Chapel 7 at Op. Davis was made ready for the Jewish chaplain before his services. Spent two days on bivouac with the 57th Inf. Tr. Bn. at Op. Groff--participated in a night problem and the dawn attack.

Attended two chaplains' meetings at Op. Groff.

Called upon the Commanding General of the I.R.T.O., Op. Groff, at his request. Served at Op. Groff only over one Sunday and then preached to men on bivouac (as noted); one Sunday of the month was spent on leave--this accounts for the smaller than usual totals.
