and in a few seconds scattered the fighters. All the while one of the "finest" police of "the best" government was looking on helplessly.

Will Stay a While.

It is gratifying to note that the Misses Albu are to prolong their stay in the islands for about a month. They will probably visit the volcano, and be induced to give another series of concerts. These talented ladies have by their amiable qualities made many friends of the stage. Mr. M. L. M. Plunkett, their manager, has also won general esteem by his unvarying courtesy and agreeable manners generally.

Looks Like Foul Play.

A native named Kelihepa was found dead in his bed at noon today on Punchbowl street. He had been drinking excessively yesterday but was all right this morning. At noon he was found gasping for breath. The doctor who was summoned found a gash on the man's head which he says was done with some blunt instrument.

STEAMSHIP WARRIMOO.

Arrival and Departure of the Canadian-Australian Liner.

The R. M. S. Warrimoo, Captain Herbert Perry, arrived here from Sydney at 7:30 p. m. Sunday. She cleared Sydney Heads on the 18th ult. at 5:50 p. m., and arrived at Suva, Fiji, on the 24th at 5:35 a. m., leaving there again at 10 a. m. Moderate to fresh northeast winds have been experienced throughout the voyage. The following is a list of the passengers: Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Clementson, Mr. B. Thomson, Mr. A. Archer, Mr. J. Wildridge, Mr. and Mrs. Johnstone, Mr. A. Swanson, Mr. D. Patrick, Mr. F. W. Richmond, Mr. J. J. Bohlwell, Mr. James Graham, Mr. J. W. Gray, Mr. Stillwell and family, and Mr. C. Frost. The cargo comprised 300 bales of wool for Boston and Eastern Canada, 1000 cases of preserved meats, 30 boxes of fresh butter, a sample shipment, 300 bags of sugar, 20 cases of arrowroot, 50 cases of honey, 40 cases pineapples, 20 sacks of coconuts and 200 packages of general merchandise. The Warrimoo left for Vancouver, B. C., at 12 m. Jan. 1.

HIS OPINION THEN.

What the Clerical Annexationist Thought of Independence in 1894.

Are these islands to continue independent, or are they to become one of the United States? Both our isolation and our past history indicate independence as our natural condition. Little could be gained by union and much would be sacrificed. Belonging to the Union in case of war, we should be the most exposed outpost for hostile attack. Independent, the powerful Union will absolutely forbid any other power to take possession of her little neighbor. Independence will secure a larger national dignity and consideration, than could be had as a little dependency of the United States. As a Republic, the Hawaiian state would certainly command the confidence and respect of foreign powers not less thoroughly than now as a Monarchy. With annexation would come useless and annoying complications of the imperial politics of the United States. A not less evil would be the constant influx of political adventurers tending to disturb and derange our national and wholesome autonomy. The best hope of the future includes the perpetuity of that political independence which Hawaii has never yet lost.—Serenus E. Bishop in Hawaiian Monthly, October, 1884.

FOREIGN NEWS.

Anarchists are active in many places, and every continental government is pursuing them with stringent measures. Right Hon. Edward Stanhope, a notable statesman who was in Lord Salisbury's Cabinet, died on the 22d ult., aged 53 years. Fresh sensational evidence has been discovered in favor of Mrs. Maybrick, imprisoned for the murder of her husband. The skipper of a Nova Scotia ship who has been away to sea declares he often saw Maybrick putting arsenic in his food.

Of 200 veteran soldiers poisoned at St. Petersburg by eating putrid meat recently at an annual banquet, 100 are still in a serious condition and 30 have died. The Freisinnige Zeitung pretends to know that the Russian delegates have accepted German demands in the commercial treaty negotiations. The military commissariat stores at Warsaw have been burned. The loss is heavy. The fire is believed to have an incendiary origin.

The Italian forces in the Sudan have gained a great victory over a body of 10,000 Dervishes. It is estimated that 1000 Dervishes were killed, and Mohamed Ali, their leader, was slain. The Italians lost several officers and about 100 men. Defensive matters are being discussed in France. M. Lockroy says the coast is all but undefended from Dunkirk to Cherbourg, and that 16,000,000 francs will be required to place Cherbourg in a state for defense. He adds that the same statement holds good in the case of Corsica, and that the British could easily get a footing at either place.

Captain Wilson and 35 of his men, who were thought to have been ambushed and massacred, have been heard from. They defeated Lo Bengula's forces, and the king fled. Premier Rhodes announces that the natives are daily yielding in large numbers, and the Matabels are submissively settling in small kraals.

A Tribute to Mr. Damon.

Minister of Finance Damon of the Hawaiian provisional government was one of Blount's most important witnesses, and it is upon his testimony that the latter bases some of the most important conclusions of his report. Mr. Damon has now read this report, and it is an important fact that he does not attack its statements nor abuse the commissioner, in the address which he is said to have read to the executive council, and which reached this country on Tuesday. On the contrary Mr. Damon testifies to the thoroughness with which Blount conducted his investigations, and to his honesty, and says of him: "I have not lost faith in the man." In fact Mr. Damon's whole statement might well be taken for a model by the annexationist and anti-administration newspapers in this country, it is so candid and temperate, and shows such an appreciation of the real difficulties of the situation as seen from this side. Nothing of the sort is to be expected, however, for it would involve a giving up of the chance to make a partisan point, which is too much to ask of an organ.—Springfield Republican.
