The Eye of the Land is Established in Righteousness.

HONOLULU, DEC. 4, 1894

An Insult.

Hawaii invited to be a Pest house.

The municipal government of San Francisco must be the most chilly and most brazen affair in its line on the face of the earth.

Some time ago Mayor Ellert wrote a letter to Colonel Spreckels in which he asked the great sugar king to use his influence in persuading the Hawaiian government to establish an international pest house for lepers and increase the leper bacillus and bacteria in Hawaii nei by a general exodus from California to Molokai of the unfortunate persons afflicted with the dread disease.

Colonel Spreckels presented the request but he did not urge the acceptance of it or even its consideration.

Now the wise men of San Francisco have commissioned chief Crowley to open negotiations and it is understood that he has opened negotiations with the government and expects an answer within a few days.

We can only consider the proposition as a gross insult to Hawaii, to the Hawaiians, and to the general intelligence of our community.

For years we have been told that all inducements should be extended to tourists. That Hawaii nei ought to become a second Switzerland and that tourist travelling properly conducted should make us rich and happy.

Are the California lepers the kind of tourists we seek?

Is it by stamping the Paradise of the Pacific as an international pest house that we will gain the tourists for whom Mr. L. Al Thurston has made guava jelly and panoramas?

It is evident that the people who run the little shebang called San Francisco do not know Hawaii yet.

Mr. Crowley whom we admire as a police officer and as a most famous chief of a gallant force has undertaken a most thankless task.

No government in Hawaii will dare to grant or even entertain the request of the San Francisco authorities. The very men who have sworn to uphold Mr. Dole would execrate him and his government if they dare to further increase the danger of contagion from an unlimited importation of deceased people. We, who live in this country say as little as possible about the curse hanging over us. We do not propose at this time when millions have been spent for the purpose of ameliorating if not curing the sad conditions of the afflicted to stand before the world as a country hopelessly and constantly the victim of an incurable disease.

Let Mr. Crowley go back to his rich State, and let him tell the men who sent him that little Hawaii is foremost in its endeavors to stamp out the disease.

That the public purse has always been opened for that purpose. That no legislature or administration ever hesitated in appropriating all moneys needed and never begrudged one cent spent on the unfortunate fellow citizens. And let him tell his authorities in that rich State that what poor Hawaii can do, the State of California ought certainly to be able and willing to do.

It is a pleasure to remember that neither Mr. Dole or the Board of Health can take any steps in the matter even if so inclined. And for the honor of Mr. Dole and Mr. Smith we will state that even their bitterest enemy will refuse to believe that they would accept the proposition of the San Francisco authorities. But it will take an act of a Legislature to pass such a measure and it will take a new quarantine law.

Leprosy according to the Hawaiian government is a contagious disease. The forced segregation of lepers proves that. How then can any person or persons be brought to Honolulu suffering from such contagious disease and be landed here without going into a quarantine that surely must be permanent?

And what steamers or vessels could safely be employed in such a trade?

The San Francisco authorities who now are howling on account of the expense of providing for a few lepers will hardly employ steamers for the sole purpose of bringing home or a dozen lepersto Molokai. The Advertiser which lately has been so careful for the backs and legs of the horses in Hawaii should now use a little eloquence and steam for the humane race living here, and it should open its damns of eloquence and with us condemn the infamous proposition, and refute the gratuitous insult of the ignorant and arrogant crowd which today "run" San Francisco.

What's The Matter?

"Republican" Imagination Prevails.

Why is the government scared?

We have been told every day that Mr. Dole represents all the intelligence, wealth and voting capacity in Hawaii. He is President of the Republic and yet he trembles in his boots and his lieutenants and supporters do the same.

Why?

Because their conscience is bad. Because they feel that a government against the people and without the people is a monstrosity. Because they know that sooner or later the heavy hand of retaliation will fall on their heads and then no mercy will be shown.

For several decades the Hawaiians have exercised a full voting franchise in these islands. The new constitution was cleverly framed so as to appear to the world that the Hawaiians could vote, while it at the same time arranged for the impossibility of a control of government by the Hawaiians.

The conscience of the government is bad.

The intention of Mr. Dole's administration is to hold the Hawaiians in bonds of slaves although they will enjoy an ostensible right to vote for a lower and unimportant House of Representatives. The Hawaiians may decide to fight or not but it seems to us that if they do not they will be forced into working for and accepting annexation to either Japan or the United States.

The main object is to get rid of the present missionary oligarchy.

Even the possible loss of independence is preferable to submission to the present governing clique.

But, friends, whatever is done or going to be done it should be remembered that the object of every patriot ought to be the welfare and prosperity of his country. If Hawaii is happier and better under the present regime let us uphold Mr. Dole. If it is injurious to these islands to have perpetual disturbances and revolutions, let us avoid them and counteract them.

Before all and everything must HAWAII-NEI stand. It is for her that we live and for that we agitate.

But the men in power do not take that view.

They delight in spreading reports which we know to be silly lies, but which in foreign countries will create the impression that Hawaii is in a state of revolution and unable to attend to her own business.

The following correspondence from Honolulu to a San Francisco paper shows the silly policy of the Dole crowd.

There is no danger or intention of any violent uprising here. And everybody familiar with affairs know it. Do not, gentlemen of the Republic try to pose once more as heroes and fighters. The following is the sample of

letters written by Mr. Dole's correspondents to papers abroad:

Honolulu, Nov. 15, 1894.

That the government is slightly in fear of a Royalist uprising has evidenced during the last week. All the guards in suburbs have been doubled, and a close watch kept on all suspected persons. The cause of this sudden activity is alleged to be the discovery of a plot to restore the ex-Queen. The restoring party was supposed to be led by a San Francisco newspaper man, who has been in Honolulu for some months. His house has been closely watched during the last few weeks, and some days before the Australia left last Saturday he was told by Attorney-General Smith that it would be much better for him to take that steamer than to remain here. He did so, but the government has not relaxed its watchfulness on account of his departure.

One of the most prominent and richest Royalists in the city said, a few evenings ago:

"People who think our cause is dead will be treated to a surprise in the near future which will make them open their eyes. We have made many attempts to arouse the Royalists to a sense of their wrongs, but so far we have failed. This time, however, I think we have succeeded and will accomplish our end. Whether we succeed or not is difficult to say, but if we do not think we would, we would not attempt a revolution."

It is known that a considerable number of guns and ammunition have been secretly brought here during the last few months, and the Royalists evidently intend to make use of them. No uneasiness is felt by the government party, however, which seems perfectly well satisfied that it can hold its own.
